

## Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a blessed month of November!

#### May I be of service?

Most of us who participate in the Liturgy on Sundays, Saturday evenings, or weekdays (that is, those of us who are 18 years of age and older) can probably remember our years in high school. We can probably recall one of the important questions asked of us by our teachers and counselors throughout our four years leading up to final graduation.

**The question to which I'm referring is** of course this one: "So, (*insert your name*), what would you like to make of your life? What would you like to become as an adult?"

That topic probably unnerved more than a few of us (including myself) as we tried to think about our future, our abilities, and our interests while still being very young.

**Some probably responded** "I want to be a doctor, or an attorney, or a scientist, or an engineer, or an educator!" A few may have answered by saying "I'd like to be a good spouse and parent." Others may have responded "I have NO idea just yet!"

I have a feeling that NO ONE ever said "I want to be a servant of others. That's' right, I want to be a servant of others!"

**In our cultural history, being a servant** was left to those who couldn't accomplish something "more important or significant". Being a servant was reserved for those who

weren't well educated or "weren't raised in a good family."

However, for us as Catholic Christians, being a servant of others is one of our highest and most honored vocations in the eyes of the Lord. Jesus calls us in this Sunday's Gospel teaching to humble ourselves if we are to be His friends and co-workers. The Lord calls us to always be servants – servants of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit – and servants of one another. Jesus Himself is, before all else, the Divine Servant – the very Son of God who became the Servant of all humanity and who redeemed all people in the eyes of God.

Jesus is the Divine Servant who became one of us to bring healing, hope, compassion, love, life, and all the blessings of Almighty God to all who will accept what Jesus offers. Jesus served many in His own lifetime – and throughout these past twenty centuries. Jesus continues to be the Divine Servant to all of us today as well.



**A NOTE FROM MARYANN:** Blessings as we enter this wonderful month of November. This time of year we remember the Saints in heaven with All Saints Day last Wednesday and the saints that lived among us in our friends and relatives with All Souls Day last



Thursday. As we consider the Saints, we can spend some time looking at the Myths of Sainthood from the book, <u>5 Things with Father Bill</u>. Father writes, *"Some people feel the way to become a saint is just to die, as if a life of heroic virtue means nothing."* So, perhaps it's time to clear up some misunderstanding with five myths of sainthood:

- **1. Popes don't "make" saints.** Rather the Pope solemnly declares someone to be among those who are models and intercessors for the whole Church. He recognizes them to be in heaven either because they were martyrs or lived lives of heroic virtue.
- **2. Catholics don't worship saints.** We give God alone glory and adoration. We honor saints for the way they have lived their lives devoted to Jesus. It teaches the rest of us how to be better.
- **3. Saints aren't middlemen and-women.** Why do we need a middleman when we can just go straight to Jesus? Jesus is our one mediator but if I have a special need, I would not think twice about asking a friend to pray for me. My friends help me carry my load to the one who can help me unburden it. In the Book of Revelation, we hear that before the throne of God there are "gold bowls filled with incense," which are the prayers of the saints. (Rev. 5:8). Why not have the holy ones fill their bowls with your prayers?
- **4. It's not that God doesn't answer.** "I prayed and nothing happened." When nothing happens, it does not mean that the saints were asleep at the wheel or that God doesn't care. God never says no. He says, "I have something better." Pray to gain trust in His will.
- **5. Saints aren't superheroes with magical powers.** Many people think that saints are different than us ordinary humans, as if they had magical powers on earth. No! They were people like you and me who just tried really hard to trust in Christ and let His love flow through them. Jesus calls all of us to be saints.

**Blessed Carlo Acutis**, pray for us!

Blessed Carlo Acutis was born May 3, 1991. He had a great love for God and a tremendous devotion to the Holy Eucharist - he called it his *"highway to heaven."* He was a typical teenager who loved his family, his friends, sports, movies, and the computer.

Between the ages of 11 and 14, he used his gifts as a computer whiz to create a website reporting in detail on every Eucharistic Miracle recorded in history. Carlo died October 12, 2006 at the age of 15, just days after being diagnosed with a rare type of leukemia. He was beatified only 14 years later on October 10, 2020.

#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

If you, or someone you know, need major home repairs or modifications to make your home more accessible, the Allegheny County Whole-Home Repairs Program may be able to help.

In order to qualify, you must own and live in a home in Allegheny County and have a household income that does not exceed the following limits: \$56,250/year for 1 person; \$64,250/year for 2 people; \$72,300 for 3 people; and \$80,300 for four people. Your home must be in need of a major repair, such as foundation work, new windows, roof, electrical repairs, etc., or your home must need modifications made in order to accommodate someone in the house who is living with a disability.

Unfortunately, due to funding limitations, not everyone that applies will be accepted into the program. If your application is accepted, the repairs and/or accommodations will be done at no cost to you by a program-certified contractor. To apply or to find out more information about the Allegheny County Program, Whole-Home Repairs visit https://actionhousing.org/our-services/alleghe ny-county-whole-home-repairs-program or call 412-248-0021. Applications must be submitted by Friday, November 17 at 4:00pm. Please do not let this opportunity pass you by if you are in need of a major home repair or disability accommodation!
