



#### Growing the Kingdom of God today

Having heard the Gospels proclaimed every Sunday of our lives, we all know that, in His public ministry and teaching, Jesus often spoke about the Kingdom of God – the Reign of God – to His disciples. Today, Jesus speaks to us as well in the illuminating and inspiring parables that have been handed on to all of us.

In the fourth century Anno Domini (*the Year* of the Lord), when the Roman Emperor Constantine accepted Christianity and our faith became the faith of the Roman Empire, many disciples and believers began to think that the Kingdom of God would lead to a Christian empire. For centuries thereafter, our ancestors had the idea of spreading "Christendom" – the Reign of Christ – throughout the world. They had the dream that nations and government and societies would all be thoroughly Christian – and that eventually the Kingdom of God would be established as an imperial reality.

Today, we know full well that the Kingdom of God is greater than any governments or nations or empires which are all too human and imperfect. We no longer look to build some Christian political reality to build the Reign of God.

Rather, the Reign of God is found in us, in

**our families, in our parish communities, in our local churches**, and wherever the goodness and life of Almighty God are lived and shared with our members and our neighbors. Wherever the love, holiness, and charity of the Lord are present, there is the Divine Presence – the true Kingdom – of God.

May we be dedicated to living and sharing our Catholic Christian faith with our families and neighbors so that the presence of God – the life and Kingdom of God – will continue to grow and flourish even in today's society and today's world.

#### Honor thy father'

Also, best wishes this Sunday to all of our fathers, our grandfathers, our godfathers, our expectant fathers, our adoptive fathers, our stepfathers, our foster fathers – and to all men of our parish and of the Lord's Church – for a very good Father's Day holiday today!

**Know of our gratitude** for the life, faith, family, and home that you've shared with us throughout these years. Thank you too for the continued care, formation, support, faith and love that you continue to share with your children, spouse, grandchildren, and family members every day. 


#### **2024 PARISH APPEAL FOR OUR DIOCESE**

**A NOTE FROM MARYANN:** As we enter into the season of Summer, I thought it would be nice to hear from our book, <u>5 Things with Father Bill</u> by William Byrne. During the Summer heat, we are often reminded to drink water to stay hydrated and cool. Father Bill looks at 5 ways to avoid getting spiritually dehydrated.



- 1. The examination of conscience. Although this is actually the last thing we should do each day, I place it first because it is so important and it lays the groundwork for a great next day. <u>FIRST</u>, say thanks to God for your day. <u>SECOND</u>, ask for the grace to know your sins and to move away from them. <u>THIRD</u>, play the movie of your day and recall all the great moments and the times your failed to love well. <u>FOURTH</u>, tell God you are sorry. <u>FIFTH</u>, make "The Plan" for tomorrow to love better. Be specific! Do not just say, "I will be better tomorrow," but say, "I will be better tomorrow in this specific area, to this person," etc.
- **2. The morning offering.** When you get up, before you brush your teeth, stop and thank God for the day and offer all that happens to Him for His glory and your salvation.
- **3. The commute.** When I listen to the traffic report in the morning, I not only think of all those people stuck on the highways; I also think of all the prayer potential each morning. The drive/ride/jog is a perfect time to say some extra prayers. Freestyle your own prayers, say your favorites or a decade of the Rosary.
- **4. Grace.** *"Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts which we have received from thy bounty through Christ our Lord. Amen."* Now how hard was that? Pray before each meal and remember the sign of the cross. Think of crossing yourself in public and you may inspire a friend to know Jesus also.

Our process includes completion of a baptism request form, required birth and Catholic sponsor certificates as well as a 75-minute session for first-time parents.





## Why we BAPTIZE our Children

Most Catholic Christians accept the nearly 2,000 year old practice of baptizing children, but sometimes people ask, "Why baptize children? Why not let them grow up without any formal connection to Jesus and the Church, and then let them decide for themselves?"





#### HERE ARE FIVE IMPORTANT RESPONSES TO SUCH QUESTIONS.

#### **FIRST**:

Since we consider our life in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit – and in the Church and in our parish – to be a most wonderful gift and treasure, it's truly good and important to share this treasure with our children. Let children share in God's life as soon as possible!

#### **SECOND:**

Since parents make every decision for their children until age 18 (including important decisions such as schools, friends, home instruction, and activities), parents also have the right and the obligation to make very important faith decisions for their children.

#### THIRD:

Planting the seeds of faith is most important in the lives of children. **If NO seeds of faith are planted**, then children (indeed, the next generation) will grow up without any faith or life in God.

#### FOURTH:

The practice of Infant Baptism is recorded in the earliest generations of the Church (when entire families were baptized together), and this has continued throughout our 2,000 year history.

#### FIFTH:

In the Gospels, Jesus healed individuals because of the faith of their family and friends. Jesus gives life to individuals because of the faith of others. This is why parents, grandparents, and godparents speak on behalf of their children and accept the faith for them. At Confirmation, young disciples then accept and profess our faith – and become full disciples by their own acceptance of all we believe and live.

As the new generations of God's people are born into our families, the Church, and the world, may we share our Catholic Christian faith and life with them as soon and as completely as possible! May future generations of your family and of the People of God be joined to the Lord in Baptism. May future generations continue to share in the salvation of God until the Lord Jesus makes His return in glory!

#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

Recipients of SNAP (also known as food stamps) can now ride public transportation in Allegheny County for 50% off! At the beginning of this month, Pittsburgh Regional Transit (formerly PAT) launched the Allegheny GO program, which is designed to make public transit more accessible to low-income Allegheny County residents.

In order to qualify for the 50% off fares, you must live in Allegheny County, be between the ages of 12 and 64, reside in a household that has been receiving SNAP benefits for at least 3 months, and have the Ready2Ride app downloaded on your smartphone. The free app is available for both Apple and Android phones. The 50% discount can be used for 3-hour passes, weekly passes, or monthly passes.


