

Notes from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a good and holy Season of Lent!

Jesus proclaimed the Gospel of God

With everything we do, there's always a beginning. Our parents gave us our beginning. Our lives, our families, our career path, and our Christian discipleship all had their beginning.

This First Sunday of Lent, we hear once again the beginning of Jesus' own public **ministry**. After years of preparing His ministry in His home and work - and then in the desert, Jesus came to the people of Israel when the first People of God truly needed a messiah, a leader, a savior.

The fullness of God's presence, the fullness of God's Kingdom received its beginning with Jesus. His preaching and healing ultimately led to the re-establishment of the People of God the new beginning of God's chosen people.

Once every beginning is started, then hopefully progress and success will follow.

This past week, we began the new Season of Lent on Ash Wednesday when we accepted ashes on our foreheads - the admission of our own sinfulness, the mark of our repentance,

Now as we begin these holy days of the Season of Lent, it's most important that we remain committed to our new beginning. It's important that we remain committed to the

conversion, the holiness, and the renewed discipleship that we've promised to pursue through our Lenten prayer, penance, charity, and observances.

Make time in these six weeks to read the daily reflection in your Daily Reflections for Lent booklet provided by our parish. Meditate on the face of Jesus depicted on our parish's Lenten prayer cards. Also, choose specific ways in which you can: spend more time in silent prayer at home and in church; participate each Sunday - and even weekdays - in our parish Liturgy; read the Gospel according to Mark and other New Testament writings; choose some regular penance for yourself and practice fasting from time to time; be charitable to the poor and those in need as often as possible; and finally, profess your faith in the Lord Jesus and recommit yourself to the Christian discipleship that is yours and all of ours.

As we prepare for our celebration of the Easter Season and the Lord's Resurrection, make the most of these 40 days of Lent which we've recently begun. Give time to the observances and practices of Lent every day so that, with an honest and committed effort, you and all of us may make progress in our Christian discipleship as we continue our journey through this life - our journey to eternal life with God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit in the Kingdom of the Lord.

Best wishes for a very good and holy Season of Lent!

We have all begun this holy Season of Lent. May the Son of God bless you, your family, and our Saint Philip Catholic Parish community throughout Lent and the coming Easter Season - and every day of this year. Amen!



A NOTE FROM MARYANN: "The Kingdom of God is at hand, repent, and believe in the Gospel." Our theme this Lent is Deepening Our Life in the Lord Jesus. If we deepen our life in the Lord Jesus, we might become like Jesus. So how might our life change if we become like Jesus. We can look to the Stations of the Cross to see how Jesus reacts to life's situations:

Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. He prays.

Jesus, betrayed by Judas, is arrested. He is calm.

Jesus is denied by Peter. He accepts others' weaknesses.

Jesus is judged by Pilot. *He is quiet.*

Iesus bears the cross. *He endures.*

Jesus is helped by Simon of Cyrene. He allows others to help.

Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem. He thinks of others.

Jesus is crucified. *He is in pain.*

Jesus promises His kingdom to the good thief. He forgives.

Jesus speaks to His mother and disciple. He watches over His family.

Jesus dies on the cross. He weeps.

Jesus is placed in the tomb. *He loves*.

To deepen our life in the Lord Jesus, we have to feel what others feel; accept our own situation with grace and hope, face up to the evil around us, reach out to those who need us, and answer evil with love. We ask ourselves, what will my life be like if I deepen my life in Jesus? What will our Parish be like if we deepen our life in Jesus? Perhaps this Lent we might attend the Stations of the Cross on one or more Fridays to further reflect upon "Deepening my life in the Lord Jesus" (The above reflection taken and adapted from <u>Station to Station</u> by Gary Jensen)

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

This year, we will be holding our third annual Lenten food drive to benefit our Saint Philip Saint Vincent de Paul food pantry. Our food pantry volunteers currently deliver food to approximately 70 households each month who do not have transportation with which to reach a traditional food bank. We also serve those who contact our hotline and are in need of emergency food assistance.

For the Lenten food drive, we are asking that you donate certain foods and toiletries that we need the most, but we will happily accept any unexpired, non-perishable food items or toiletries that you would like to donate. Paper bags with an attached list of suggested donation items will be available at the Saint Philip Church courtyard (ramp) entrance and the Ascension Church main entrance. 
