Notes from the **Pastor**

Alleluia! The Lord Jesus is Risen from the grave! Easter Season greetings to you, and best wishes for these fifty joyful days!

God our loving Father

From the beginning of humanity, our ancient ancestors asked from whence we came. They marveled at the world in which we still live, and they knew that there must have been a creator who brought about all life. Throughout the millennia, many beliefs - which we tend to call myths and mythology - came into existence. Every ancient people and culture had their beliefs about humanity and about the divinity which they believed to be the origin of the earth and all life.

Four millennia ago, beginning with Abraham and Sarah, our ancestors - the Hebrew people - came to believe in the One who revealed Himself to Abraham as the one and only God, the one and only Divinity who is both Creator and Lord. Then throughout the next two millennia, the Hebrews - the first People of God in our belief - followed the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. Later known as the People of Israel, those who were faithful to the Lord sought to remain the Lord's people in both good times and in troubled times (including their centuries of exile from their land).

Two thousand years ago, from the People of Israel came Iesus of Nazareth - the man and teacher whom we today still call the Son of Almighty God, the Lord, the Messiah, the Holy One, our Savior, the Christ.

In His teaching which we hear again today

in the Gospel according to John, we have learned from Jesus that God is truly a Trinity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit - One God who is actually a Divine community of life and love and which is the origin of all life.


To call God our Father is an extraordinary belief taught to us by Jesus Himself. Before Jesus taught His Good News to the world, our ancient ancestors believed in all sorts of gods and goddesses - usually divinities who had little or no use for humanity. By teaching us that God the Father loves us and blesses us - and all humanity, Jesus has given all of us a most remarkable and wonderful revelation that the Almighty Creator is a Divine and loving Father to all people and to all creation. To most people who are NOT Christians, this belief is hard to accept, but for all of us who are faithful disciples and friends of Iesus. understanding of God as our Father is truly amazing and extraordinary.

Whenever we hear Jesus revelation of God as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit and every time we pray the Lord's Prayer (the 'Our Father') may we remember and appreciate what a most wonderful understanding of our Creator and God is this Christian belief. May we truly be thankful for Jesus' teaching that God is our loving and heavenly Father who cares for all His children. May we be grateful for Jesus' divine revelation that God is our Father who calls all people - through His divine Son, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit of God - to enter into the everlasting presence, life, love, and Kingdom of God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit now and forever. Amen! Alleluia!

The Rosary is a traditional Christian prayer which helps us to meditate on the life of the Lord Jesus and to honor His Blessed Mother, Mary.

Begin with the Sign of the Cross

"In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Next, pray the Apostles Creed, then the Lord's Prayer, the Ave Maria (3 times), and the Glory Be.

The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting.

The Lord's Prayer

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name. Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Ave Maria

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory Be

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

The Glorious Mysteries

The Resurrection of Jesus The Ascension of the Lord The Pentecost sending of the Holy Spirit The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary The Crowning of Mary as Queen of Heaven.

As you pray each of the five Mysteries of the day, begin with the Lord's Prayer once (1), then pray the Ave Maria ten (10) times, then conclude with the Glory Be once (1).

You may then conclude each Mystery with the Fatima Prayer:

"O my Jesus, forgive us our sins. Save us from the fires of hell. Lead all souls into heaven, especially those in most need of your mercy."



At the end of the five Mysteries, pray the Salve Regina.

Hail, holy Queen, mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness, and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet virgin Mary. / Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Let us pray. O God, whose only begotten Son, by his life, death, and Resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal salvation, grant, we beseech thee, that while meditating on these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may both imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us. Amen.







MENTAL HEALTH and Wellness Ministry

This May, in the spirit of Mental Health Awareness Month, Saint Philip Parish has launched its Mental Health and Wellness Ministry. We all get colds, the flu, maybe a sinus infection or backache... all things that keep us from functioning at our best. No one thinks twice about getting help for a physical ailment, but when it comes to mental health it's an entirely different story.

We all exist on a Mental Health continuum. which means that sometimes our ability to function optimally is hindered by mental health issues. Whether it's loss, financial stress, caregiving demands, relationship strain, depression, anxiety, or other challenges, we all encounter these concerns at some point.

Shockingly, one in four people will be impacted by mental health problems during their lifetime, affecting their ability to perform at their best. The prevalence of mental illness, as reported by the National Institute of Health, is even higher than we might imagine. As a Church, we are called to demonstrate God's love by caring for and supporting those in need. Individuals grappling with mental health problems constitute a significant population deserving of care. As a parish, one meaningful action we can take is to pray for those affected by mental health crises, situations, or illnesses.

In the coming weeks, you'll see prayer crosses at our church entrances. From May 12 to June 1, we invite you to write the first name of anyone needing prayer for hope and healing due to mental health challenges on a square post-it and place it on the prayer board. Additionally, we'll pray for those lost to mental illness or suicide by writing their first names on butterfly post-its and placing them on the board. Our prayer is that the Lord will hold all these loved ones in His care.














2024 PARISH APPEAL FOR OUR DIOCESE


