

Notes from the Pastor

Alleluia! The Lord Jesus is Risen from the grave! Easter Season greetings to you, and best wishes for these fifty joyful days!

Just where is the Kingdom of God?

In the Gospels and the other writings of the **New Testament**, there are a number of images used to depict the growth of God's presence in our world. Today's Gospel passage from the Gospel according to John, chapter 15, gives us the image of the Vineyard of the Lord. Jesus tells us that He is the main vine upon which the abundant grapes of the vineyard are grown. Jesus is the source of life, and the branches - the members - produce the fruits, the bounty of the Lord's vineyard.

Other images include the Temple of the Lord, the 'farm' of the Lord, the field of the Lord, the expansive trees that provide a home and shelter, a beehive of constant activity and work, and other images that are familiar to all Christians.

For many centuries since the life, death, and **Resurrection of the Lord Iesus** - and certainly in the centuries when the Church was dominant in the history of Europe - there were many among our Christian ancestors who equated the Kingdom of God with an actual political empire which they called "Christendom." These ancestors believed that the true presence of God was to be found in a Christian Kingdom which would spread throughout the world.

Today, our view of the 'Kingdom of God' - and the presence of Almighty God in our world - is

very different. We recognize that Jesus did NOT come among us to establish a new political empire. Jesus did NOT come among us to establish a worldwide government or political reality.

Instead, the "Kingdom of God" actually refers to the spiritual presence of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit here on earth.

The Kingdom of God, the "presence of God" can be found throughout the world in the lives of Jesus' disciples when we truly do the work of the Lord. The Kingdom of God, the "presence of God" can be found in the love and life and goodness that we share with one another. It can be found in the compassion, charity, mercy, patience, understanding, and goodness that we share with our family members and neighbors, with the needy and the poor.


We can be sure that the presence of Almighty God is found and continues to grow in every place where love is truly present among individuals, families, and communities.

In this 21st century since the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus, we're called to be the disciples of Jesus, the "branches on the vine" which produce abundant growth and an amazing harvest. We accomplish this by remaining in communion with the Lord and by sharing divine life and holy love with those closest to us - and with all those who seek the life, grace, and the love of God Almighty. May we work for the "Kingdom of God" by being Christian disciples of love and goodness every day of our lives!

The Rosary is a traditional Christian prayer which helps us to meditate on the life of the Lord Jesus and to honor His Blessed Mother, Mary.

Begin with the Sign of the Cross

"In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Next, pray the Apostles Creed, then the Lord's Prayer, the Ave Maria (3 times), and the Glory Be.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting.

The Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Ave Maria

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory Be

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

As you pray each of the five Mysteries of the day, begin with the Lord's Prayer once (1), then pray the Ave Maria ten (10) times, then conclude with the Glory Be once (1).

You may then conclude each Mystery with the Fatima Prayer:

"O my Jesus, forgive us our sins. Save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls into heaven, especially those in most need of your mercy."



At the end of the five Mysteries, pray the Salve Regina.

Hail, holy Queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet virgin Mary. / Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray. O God, whose only begotten Son, by his life, death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may both imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us. Amen.



Like our parents, grandparents, and many generations before us, it's good to make our personal and family plans for our funeral and burial in a cemetery. Yes, of course, this can be unnerving when we begin the process, but it's a true kindness to our family members if and when we put all of our plans, requests, finances, and estate in order long before our final day.

Thankfully, we have very fine attorneys, funeral directors, and other professionals in our local community who are more than willing to guide you through the planning process. You'll find them among our bulletin advertisers. We're also fortunate to have numerous Catholic and community cemeteries whose staff members are very helpful. In addition, the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh also offers the Catholic Funeral Plan (CFP, telephone 1-877-886-PLAN) in conjunction with the Catholic Cemeteries Association of Pittsburgh (CCA) and the Loyal Christian Benefits Association (LCBA) to create funding arrangements now so that all your plans can be set and funded long in advance of being needed.

For our part, how can Saint Philip Parish's staff help you? In response to requests from parish members, we're willing to send our Funeral Planning Booklet and Funeral Selection Forms to any parish members who request them in advance.

If you're making Advanced Funeral Plans now or in the coming years, there's no need to wait until later to plan a Funeral Liturgy. You're welcome to request these funeral planning items and then include your selections in your planning file - keeping one copy with your family and giving one copy to your chosen funeral director.



We often write about families being added to our monthly food delivery list, but what does that mean? The St. Philip Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul has operated a unique, delivery-only food pantry for over 40 years.

Most food pantries have certain hours each month during which people can come to the food pantry and pick up food. For people who rely on public transportation, are disabled or have other transportation issues, getting to a normal food bank and transporting the food home is problematic. That's where we come in. We serve those who live within our parish boundaries and do not have reliable transportation to get to - or are otherwise not capable of transporting food home from - a traditional food bank.

Our volunteers deliver food once a month to the homes of our "food families." We are a partner food pantry of the Greater Pittsburgh Area Food Bank, which allows us to purchase food from the food bank for much less than it could be purchased from a grocery store. Local businesses donate pizzas and baked goods to our food pantry. We obtain donations from individuals through church and school food drives. As a last resort, we purchase the rest of the food that we need from grocery stores.


Food families can receive monthly food assistance from us as long as they continue to meet the Greater Pittsburgh Area Food Bank income requirements. Volunteering by delivering

food once a month with our food pantry is a great opportunity for those with a busy schedule, as different teams deliver at different times of the day and on different days of the week. Packing and delivering the food usually takes about two hours. This is a unique opportunity to develop lasting relationships with your food families as you will get to see the same people every month. This week, your generous donations enabled us to provide a woman with \$400 in mortgage assistance; a single mother with up to \$400 in rental assistance; a family with \$227 for a motel stay; two women with \$150 each qualify utility for assistance programs; two women with up to \$300 each in rental assistance; a single mother with \$400 for a plumbing repair; a woman with \$250 toward a security deposit; another woman with \$500 toward a security deposit; and a woman with \$252 in rental assistance. It was a busy week, and we couldn't have done it without your generous support; thank you!




