

Notes from the Pastor

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a good month of January!

Back to the beginning

We began the 2024 Church Year in early December with the first Sunday of Advent. Then the Advent season was observed both to prepare us for the final return of the Lord and to get us ready for our annual celebration of Jesus' birth during the Christmas Season.

I hope that those first six weeks of the new Church Year 2024 were blessed and enjoyable for everyone in our community! Now we move from that "new beginning" to yet another "new beginning."

During these first weeks of Ordinary (*numbered*) Time, we hear once again of the beginning of Jesus' public ministry following His Baptism in the Jordan River. In a very simple and humble beginning, Jesus inaugurated the Kingdom of God by drawing His first apostles and disciples to Himself. In His preaching and miraculous healings, Jesus brought the divine life and love of God to the people of Israel and surrounding lands.

Each year, it's very good for us to remember the simple, humble beginning of Jesus' ministry as well as the essence of His Good News of God's compassionate and merciful love for the people of this world. In the 2000 years which have followed, the Gospel and the Kingdom of the Lord have grown under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Today the presence and life of the Lord and His holy Church are found in every land and every age. Today alone, there are more than 2 billion baptized disciples of the Lord Jesus living in our world!

And yet, we're being told today by Church leaders and Catholic commentators that we should approach this current time and society as if we're back at the beginning once again. We're told that the Church's situation today is comparable to the time of Jesus and the first generation of Christianity – a time when very few people knew the message of Jesus and when the Gospel of Christ was first being heard and received by the pagans of the first century.

We see the true reality of our situation today when the majority of people reject even the mention of Jesus and of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In so many ways, our society and our nation have become pagan once again. Likewise, there's an unbelievable disdain for all things Catholic and Christian among most members of our younger generations of those 50 years of age and younger.

In response, we're called to remember the humble beginnings of Christianity in Jesus' solitary ministry. We're reminded too that the first Christians were only a small number. The number of dedicated Catholic Christians is much smaller in this generation, but we're called to be true and faithful to the Lord Jesus. While it may seem at times that we've gone back to the beginning of the Kingdom, we should remember just how significant is the presence and heritage of the Church around the world.

At the same time, we should accept that most people no longer know about our faith and our life. We should patiently evangelize our family members and neighbors. We should invite others in our daily lives to turn off the world and to instead turn to the Lord and his holy people for life, love, meaning, guidance, and salvation.

The Lord Jesus and his Gospel and his Church are the one true hope for humanity. As always, the mission ahead of us is a daunting one, but it isn't hopeless if we trust in the Lord and the Spirit. May we remember the humble beginnings of Jesus' own ministry, and may we, like the Lord, be courageous and dedicated to God and the salvation that is offered to all who would be the Lord's people in the Kingdom!

Best wishes for a blessed 2024!


We're often reminded that all married and engaged couples need support and encouragement as you together make your journey through this life to God's Kingdom.


A NOTE FROM MARYANN: "Here I am, Lord; I come to do your will." What a wonderful prayer to begin the New Year. The First Reading for this Sunday calls us to listen for the Lord's call and to respond as we reflect on the Scripture, "Speak Lord, for your servant is listening." Our first consideration when we encounter this Reading might be to ask ourselves, "How am I listening to hear God's call?" In our Faith Formation Children's Program, we teach children and families that God speaks to us in several ways. He speaks to us through nature. He speaks to us in Scripture. He speaks to us in the Sacraments. He speaks to us in silent and communal prayer and He speaks to us through others.

As adults, do we seek to hear God in these ways? Do we take a moment when we see something beautiful in our environment to stop and acknowledge God's presence? Do we read and reflect upon the Word of God sometime each week? Do we participate in the Sacraments, especially the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist on a regular basis? Do we have time for silence and prayer each day? Do we bring Christ to others in our conversation and do we recognize the Christ in others? As we begin 2024, perhaps we could consider spending some additional time by "listening" to the Lord in one of the many ways God speaks to us.





FOOD BANK DISTRIBUTIONS

The Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank will no longer be offering a drive-up food distribution at the Ascension worship site. The Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank has chosen to move this food distribution back to Langley K-8, where it had been held prior to COVID. The walk-up food distribution will occur on the third Tuesday of each month from 5:30pm to 7:00pm in Sheraden at Langley K-8 located at 2940 Sheraden Blvd., Pittsburgh, PA 15204. The next three distributions will be on January 16, February 20, and March 19.

No pre-registration is needed and attendees receive 30-50 pounds of fresh, frozen, and non-perishable food. You do not need to bring proof of income to the distribution and anyone is eligible for assistance. Attendees will be able to walk through the line and select their food. It is recommended that you bring bags, boxes and a rolling cart, if you have one, in order to carry the food. Volunteers will be available to help you carry food to your car if you need assistance. 


