

Notes from the Pastor

Alleluia! Alleluia! The Lord Jesus is Risen from the grave! Easter Season greetings to you, and best wishes for these fifty joyful days!

Remembering the Resurrection every day

During this Easter Season, we hear the Gospel accounts of Jesus' forty days which He shared with His Apostles and disciples prior to Jesus' return to God the Father in the Ascension event. These wonderful accounts recall for us the encounters and visits which the Risen Lord Iesus shared with those closest to Him - as well as with many other disciples and believers.

In these Gospel accounts, we hear of Jesus' presence in his glorified existence as He assured His followers of His Resurrection to new life following His self-sacrifice and death on the cross. We also hear of Jesus' kindness, understanding, and pastoral care for His flock. The Lord did not return to them as an accuser and a harsh judge. He was not annoyed and angry with them for their lack of courage and fidelity during His own suffering and death.

Instead, Jesus extended to His band of **followers** the same love, goodness, and kindness that He shared with them throughout His public ministry with them and among the people of Israel. All the accounts of Jesus' Resurrection and His forty days before the Ascension are a magnificent witness to the Risen Lord, and they assure us that Jesus will share the same kindness and goodness with all of us who "have NOT seen, but still believe in Him!"

May every day of this Easter Season inspire you and your family members to believe in the

death and Resurrection of Lord Jesus - as well as everything that we believe about Jesus the Christ!

Recent property vandalism

By now, most people in our local area have seen the vandalism committed at our parish's Respect Life sign in the parish cemetery located along East Steuben Street. This criminal act was committed during the night of Friday, April 5. Of course, we'll never know if this vandalism was motivated by guilt, shame, anger, or some other reason. We'll pray for the person/s who perpetrated this act - rejecting the goodness and gift of human life - in the hope that they themselves will be led to healing and the goodness of life.

At this time, consideration is being given to what should be done with the Respect Life sign. Presuming that the sign will remain where it is and that it will be repaired, my hope is that such vandalism will NOT be perpetrated again. I sincerely hope that this isn't an indication of things to come in the future.

And a note about Easter Sunday 2025

Each year, participation in our Easter Vigil and our Easter Sunday Liturgies is very good. Looking ahead to the schedule for next year, 2025, we will more than likely adjust the Easter Sunday schedule to have TWO Easter Sunday Liturgies at 11:00am instead of 9:30am. This change should better accommodate our members, our families, and our many guests who seem to prefer a later time on Easter Sunday morning. This adjustment will also give us a better scheduling of Easter Sunday Liturgies at both of our parish churches.

Best wishes for a joyful Easter Season!

During these holy days of the Easter Season, may the glorious Son of God bless you, your family, and our Saint Philip Catholic Parish community now and every day. Alleluia!

Fundamental Catholic **Christian Beliefs**

It's good for all the members of our parish and all Catholic Christians to know the basic beliefs of our faith - along with the many elements of Catholic Christianity and the Good News of the Lord Jesus. Our Catholic faith and life are indeed tremendous treasures that are comprised of so many amazing facets - just like a diamond.

As Catholic Christians, our three most basic beliefs are these:

1.) DIVINITY.

We believe there is One Eternal God in Three Divine Persons (God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit) as revealed to us by Jesus of Nazareth;

2.) INCARNATION.

The Son of God became fully human in Jesus of Nazareth thus joining together both the Divine and humanity; and

3.) RESURRECTION.

The Lord Jesus was raised from the dead three days after His crucifixion and death on the cross, and Jesus' Resurrection gives us hope for our own Resurrection and Eternal Life.

There are many wonderful beliefs in our Catholic Christian faith, yet it's always good to see everything in the context of these three basic beliefs: *Divinity*, *Incarnation*, and *Resurrection*!



SINGING TO THE

In each Sunday Liturgy and other solemn celebrations, we sing (or recite) the 'Gloria'. It is a wonderful Christian song of praise to God which incorporates various praises sung by the angels in the Bible – along with additional Christian praises offered to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. In our Liturgy, after we begin by invoking the Lord's divine mercy, we then sing our praise of God with joyful hearts and voices.

Glory to God in in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.

...†... We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. ...†...

> For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

After pausing applications for over a year, the Pennsylvania Homeowner Assistance Fund (PAHAF) is now accepting applications again. PAHAF assists qualifying homeowners with grants of up to \$50,000.00 for mortgage payments, real estate taxes, homeowners' association or condominium association fees, and utility bills. Qualifying homeowners can receive assistance with delinquent mortgage payments and up to six months of future mortgage payments. Up to \$14,000 can be obtained for delinquent real estate taxes and up to \$5,000 can be obtained for delinquent homeowners' or condo association fees. Utility assistance is capped at \$10,000.

In order to qualify, you must own and live in the house; the house must be located in Pennsylvania; you must have experienced a financial hardship after January 21, 2020 (including a hardship that began before January 21, 2020 and continued after that date); you must be at least 30 days behind on the expense that you're requesting assistance with; you must meet income guidelines; and you cannot have received assistance from another government agency for the same expenses. The income limit for a household of one is \$106,300 per year, a household of two \$121,450, a household of three \$136,650, and a household of four \$151,800.

Funding is limited and will be given out on a first-come, first-served basis, so it is important to apply as soon as possible. To learn more or apply, please visit https://pahaf.org or call




