

Alleluia! The Lord Jesus is Risen from the grave! Easter Season greetings to you, and best wishes for these fifty joyful days!

Staying close to the Lord

Do you remember your years in high school? Of course, if you're thirteen years of age or younger, you haven't yet begun your high school years. Then again, if you're that young, you're probably NOT reading this page in the bulletin.

Back to my question: do you remember your years in high school? Were they 10 years ago? 20 years ago? 30? 40? 50? 60? 70? More?

If you do remember those secondary school years, do you recall how many classmates you had in your division? Do you remember how many fellow students, faculty, staff, and administrators were part of the high school community?

Whatever that number may have been, I'll wager that you were seldom or never alone when you were on the campus of your school. Being surrounded by fellow students - as well as adults is certainly the most common experience which everyone has in our school years. Throughout our years of education, we are constantly in the company of friends and fellow young people.

Then comes graduation, and we immediately find ourselves to be alone. After that high school commencement, we are never again surrounded by so many other individuals - for better or worse. After high school, it may take years for a person to create their own family for this journey through life. You may work in the company of a small number of individuals. Then again, you may find yourself much more alone than you ever expected.

Those years in school give us the false sense that we'll never be alone - that we'll always be connected to many, many people - including some friends. However, we find a different existence as adults.

As Catholic Christians, we can find a great deal of consolation in this Sunday's reading from the Gospel according to John, chapter 10 - the Good Shepherd teaching. Whether you're traveling through this life with many family members and friends, or even if you find yourself fairly alone quite often, Jesus gives us the blessed assurance that HE is always present to us as our friend and companion and shepherd. I hope that it's a promise all of us can appreciate - whether we share our lives with many others each day, or if we think of ourselves as lone pilgrims on this journey to everlasting life in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

May you and I and all of us keep in mind each day that Jesus, our Good Shepherd - and His mother, Mary, and Joseph, all the saints, and indeed all God's people - accompanies us all our days. If we take time for prayer -- inviting the Lord and the Holy Spirit to be with us each day, then we will be surrounded by the best company that we could ever hope to have.

May you and all of us walk closely with Jesus our Good Shepherd every day during our lifetime. May Jesus' company and the company of all the saints and disciples be a blessing - and a source of strength and support - to you and to all of us. In our lives, may the presence of Jesus and of our all Catholic family be a real treasure as we together make this pilgrimage to the glory of the Resurrection - and to the eternal home that Jesus promises all of us in the Kingdom of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit! Amen! Alleluia!


This week, let us consciously think about ourselves as God's children.














Sharing the Faith

WHAT CAN PARENTS & GRANDPARENTS DO?





Many parents and grandparents ask how they can and should share our Catholic Christian Faith with their children and grandchildren. There are many ways you can hand on our Faith to our younger generations and, in doing so, lead your young ones to Jesus and to the love, life, and People of God.

Try these daily practices:

- Tell your young ones of God's love and care for them;
- Tell them about God the Father, God the Father's Son Jesus, and God's Holy Spirit of love and goodness;
- Teach your child/ren the Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, and the Glory Be. Pray these prayers together throughout each
- Read children's Bible stories to your kids;
- Bring your children to the Liturgy each weekend;
- Teach your young ones the prayers, creed, responses, and songs of our Liturgy;
- Review with them the Ten Commandments and Jesus' command to love God and all others;
- Read with them a catechism for children:
- Pray with them before meals, during the day, and before bedtime.

In the early Church of Rome, this Christian Creed - known as the APOSTLES' CREED - was taught to new Christians preparing for Baptism. It was also used in the Baptism Ceremony – just as it continues to be employed in our own Baptism and Confirmation ceremonies today AND in the celebration of Easter Sunday each year. This Creed can also be prayed in the Sunday Liturgy, and it is recited at the beginning of the Rosary. It is good and important to know the Apostles' Creed.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

We often write about families being added to our monthly food delivery list, but what does that mean? The St. Philip Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has operated a unique, delivery-only food bank for over 40 years.

Most food banks have certain hours each month during which people can come to the food bank and pick up food. For people who rely on public transportation, are disabled or have other transportation issues, getting to a normal food bank and transporting the food home is problematic. That's where we come in. We serve those who live within our parish boundaries and do not have reliable transportation to get to - or are otherwise not capable of transporting food home from - a traditional food bank.

Our volunteers deliver food once a month to the homes of our "food families." We are a partner food pantry of the Greater Pittsburgh Area Food Bank, which allows us to purchase food from the food bank for much less than it could be purchased from a grocery store. Local businesses donate pizzas and baked goods to our food bank. We obtain donations from individuals through church and school food drives. As a last resort, we purchase the rest of the food that we need from grocery stores.

Food families can receive monthly food assistance from us as long as they continue to meet the Greater Pittsburgh Area Food Bank income requirements. Volunteering by delivering food once a month with our food bank is a great opportunity for those with a busy schedule, as

different teams deliver at different times of the day and on different days of the week. Packing and delivering the food usually takes about two hours. This is a unique opportunity to develop lasting relationships with your food families as you will get to see the same people every month. 
