Greetings once again, and best wishes for a very good week as we conclude November and look forward to the First Sunday of Advent next weekend!

Servant Disciples of Jesus our Lord

This liturgical year (and the calendar year of 2023) has gone by so very quickly for all of us. It's amazing that we've celebrated the Thanksgiving Day holiday already and that, NEXT Sunday, we'll begin a new Church Year with the First Sunday of Advent!

On December 2-3, we'll restart our 365 day annual celebration of our Christian faith and life in the Lord Jesus. Each year, we begin the celebration of our faith in Advent by: 1.) preparing for the return of the Lord Jesus; and 2.) remembering Jesus' first coming to us as the Incarnate Son of God during the first "Christmas event."

Now that we've arrived at the final days of the 2023 Church Year, we're reminded of the FINAL event of our Christian faith - that is, the return of Jesus into our world as our Lord and Savior and King. We firmly believe that, when Jesus returns in glory, He will complete human history and the Kingdom of Almighty God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

We believe that, when the Lord Jesus returns into the world, He will reward His faithful people for their discipleship, their ministry, and their service to others - especially the poor and those in need. Today's parable in the Gospel according to Matthew has been a favorite of Church members of Catholic Christians - for twenty centuries. Jesus' teaching is a divine call to all of us to "live for others and not only for ourselves."

This instruction from the Lord in Matthew 25 has been cherished and followed since Jesus first spoke these words to His Apostles and followers.

This tremendously important teaching of Jesus continues to remind us that ALL these elements of our Christian Gospel are important to us: 1.) professing our faith in the Lord; 2.) serving others in charity and respect; and 3.) sharing our belief and hope in Iesus with others often throughout our vears.

As we honor the Lord Jesus on this Solemnity of Christ Jesus, King of the Universe, may we look forward to His return with true anticipation and joy. May we honor and imitate Jesus in our daily living, and may we look forward to the Kingdom and the glory that Jesus promises all of us who His holy, faithful, and loving people, disciples, servants, and friends. 


Sharing the Good News and growing the Kingdom of God!

OPLATKI: CHRISTMAS WAFER

"Oplatki" is the traditional Christmas Wafer, sometimes referred to as the "Bread of Angels." The Christ Child was born in Bethlehem which means "House of Bread," and Jesus is "The Bread of Life."

The custom began in Poland, Slovakia and Lithuania millennia ago. By breaking and sharing "Oplatki" on Christmas Eve our prayers for health and happiness are offered for the family. It unites heaven and earth and reminds us of the "Unseen Guest," Jesus Christ. Some families set an extra place at the table as a reminder of the Christ Child Who was born in a manger to save us all. "Oplatki" will be available in the Parish office the first week of December. Donation is \$3.00.

presents for their children and to give a little Christmas joy to the elderly and homebound.





MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY NEWS

A new ministry in Saint Philip Parish is the Mental Health Ministry. We all get colds, the flu, maybe a sinus infection or backache...all things that keep us from functioning at our best. No one thinks anything when we have issues with our physical health. When it comes to mental health it is an entirely different story. We all are on the Mental Health continuum which means simply, sometimes we cannot function at our best because we have issues with our mental health. We may experience loss, financial stress, relationship stress, depression, anxiety or other issues. One in four people will be affected by mental health problems in their lifetime which interferes with them functioning at their best. According to the National Institute of Health the prevalence of mental illness is also greater than imagined.

We are called as the Church to demonstrate God's love through the way we care for those in need. Individuals struggling with mental health problems represent a large population in need of care. One thing we can do as a parish is pray for those who have been affected in any way by a mental health crisis or illness.

In the coming weeks you will see prayer crosses at the entrances to our churches. Beginning November 26 through the Christmas Season in January, we ask if you know of a person in need of prayer for hope and healing due to suffering from mental health challenges, you write their first name on a square post-it and place it on the cross. We would also like to pray for those we have lost to mental illness or death by suicide and ask you to write their first name on a butterfly post-it and place it on the board. We ask the Lord to hold all of these loved ones in His care

During this beautiful season when we celebrate Christ's coming to walk among us, we walk with the Christ in one another as we pray together and journey together with those facing mental health challenges. We also remember those with physical challenges in our daily private prayer and intercessory prayer. May this Advent Season be a particularly special one for Saint Philip Parish.




