

Notes from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a good February and a holy Lent!

Divine healing from the Lord

During these Sundays before we arrive at Ash Wednesday (February 14) and the Season of Lent, we continue to hear from the very first chapter of the Gospel according to Mark.

Have you noticed - as I have - that this very first chapter in the Gospel according to Mark is filled with accounts of Jesus bringing divine and lasting healing to the people of His day, especially the possessed and the unfortunate, the sick and the lame?

Isn't it quite remarkable that the "Gospel", the "Good News" (our title in English for Jesus' message) is first and foremost about divine healing and new life?

From the very beginning of the very first written account of Jesus' life, teaching, death, Resurrection and Ascension, we hear of the Lord's mission to bring healing and health and new life!

While many Christians - and even **non-Christians** - have presented Iesus' message and teaching in all sorts of different ways, the first witnesses to the Lord proclaim to us that, first and foremost, Jesus is all about healing and new life. According to Mark and the other Evangelists, Jesus' first mission was to restore life to the people and to offer the fullness of life - here on earth and in the

presence of Almighty God - to all who would believe and accept His offer.

The priority which Jesus gives to restoring and reviving life and health should be a message that we always carry with us as we witness to the Lord. When anyone asks us "What is Jesus all about?" or "Why should we follow Jesus of Nazareth?", you can clearly and honestly tell them that, more than anyone else in human history, Jesus came to bring life in all its fullness to humanity - to every person - and to all the created world!

According to Chapter 1 of Mark's Gospel, Jesus came into the world - first and foremost to promote and renew the divine gift of life. Jesus first priority was NOT to judge and condemn and punish. The Lord came to bring life and light, healing and salvation.

May we continue to be grateful that Jesus still offers the same gifts of life and salvation to us today - the same gifts of life and salvation which he offered to the people during His ministry, the same gifts of life and salvation that He offered to all our ancestors and to all humanity since He first brought divine healing and life to all who would accept this remarkable gift and blessing!

Best wishes for a very good February and a holy Lent!

We are now ten days from the beginning of the holy Season of Lent. May Jesus, the Son of God bless you, your family, and our Saint Philip Catholic Parish community throughout Lent and the Easter Season - and every day of this Year of Divine Grace 2024. Amen!




As the Season of Lent draws near, it is helpful to recall the discipline of the Church with regards to fast, abstinence and other forms of penance.

- 1. Ash Wednesday, February 14, and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
- 2. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18 and 59. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
- 3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
- 4. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
- 5. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by law.
- 6. As a general rule, a request for a dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Fridays of Lent will not be considered unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions are not considered sufficient reason to request a dispensation.

Daily Reflections for Lent

The holy Season of Lent will begin in just 10 days. Starting on Ash Wednesday, February 14, we will dedicate 90 days (the 40 days of Lent and the 50 days of the Easter Season) to focusing on the blessed life, sorrowful death, and glorious Resurrection of the Lord Jesus!



To guide us through the Season of Lent, a new booklet of Lenten reflections is available to you at the doors of both our churches. We've made hundreds of copies available to our members and families so that your prayer life, your spiritual life, and your life in the Lord Jesus will be deepened and strengthen in the weeks leading to our celebration of Jesus' Resurrection. We will also make booklets for the Season of Easter available during Holy Week.

Please be sure to take and read these Lenten reflection booklets every day at home, and then share these reflections with your family members and children throughout Lent!





Historic Marietta, Ohio

In 1788, Pioneers of the Ohio Company made Marietta the first permanent settlement in the Northwest Territory. Today we will discover this picturesque riverboat town, where the past peacefully resides with the present.

Founded in 1838, St. Mary's houses a series of outstanding stained-glass windows which came from Munich, Germany. Later this afternoon we embark on a delightful sightseeing cruise along the Muskingum and Ohio rivers aboard the 300-passenger Valley Gem sternwheeler. Following the cruise enjoy free time for shopping, browsing or relaxing in Marietta's quaint historic district.

This lovely area of the city features brick streets, charming lampposts and a collection of shops offering antiques, vintage clothing, collectibles, fine jewelry, novelties and books. Later today we begin our journey home. A dinner stop will be made en route. Arrive back in the Pittsburgh area at approximately 8:00PM.








ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

We previously published this article on January 7, but we thought it would be a good idea to run it again, just in case anyone missed it due to their travels for Christmas and the new year. We would like to take a look back at all of the good your donations did during our last fiscal year, which ended September 30, 2023. In the 2022-2023 fiscal year, the St. Philip Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul spent \$114,480.53 helping our friends in need! The breakdown of how the funds were spent is as follows:



Spending in the miscellaneous category went to help our friends in need with less-common requests, such as bus passes, as well as the cost of renting trucks and paying for gasoline for our trips to deliver donations to Donna's House of Hope in Tunnelton, WV. The operating expenses category covers items such as electric bills for our food pantry. Of course, the St. Philip Conference is a 100% volunteer organization, so there are no operating

expenses related to compensation for our volunteers' time. The furniture spending is for furniture purchased from, and delivered by, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Central Council of Pittsburgh warehouse. It's important to note that the above figures do not include all of the friends in need that we were able to help through your generous donations of furniture, appliances, housewares, clothing and food!

Last fiscal year, we collected \$82,503.33 in monetary donations from our incredibly generous supporters. We were able distribute more in assistance than we collected in donations due to the fact that we had less requests for financial assistance during the height of Covid, when moratoriums against evictions, foreclosures, and utility shutoffs were in place and the Allegheny County Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) had funding. However, as expected, when the moratoriums ended and the ERAP funding was exhausted, the need was still great - and we were blessed to be able to assist our friends in need with the money we had on hand.

This week, your generous donations enabled us to pledge up to \$800 in security deposit assistance for a single mom and her children who have been without a home for several weeks; an immigrant family of four was provided with clothing vouchers, a \$50 household goods voucher, and a \$100 PRT Connect Card; a senior was provided with a donated couch; and a woman was provided with \$420 toward her gas utility and a clothing voucher. Thank you!




