



Humility and the Seven Holy Virtues

What a wonderful society and world we would have if all Catholic Christians (*and in fact, all people*) would pursue the Seven Holy Virtues in our daily living!

We don't hear about the virtues (and leading a virtuous life) as often as we need to hear about them.

As a reminder, the Seven Holy Virtues are: Humility, Generosity, Kindness, Patience, Chastity, Temperance, Diligence.

The virtues give us a truly holy and Christian way of life which is the opposite of the ways of darkness, sin, and death known as the Seven Deadly Sins: Pride, Greed, Wrath, Envy, Gluttony, Lust, and Sloth.

Virtues are the good habits which lead to a good life; vices are the bad habits which lead to darkness, sadness, and destruction.

All of the holy virtues are important in our Christian discipleship and living, and today in the Gospel according to Mark, Jesus gives clear emphasis to the virtue of humility.

The word "humility" comes from the Latin root word "humus" which is the ancient word for "soil" or "dirt." Since ancient days, to be "humble" has meant to be "close to the ground," to be "lowly." To be "humble" still means the opposite of being inflated (*by ourselves or by others*) or being conceited or being self-important.

As Catholic Christians, we give all honor and glory to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We don't claim glory and honor for ourselves. Rather, faithful Christians seek to live in the Lord and serve the Lord without any fanfare or public notice. Again, all glory and all honor should be given only to God!

This was an important lesson taught by Jesus to the twelve apostles in today's Gospel account. It's also a lesson which all of us do well to learn and to make a constant priority in our lives.

When we're young, we look for recognition and affirmation. Being noticed and commended as youngsters gives us a sense of identity, importance, and self-worth. Hopefully, by the time we're adults, we're secure in our sense of self - and of our goodness. Hopefully, as adults, we aren't insecure and in need of attention and adulation.

May our personal self-esteem and security come from knowing that the Lord has chosen us to be His people – and that the Lord loves us and promises us eternal life. In response, may we give all glory and honor to the Lord, and may we be men and women who live in the humility to which Jesus calls us all!

May everyone - all of our parish members and families - enjoy very good days and weeks as we com to the months of autumn. May this continue to be a good time of service, celebration, prayer, and renewal. Finally, may the Lord Jesus keep you and your family members and friends healthy, holy, and always at peace. Depart Ascension Church at 7:00AM aboard a highway coach for Canton, Ohio. A breakfast stop will be made en route. Later this morning arrive at Saint Raphael Center & Mother Angelica Museum. In 1981, Mother Angelica, a cloistered Franciscan nun, launched what has become the largest religious media network in the world; Eternal Word Television Network. EWTN now reaches 264 million homes in 145 countries and over 700 million homes with AM, FM, shortwave radio and internet. It all began in 1923 in a small home in the southeast end of Canton, Ohio. Born Rita A. Rizzo, the future Mother Angelica, grew up in a working-class neighborhood during the Roaring Twenties a block away from her parish church. Young Rita had a difficult childhood. Her father abandoned the family before Rita was five years old. Divorce soon followed. Life was a struggle for Rita and her mother. Rita's years of trial were compounded by a debilitating stomach ailment until she was healed by Jesus through a woman named Rhoda Wise. That healing set her life on a course that would ultimately change the world. Come and see where it all began. Our visit will include a guided tour of the complex followed by the celebration of Mass in Mary, Ark of the Covenant Chapel. Enjoy a delicious catered lunch followed by free time to explore the Lourdes Grotto, Rosary Garden and Gift Store. This afternoon visit the Rhoda Wise House & Grotto. Born in 1888 in Cadiz, Ohio and raised in Wheeling, WV, Rhoda converted to the Catholic Church while in Mercy Hospital. Over time she developed a strong devotion to the Rosary and St. Therese the Little Flower. Rhoda Wise would later experience apparitions of Our Lord and St. Therese. On October 7, 2016, Rhoda Wise's Cause for Canonization opened in the Diocese of Youngstown. Enjoy time here to visit the home and pray at the grotto. A special "sweet stop" will be made before we embark on our journey home. Arrive back home approximately 8:00PM. A brief dinner stop will be made en route home.





Our Saint Philip Ladies of Charity met on Thursday, October 12, 2023. At the meeting, officers from the National Board and Diocesan Ladies of Charity shared some history of the Ladies of Charity in the United States and information regarding establishing a Ladies of Charity at Saint Philip Parish. After some discussion a nominating committee was formed to suggest officers for the Saint Philip Ladies of Charity Association.



The Ladies of Charity are part of the Vincentian Family which has served Saint Philip Parish for over 100 years. The family story begins with a Sunday sermon in 1617 given by St. Vincent de Paul (1591-1660), a priest at the small parish of Chatillon-les-Dombes in the Diocese of Lyons, France. Fifty women were so moved by the dire needs of their neighbor and by Vincent's stirring words that, after church together, they provided for the family in need. Afterward Vincent said, "These good people are exercising great charity, but it is not well regulated. This poor family will have too many provisions at one time and some of them will be spoiled and wasted; in a short time these persons will be reduced to their former state of need. Would it not be possible to convince these good women to give themselves to God to serve the poor permanently?" These ladies living in the 17th century said, "Yes," to the call of St. Vincent de Paul. Following the women's collective "magnificat," Vincent dePaul was nominated for sainthood, and the Ladies of Charity began their 400 years of service to the needy.

During this past year of their formation, the Saint Philip Ladies of Charity made gift bags for the Little Sisters of the Poor residents, helped with the First Eucharist Retreat, provided a reception for the Candidates to the Permanent Diaconte, and assisted with efforts of Saint Vincent de Paul and the needs of our parish community.

The Ladies of Charity of Saint Philip Parish will meet on **Thursday, October 10 at 7:00pm** in Ascension Church Conner Hall. Please consider joining them and growing the seeds planted by the Seton Hill Sisters of Charity in Saint Philip Parish community over 100 years ago. ADVANCE PLANNING

We're all encouraged, as Catholic Christians, to make advance plans for our departure from this present life when we begin our journey home to the Lord. Like our parents, grandparents, and many generations before us, it's good to make our personal and family plans for our funeral and burial in a cemetery. Yes, of course, this can be unnerving when we begin the process, but it's a true kindness to our family members if and when we put all of our plans, requests, finances, and estate in order long before our final day.

Thankfully, we have very fine attorneys, funeral directors, and other professionals in our local community who are more than willing to guide you through the planning process. You'll find them among our bulletin advertisers. We're also fortunate to have numerous Catholic and community cemeteries whose staff members are very helpful. In addition, the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh also offers the Catholic Funeral Plan (CFP, telephone 1-877-886-PLAN) in conjunction with the Catholic Cemeteries Association of Pittsburgh ((CCA) and trustworthy insurance providers to create funding arrangements now so that all your plans can be set and funded long in advance of being needed.

For our part, how can Saint Philip Parish's staff help you? In response to requests from parish members, we're willing to send our Funeral Planning Booklet and Funeral Selection Forms to any parish members who request them in advance.

If you're making Advanced Funeral Plans now or in the coming years, there's no need to wait until later to plan a Funeral Liturgy. You're welcome to request these funeral planning items and then include your selections in your planning file – keeping one copy with your family and giving one copy to your chosen funeral director.




