



Alleluia! The Lord Jesus is Risen from the grave! Easter Season greetings to you, and best wishes for these joyful days!

#### Stepping up for the Lord

If you've ever taken the time to read - and perhaps even study - the Acts of the Apostles in the New Testament, you know the importance of this sacred book attributed to Saint Luke as the sequel to the Gospel according to Luke.

After compiling a magnificent account to of Jesus' life in his Gospel, Luke then collected important accounts from the earliest years of the Apostles' preaching the Good News, their ministry, and the life of the earliest Christian communities. The Acts of the Apostles is truly worth reading every Easter Season both in the Liturgy and at home!

In the Acts of the Apostles, we hear how the teachings of Peter and the Apostles shaped the existence of Christianity and the Church long before the books and letters of the New Testament were even written. This is a clear reminder that the official teachings of church leadership are on par with the writings of the Scriptures.

You might remember my occasionally repeated bulletin article reminding everyone that the Three Pillars of Christianity are: 1.) the Sacred Scriptures (*the Holy Bible*); 2.) the Tradition of the Apostles; and 3.) the Magisterium - the Official Teachings of our Church Leadership. Just remember the acronym 'S.T.M.'! (*See the article on Page 10 of this bulletin.*)

Not only are there very important beliefs and lessons to be learned in our reading the Acts of the Apostles, there are also accounts of how the earliest Christian community – the Church of the Lord – lived and evangelized and grew day after day.

Today in the first reading of our Liturgy, we hear the selection of Matthias as an Apostle to replace Judas the Iscariot who betrayed Jesus. Because the People of Israel were established upon the twelve sons of Jacob, Jesus chose twelve Apostles upon whom He would establish the New People of God. In the earliest days following Jesus' return to the Father in the Ascension, the eleven remaining Apostles led by Saint Peter added Matthias to their number to complete the twelve once again.

This is an important historical fact, and it's also a reminder to all of us even today that, even today, each of us and all of us are called to "step up." Each of us and all of us are called to take our place, to assume our role, to pursue our mission in service to the Lord Jesus. Like Matthias, each of us is called to be the next missionary disciple, the next evangelist, the next servant of the Kingdom which Jesus Himself calls us to be by our Baptism and our Confirmation and the Eucharist!

**During these twenty centuries, the Kingdom of God -** the Divine presence of God - has grown throughout our world. During the history of God's people in the Church, humanity and our civilization have been so greatly blessed and improved because many of our ancestors stepped up to serve the Lord and His people - just like the original Apostles and Saint Matthias.

In the days and years ahead, remember to "step up" like Saint Matthias, and be a true friend, co-worker, disciple, and evangelist of the Lord Jesus and His Good News. Amen! Alleluia!







**A NOTE FROM MARYANN:** In the second reading from Sunday, May 12 we hear, "*Whoever acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God remains in him and he in God.*" As the weather becomes warmer and "Summer-like," I came across a writing by Father William Byrne titled, "*Tips for 'Sonbathing.*" Father notes the following from his book, <u>5 Things with Father Bill</u>.

While I caution everyone to stay out of the sun, I am a strong advocate for catching the Son's rays. Jesus is the Way, The Truth, and the Life, and if we don't get enough time with Him, we can get lost, begin to believe lies, and feel less alive. Here are five tips for "Sonbathing:"

- **1. Seek direct exposure.** Real love requires face time. At Mass on Sunday, we have the deepest encounter with the Lord in the Eucharist. If you can make a weekday Mass, that is a way to allow the Lord more deeply into your week.
- 2. Find a good reflector. To ensure an even tone, some people put tinfoil on cardboard to reflect the rays. The strongest rays of the Son come from the Scriptures and the Sacraments, but Christ speaks to us in many ways. Pope Francis has emphasized to the Church that we need to have a heart for the poor. In serving others we also truly encounter Jesus. Those in need are powerful reflectors of the Son.
- **3. Multitask.** The good news is that we can get the Son all through our day. It does not just have to happen in church. Our commute, waiting in the dentist's office, in line at the bank, on hold on the phone: all of these are perfect

chances for multitasking. Have a favorite prayer handy, and instead of worrying or being bored, be blessed.

- **4. Avoid "Sonblock."** I am not talking about S-P-F; I am talking about S-I-N. God does not force us to love Him. He invites us gently. Sin disrupts our capacity to hear Him and experience His love most fully. Seeking His forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation is not just for Advent and Lent. Let the light in every day.
- **5. Glare is good.** Normally, we avoid glare, but glare from the Son is good. Not only is it good, it is essential for effective Sonbathing. Good gifts get better when we share them. Be God's glare. Let his love continually reflect off of you and into the darkness of our world. I believe the most effective tool for evangelization is joy. A smile is the best way to win hearts for Christ.

FAITH FORMATION: Baptism - for all of us, our journey of faith begins with the Sacrament of Baptism. Baptism "is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which give access to the other Sacraments. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1213) If you would like to have your child baptized, please contact the Office of Faith Formation at 412-922-6388. Our process includes completion of a baptism request form, Catholic birth and required sponsor certificates, as well as a 75-minute session for first-time parents.



OCIA (Formerly RCIA) is for those individuals who, after hearing and experiencing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, seek the living God and desire to enter the way of faith and conversion within the Catholic Church community as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. As you know, the three most fundamental beliefs of Catholic Christianity are: 1.) the Divine Trinity – there is one Almighty God in three Divine Persons; 2.) the Incarnation – the Divine Son of God became fully human in the person of Jesus of Nazareth; and 3.) the Resurrection – following His death on the Cross, on the third day, Jesus was raised to new and glorious life by the Father and the Holy Spirit.

It's also important to remember the three foundational pillars of Catholic Christianity. They are:


- 1.) *The Sacred Scriptures in the Bible* the inspired Word of God in the Old Testament and the New Testament;
- 2.) *The early Tradition* the Tradition from Jesus, the Apostles, and the early Church that existed in addition to the writings of the New Testament in the first century; and
- 3.) <u>*The Magisterium*</u> which is the official teaching of the Church, its apostles, and shepherds beginning with the Council of Jerusalem in the first years of Christianity and continuing through all the official councils of the Church.

These three pillars are often abbreviated *"S.T.M."* for easy remembrance. All three of these pillars are essential to Christianity and the Church!

In recent centuries, many Christians have claimed that "our faith is all about the Bible," but in reality, since the first century, these Three Pillars have all been of tremendous importance. In fact, the Apostolic Tradition and the official Magisterium came into existence even before the writings of the New Testament existed. The Bible is of tremendous importance, but the full and balanced faith of the Church includes the ancient and original Tradition as well as all the official teachings (the Magisterium) of the Catholic Church since the first years after Jesus' life, death, and Resurrection.

Take a look at *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* and every approved catechism of the Church. You'll see countless passages from and references to the *Scriptures*, the *Tradition*, and the *Magisterium*. We are blessed to have not only one pillar of Christianity but *THREE Pillars of our faith*. Read *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* <u>AND</u> the *Bible*, and you'll have the complete picture of our Christian faith as it has been believed and lived in the Catholic Church for 2000 years. *God bless!*

#### CLASSROOM CHRONICLES MRS. ALYSON WOODALL - PRESCHOOL

During the winter, Pre-K students enhanced their literacy by practicing sound counting and syllable identification, and improved their math by adding and subtracting objects to understand group sizes. They've made significant progress in these foundational skills.

Our Pre-K class has made remarkable strides in their Catholic faith, mastering prayers like The Our Father and Hail Mary, and understanding the Holy Trinity and Jesus' sacrifices during Lent. Their kindness in giving alms, celebrating Saint Patrick's Day, and engaging with the Easter story through crafts and storytelling are significant achievements for our young learners.

Our preschool children recently explored measurement concepts, using non-standard units like snap cubes for height and candy hearts for length. They engaged in activities to compare the capacity of containers with pom poms and concluded with a fun balance scale exercise to learn about weight. The students were thrilled to apply their math skills practically.





#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

New beds are one of the most requested furniture items by our neighbors in need. Sometimes they have beds that are in desperate need of replacement; sometimes they are sleeping on air mattresses; and sometimes they have no bed of any kind. When we give a bed to a friend in need, we also like to give them a new set of sheets as oftentimes, they do not have adequate bedding either.

Last summer, we asked for donations of new twin and full sheet sets and you generously donated approximately 50 sets, which have lasted us until now. 
