



We now come to the celebration of Corpus Christi Sunday - celebrating the Body and Blood of the Lord. Best wishes to you and our entire community for this solemn celebration of a fundamental belief of Christianity - our belief that since his Last Supper, the Lord Jesus has given his very life to all his disciples in the Church through the Holy Eucharist.

The Life of the Lord given to us

I think that we're all familiar with this effect of human love - when one person truly loves another person (*a spouse, a parent, a child, a friend*), they're known to say "*I'll do anything for you*" or even "*I'd give my life for you*!" These expressions of our care and appreciation for our loved ones are common in every culture and language.

Anyone's giving their life for the sake of another is an undeniable display of the great love that they have for the other person/s. In a most remarkable way, this act of love was and is seen in the death, the self-sacrifice of Jesus on the cross so that, for our sake, death would finally be overcome in Jesus' death and Resurrection.

For us as Catholic Christians, we are convinced of the Lord Jesus' love for all of us and for each of us because of our belief that Jesus *has* given His life for us - and that Jesus *continues* to give His very life to us every day and in every Liturgy. Jesus' love for us and all His disciples is NOT a distant love. Jesus doesn't love us from afar. The Lord is so close to us through His Holy Spirit, and the Lord loves us so very much that He continues to offer His very life to us and for us every day!

While many Catholic Christians routinely receive the Eucharist - the Body and Blood, the Life of the Lord - without much thought or reflection, this sacred gift of Jesus is truly a most remarkable treasure, a most wonderful sharing of the Lord's own life with all of us.

There are countless distractions in today's society which diminish our appreciation of our Catholic Faith and of the glorious treasures contained within it. This Corpus Christi Sunday should be a holy day when all of us focus our faith once again on the tremendous sign of the Lord's love for us - and the wonderful gift of divine life and grace - that is the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of the Lord, our share in the very life of Almighty God.

The importance of Eucharistic Adoration

Connected to our Holy Communion in the Eucharist is the very important and beneficial time we spend at Eucharistic Exposition – and in Eucharistic Adoration. Jesus' gift of himself is so very important (*and such a tremendous gift*) that we are strongly encouraged to pray often in the presence of the Eucharist.

In Eucharistic Adoration, we honor the Lord Jesus. In Eucharistic Adoration, we have quality prayer time in the presence of the Lord Jesus. In Eucharistic Adoration, we give due honor, worship, and adoration to the Lord Jesus as is fitting for all of us to offer Him.

This afternoon, Corpus Christi Sunday, June 2, from 12:00pm until 4:00pm, you and every member of our parish are invited to come to Saint Philip church for a time of quiet Adoration of the Eucharist, for silent prayer in the company of each other, and for time offering worship and thanks to God the Son, God the Father, and God the Holy Spirit!

Best wishes for these days and for the summer months!

While we're still three weeks from the official first day of summer, my best wishes are extended to all of you – our parish members and families – for very good and safe summer months. May this summer be a time of rest, renewal, faith, and the love of God for you and all your neighbors, friends, and loved ones. God bless!

Here's the \$1,000,000 question: should our time in church before the Liturgy be a time of silent personal prayer OR a time to greet and chat with one another in our weekly community gathering?

This question has been asked for generations since we were reminded that the Liturgy is both about prayer and the community assembly. They're "BOTH/AND" rather than being strictly one or the other.

As such, there is - and always will be - a dynamic tension between the two realities of our Sunday and weekday Liturgies - silent prayer and community gathering. Some come to church for silent prayer, and others come to the Liturgy to be with family, relatives, and friends. Some come for both!

So, how can we achieve a respectful and fair approach to this issue? As pastor, I suggest that we do our best - with charity and respect toward one another - to accommodate both approaches.

FIRST, please be sure to pray in silence at home every day so that your time in church isn't the only time you spend time in personal prayer. Let's also remember that the Mass is NOT a time of silent, personal prayer; it truly is the prayer of the entire community gathered together in faith, joy, thanksgiving, song, and communal prayer to give worship and thanks – and to celebrate the Eucharist.

SECOND, if you enjoy being together each week with family, friends, and neighbors, **please speak softly with one another**. We CAN in fact have quiet conversations when we come together in church. There's no need to speak loudly or to become boisterous when we see one another. There's plenty of time to continue the chat after the Mass has concluded.

Thank you for your attention to this matter, and thank you for treating the issue of "silence or chit-chat" with Christian respect and charity toward everyone gathered in church. God bless!

In this time of waiting for our final reunion, we do well to visit the resting places of our deceased loved ones and to pray for their eternal rest, and peace, and salvation!







A NOTE FROM MARYANN: This week we celebrate The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ known as Corpus Christi Sunday. Pope Francis in the book, <u>Walking With Jesus</u> mentions that there are specific signals for understanding how we are living the Eucharist, how we experience it. The first signal is our way of looking at or considering others. We can ask ourselves the question: Does the Eucharist I celebrate lead me to others as my brothers and sisters? Does it increase my capacity to rejoice with those who are rejoicing and cry with those who are crying? Does it urge me to go out to the poor, the sick, the marginalized? Does it help me to recognize the face of Jesus in their faces? Do I try to help those who are in difficulty and pray for them?

A second signal that we are living the Eucharist is the grace of feeling forgiven and ready to forgive. Do we acknowledge that we are always in need of being accepted and reborn by the mercy of God? We should never forget that the Last Supper of



Jesus took place "on the night He was betrayed," (1 Cor. 11:23). In the bread and in the wine which we offer and around which we gather, the gift of Christ's body and blood is renewed every time for the remission of our sins. We must go to Mass humbly and the Lord reconciles us.

The last valuable signal comes to us from the relationship between the Eucharistic celebration and the life of our Christian communities. We must always bear in mind that the Eucharist is not something we make; it is not our own commemoration of what Jesus said and did. No. It is precisely an act of Christ! It is Christ who acts there, who is on the altar. It is a gift of Christ, who makes Himself present and gathers us around Him, to nourish us with his Word and with His life.

Through the Eucharist, however, Christ wishes to enter into our life and permeate it with His grace, so that in every Christian community there may be coherence between Liturgy and life. Let us live the Eucharist with the spirit of faith, of prayer, of forgiveness, of repentance, of communal joy, of concern for the needy and for the needs of so many brothers and sisters, in the certainty that the Lord will fulfill what He has promised us: eternal life.

THE EUCHARIST CALLS US: The Eucharist calls us each to a personal encounter with Jesus Christ. In Father Ronald Rohlheiser's book, <u>Sacred Fire</u> we read:

Not even Jesus found "the ready."

Jesus called Nathaniel...Nathaniel lacked openness. Nathaniel wasn't ready.

Jesus called Philip....Philip lacked simplicity. Philip wasn't ready.

Jesus called Simon, the Zealot...Simon lacked non-violence. Simon wasn't ready.

Jesus called Andrew...Andrew lacked a sense of risk. Andrew wasn't ready.

Jesus called Thomas...Thomas lacked vision. Thomas wasn't ready.

Jesus called Judas...Judas lacked spiritual maturity. Judas was definitely not ready. Jesus called Matthew...Mathhew lacked a sense of social sin. Matthew wasn't ready. Jesus called Thaddeus...Thaddeus lacked commitment. Thaddeus wasn't ready. Jesus called James the Lesser...James lacked awareness. James wasn't ready. Jesus called James and John, the sons of thunder.

James and John lacked a sense of servanthood. James and John were not ready.

Jesus called Peter, the Rock...Peter lacked courage. Peter wasn't ready.

The point, you see, is that Jesus doesn't call the ready. Jesus calls the willing.

Baptism "is the basis of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which give access to the other Sacraments." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1213) If you would like to have your child baptized, contact the Office of Faith Formation at 412-922-6388. Our process includes completing a baptism request form, submitting birth and Catholic sponsor certificates, as well as a 75-minute session for first-time parents.

Order of Christian Initiation of Adults

OCIA (formerly RCIA) is for those individuals who, after hearing and experiencing the mystery of Christ proclaimed, seek the living God and desire to enter the way of faith and conversion within the Catholic Church Community as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts. 

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

Over our past two fiscal years, we provided our friends in need with \$43,550 more in assistance than we received in donations.
