




As we'll soon begin our *Forward in Faith!* Stewardship Program and appeal, it's good to reflect on the many blessings that are present in our parish community and life – blessings



ANOTE FROM MARYANN: A blessed Thanksgiving week to all. As we celebrate the holiday of Thanksgiving, we tend to give thanks for all the blessings in our life. I wonder if we might take the time in our private prayer to give thanks for the irritating and unwanted things




in our life and the blessing that those things bring. Even something as small as a cold or sore throat, we might see as a blessing as it calls us to slow down and not take our health for granted. I was recently stopped at a red light on Route 19. I was irritated and inconvenienced as I was going to be late for a work meeting. I looked out my passenger window and there was a cute little white fluffy dog barking hello. It caused me to recall that God is always trying to get my attention. What was an inconvenience, really turned out to be a blessing. Let us give thanks this Thanksgiving Day for both the blessings as well as the irritations or challenges in our life. Let us also remember to give thanks for one another and for the blessings given to Saint Philip Parish.

MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY NEWS: A new ministry in Saint Philip Parish is the Mental Health Ministry. We all get colds, the flu, maybe a sinus infection or backache...all things that keep us from functioning at our best. No one thinks anything when we have issues with our physical health. When it comes to mental health it is an entirely different story. We all are on the Mental Health continuum, which means simply, sometimes we cannot function at our best because we have issues with our mental health. We may experience loss, financial stress, relationship stress, depression, anxiety or other issues. One in four people will be affected by mental health problems in their lifetime which interferes with them functioning at their best. According to the National Institute of Health the prevalence of mental illness is also greater than imagined. We are called as the Church to demonstrate God's love through the way we care for those in need. Individuals struggling with mental health problems represent a large population in need of care. One thing we can do as a parish is pray for those who have been affected in any way by a mental health crisis or illness.

In the coming weeks you will see prayer crosses at the entrances to our churches. **Beginning November 26 through the Christmas season in January**, we ask if you know of a person in need of prayer for hope and healing due to suffering from mental health challenges, you write their first name on a square post-it and place it on the cross. We would also like to pray for those we have lost to mental illness or death by suicide and ask you to write their first name on a butterfly post-it and place it on the board. We ask the Lord to hold all of these loved ones in His care

During this beautiful season when we celebrate Christ's coming to walk among us, we walk with the Christ in one another as we pray together and journey together with those facing mental health challenges. We also remember those with physical challenges in our daily private prayer and intercessory prayer. May this Advent Season be a particularly special one for Saint Philip Parish.

Our New Evangelization

Twenty five years ago, when preparing the Church for the New Millennium, Pope Saint John Paul II called all Catholic Christians to begin a *New Evangelization* to share the Good News – the Gospel – once again with both Christian disciples and non-believers in the new 21st century. Most Catholics are NOT aware of this effort to evangelize the world once again (*similar to the first evangelization of the world which was begun by Jesus 2000 years ago*).

Now is the time for all Church members to participate in the New Evangelization so that the Kingdom of God might continue to grow even in this modern world.

It is very good to share the Good News with those who have forgotten Jesus' message and promise. It is also very important that we ourselves believe Jesus' message and live His way.

Our first suggestion is to deepen your own faith in the Lord. Pray the Lord's Prayer often, recite the Apostles' Creed every day, and pray the Rosary often to remain close to Jesus. Grow your own faith and your life of prayer. Then make the effort to share the Good News of the Lord with those whose ears and hearts are open and ready to receive the Gospel of Jesus Christ!

What it means to be *Catholic* and *Christian*

Today, many people – *including Catholic Christians* – ask the question:



In the first generations of the Lord's community (the Church), our ancestors who were becoming followers of the Risen Christ came to be called "Christians." This is still the name that we receive and proclaim even today.

During later generations, small groups of Christians became very exclusive and pursued their own versions of the Christian faith and community. They often excluded the poor and uneducated and outcast. They typically considered themselves to be much better than the average, ordinary members of the Lord's Church. These groups were hostile to the Apostolic Church and its leaders – and caused many difficulties and upset through the early centuries.

As a result, in order to distinguish faithful Church members from those who created small, exclusive groups (those who came to be called 'heretics'), the Church began teaching that true disciples belonged to a "Catholic Church" – an inclusive Church of Christ that does not exclude anyone and which seeks to share the Good News and the grace of the Lord with all people everywhere.

Today, we often use the name "Catholic Christian" as a reminder that we are indeed Christians baptized into Christ Jesus – and that we belong to the one Catholic Church (*universal, inclusive, open to all*) established by Jesus upon the foundation of Peter and the Apostles which welcomes all people and seeks to share salvation with all who believe and live in the Lord Jesus. We are and always have been the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church for nearly 2,000 years!

This is not a psychotherapy group, but fellow parishioners who care for one another and support one another as we travel through the grief process together. Please consider joining us.




