

Greetings once again, and best wishes for this Lent and for a blessed Holy Week!

Would you like to see Jesus too?

On several occasions, our parish's patron saint - Saint Philip the Apostle - appears in the accounts of the Gospels. Today, we hear of Saint Philip receiving the request from some individuals of Greek heritage. These non-Jewish persons tell Philip that they "would like to see Jesus." Then Philip and Andrew take their request to Jesus Himself asking Him to make time for these interested individuals.

How about you? Would you like to see Jesus too? Would you like to share His company throughout your years? Would you like to feel close to the Lord Jesus whom we proclaim is "our light and our salvation"?

You'll be glad and blessed when you spend time with Jesus and share in all our celebrations and commemorations of His life, death, and glorious Resurrection!

In just one week, we'll arrive at Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion and the holiest week of the entire Christian year. Please plan to join us in prayer during those holy days!

When we arrive at Easter Sunday of the Lord's Resurrection, may we all be stronger, more faithful, and more devoted disciples of Jesus thanks to our Lenten renewal. May all of us joyfully celebrate the Lord's Resurrection on Easter Sunday and throughout the 50 day Easter Season!

Before celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession, it's important to conduct a personal examination of conscience in order to offer a complete confession.


"You shall love the Lord with all your heart, all your mind, and all your soul!"

- Do you spend time in prayer each day?
- Do you offer thanks and praise to God each day?
- Do you give higher priority to your work, recreation, or possessions?
- Do you speak respectfully of the Lord at all times?
- Do you respect the name of God, and especially of Jesus, at all times?
- Have you missed church worship on any Sunday or any Holy Day?
- Do you keep Sunday as the day of the Lord and a day of prayer?

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

- Are you a person of love as Jesus commands us to be?
- Do you treat your parents, other adults, and all people with respect?
- Do you speak of family members, friends, neighbors, and strangers with charity?
- Have you taken the life of a human person or harmed someone?
- Have you ended or helped to end the life of a pre-born child?
- Have you mistreated or harmed other life?
- Have you broken your marriage commitment or intruded on another's marriage?
- Have you engaged in marital relations before or outside of married life?
- Have you used pharmaceuticals, prophylactics, or surgery to prevent conception?
- Have you made use of pornography or engaged in self-abuse?
- Have you engaged in theft of another's property or money?
- Have you damaged the property of someone else?
- Have you abused or damaged the natural resources of the earth?
- Have you told lies about other people? Have you lied about other matters?
- Have you spoken poorly of others or treated others with little or no respect?
- Have you spoken profanity or curses or sacrilege or blasphemy?
- Are you judgmental or critical of others without cause?
- Do you hold grudges and refuse to forgive family members or others?
- Are you envious and jealous of others, their families, or their possessions?
- Do you appreciate and give thanks for your own blessings?
- Do you share your blessings and possessions with others? With the Church?

An Act of Contrition - Lord God, I am sorry for all my sins. In choosing to do wrong, and failing to do good, I have offended you, whom I should love above all else. With the help of your grace, I promise to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Our Savior, Jesus Christ, suffered and died for our sins. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.

Welcome to Bishop Zubik & the 2024 Deacon Class





A NOTE FROM MARYANN: "I will place my law within them and write it upon their hearts." These are the words found in the first reading for the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The Psalm response is Psalm 51, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me." This Psalm is the fourth and most famous of the Penitential Psalms. The Psalmist begs pardon for his sins and prays to be restored to grace and purity. As we continue our Lenten Journey, we might reflect upon a request for a clean heart and become aware of what God has

Create in me a clean heart, that I may recognize that it is you who stirs my heart within me.

Create in me a clean heart, one that is free from harsh judgement, warmly welcoming others.

Create in me a clean heart, cleansed of anxiety and lack of trust, restoring in me an awareness of your presence and unconditional love. Create in me a clean heart, washed with your mercy and strengthened by your love, helping me move beyond whatever keeps me from union with you.

Lord, let me be aware of what you have written upon my heart. In the silence of my heart let me see the many ways in which you have blessed me. Deep within my heart, let me hear your voice calling me to follow you. Let the stirrings of my heart lead me to share your love with others. Let my Lenten Journey be one of heartfelt repentance that I may share the Joy of Easter. Amen.




