

Notes from the **Pastor**

Best wishes for these summer months! Try to enjoy some time of rest, relaxation, and recreation.

Set in your ways?

In this Sunday's account from the Gospel according to Mark, we read a very simple version of the "sending of the apostles" event which is more developed in the Gospels according to Matthew and Luke.

In Mark's account, Jesus' simply instructs the Apostles to venture out to preach and to heal. Jesus also instructs them to accept the hospitality of those who will welcome them.

In addition to expelling demons and healing those who are ill, what message was the preaching of the Apostles to include? We find the answer in the final verse of today's passage - the Apostles are to share the message of repentance of conversion - with all who would listen.

Why repentance and conversion? I imagine this initial Christian message was preached because it's very easy and commonplace for human persons to get "stuck in a rut" as we say. If we are to be faithful to the Lord, then we need to continually turn to Jesus and regularly recommit ourselves to the Lord.

I hope that all of us are virtuous Catholic Christians, but it's very easy for us to get stuck in bad habits. These bad habits which pull us further and further away from the fullness of life in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We call these bad habits "vices", and yes, in time, these bad habits truly become "vicious."

How often do you examine your ways and

your own habits? Are your ways and habits always good and holy? Or do you also need conversion and repentance like the people of Jesus' own day?

In reality, the Lord Jesus calls us to conversion and repentance every day of our lives. Our conversion and repentance should be a normal and regular part of our daily living.

Of course, this is true of all human persons since the beginning of humanity - and it's also true of us, of all Christians, and of all people today as well.

Take the time today and this week to honestly examine your own words, thoughts, attitudes, and actions. Are they all as holy and as Christian as they should be? Will you benefit from your own conversion and repentance? Should you celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation soon? Give it some thought, and may you and all of us heed the Lord's call to repentance, conversion, and faithfulness to the ways of the Lord and the life of God.

Father Phil Farrell is a native of Crafton Heights and has been given a new assignment in the diocesan administration by Bishop David Zubik. Beginning July 15, Father Farrell will serve as the Director of Institutional Ministries overseeing all of the Catholic chaplaincies at our high schools, college campuses, jails and prisons, and nursing facilities.

Father Phil will also provide some assistance to our parish liturgies on Sundays as did Father Larry Adams who is now the Pastor of Saint Mary Magdalene Parish in Pittsburgh's East End.

We welcome Father Farrel home to our parish community, and we wish him many blessings as he serves our diocesan church and as he becomes part of our parish community!

ADDING SOME EXTRA STAFF HELP

Given our parish staff changes within the past 12 months, we've been able to reconfigure our personnel budget for this new fiscal Year 2024-2025. This will allow us to reassign some of the duties and work of our staff members.

Our revised parish budget will now allow us to hire a new. part time Safe Environment Coordinator so that David Pilarski can focus on all of the business and financial aspects of our parish operation. We will be finalizing these part time additions to our parish staff this summer and will share with you in September the names of the individuals who will fulfill these important roles for the benefit of our Saint Philip Parish community. As always, thank you for your participation and support - as well as your financial contributions - which continue to keep Saint Philip Parish vital and alive!

Let our office staff know that you'd like a FREE copy, and we'll have it ready for pick up at the parish office during our weekday office hours.


FOOD BANK SUMMER RELOCATION

A NOTE FROM MARYANN: In the first reading for the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we read from the book of Amos. "Amos answered Amaziah, 'I was no prophet, nor have I belonged to a company of prophets; I was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. The Lord took me from the flock and said to me, Go, prophesy to my people Israel." I can imagine Amos saying to himself, "What do I know, I can't be a prophet, Someone else will have to do it." We might be tempted to speak to the Lord in the same way. We can say to ourselves, "I don't know enough about my religion to witness my faith." Or we might say, "I don't have time to go to a meeting. Anyway, other people pray more than I do."

Saint Francis de Sales writes, "Live Jesus! Jesus has as many varied faces and dwelling places as there are human hearts open to His presence." We are called to Live Jesus! We are called to grow closer to Jesus through our prayer, participation in the sacraments and participation in parish life. So during these days of summer, we might begin to think about how can we deepen our faith and answer the Lord's call to us. As Jesus' Eucharist and our Holy Communion fill us with divine life and grace, may we always be grateful for the Body and Blood of the Lord which gives us a share in the very life of God. May we renew and profess our faith in the Lord and his Eucharist every day of this year, and may we receive all the blessings and divine grace of Jesus as his friends, as his co-workers, and as his holy Catholic Church. Amen.

Our Seven Sacraments

Since the days of Jesus' ministry and of the early Church, we've been blessed to receive the Seven Sacraments of the Lord Jesus which fill our immortal souls with the divine grace of Almighty God. To refresh your memory, these seven sacraments are:

The Sacraments of Initiation

- **Baptism** the first Sacrament by which we are cleansed from the sin of humanity; by which we are filled with the divine life of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; and by which we are made members of the Lord's holy Catholic Church.
- **The Eucharist** which is our share in the Lord Jesus' Supper and the gift of divine life in the sacramental, Eucharistic Body and Blood of the Lord.
- **Confirmation** in which we accept and profess our Catholic Christian faith as young adults, and in which we receive the fullness of the Holy Spirit of God as did the Apostles and disciples on that first Pentecost Sunday in Jerusalem.



The Sacraments of Christian Life

Christian Marriage – which makes holy the union of a husband and wife in a sacramental bond and covenant, and which continues family life and the creative work of the Lord in bringing to life the next generation of the Lord's holy Church and of the human community.



Holy Orders – in which the Lord Jesus provides shepherds and servants for his Church by the ordination of bishops, priests, and deacons who exercise the ministries of the Lord among and for the People of God.



The Sacraments of Healing

Reconciliation – the sacred gift of forgiveness and healing which Jesus first shared with his Apostles on the night of his Resurrection (see the Gospel according to John 20), and by which bishops and priests - having the authority first granted to the Apostles extend forgiveness and the healing of souls to the members of the Lord's people.



Anointing of the Sick – the gift of the Lord's spiritual and physical healing - as well as the forgiveness of sins - offered to those who are ill, elderly, and dying through the imposition of the priest's hands and anointing with holy oil which is first recorded in the Letter of Saint James in the New Testament.



These seven sacred gifts of divine life – these seven Sacraments – have been celebrated and received by the Lord's holy people for twenty centuries. These seven Sacraments transform our earthly existence by making us disciples of Jesus and the very People of Almighty God. They continue to fill us with the Lord's goodness and life, and they are essential to our sharing in the eternal life and salvation of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. While there are Christian communities which only acknowledge the Sacrament of Baptism, the Catholic Church has always maintained and handed on all seven of these Sacraments as sacred gifts of God given to us by the Lord Jesus for our eternal salvation.

Those living in the City of Pittsburgh can qualify for a supplement of up to an extra \$500. Don't miss your chance to avail yourself of this program, because you never know when you may need a little extra money in an emergency.

EITC TAX CREDIT PROGRAM




