

Greetings once again, and best wishes for the New Church Year 2025 - our Jubilee Holy Year! I hope you'll enjoy all the coming holidays, and along with your observances and celebrations, I hope you'll take time for prayer, for some hibernation, and for your family!

Celebrating the new Catholic Year 2025

During these weeks of the Advent Season, we hear both of an end – and a beginning. This weekend, as we turn to the Gospel according to Luke, the reading for this First Sunday of Advent presents to us Jesus' caution to remain watchful for His return in glory to complete the Kingdom of God on the earth. Throughout the Advent Season, we will be reminded time and time again in the Bible readings that we should keep in mind both the end of our own days and the culmination of the Lord Jesus' mission to humanity.

During these same weeks, we will hear from Saint John the Baptizer who – for 2000 years and even now – directs our attention and our faith toward Jesus of Nazareth, Jesus the Lord, whose ministry John initiated by baptizing Jesus in the Jordan River. Likewise, the later days of Advent will recall and proclaim the first coming of Jesus into the world through His being born of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

These six weeks of the Advent Season and the Season of Christmas are a wonderful beginning of the new Church Year which starts annually on the First Sunday of Advent. Advent directs our faith and our hope toward the end of Jesus' mission as well as the beginning of Jesus' life and public ministry.

Throughout every new Church Year, we recall and celebrate the entirety of our Catholic Christian faith in a 365 day annual cycle of faith and liturgy and life. With each new year, we hopefully grow deeper and deeper in our appreciation of Jesus' Good News - and of all the beliefs and events, witnesses, and heroes of Christianity.

This new Catholic Year - like all previous Catholic years - is highlighted by our remembrance and celebration of the Lord Jesus' birth as well as our joyful celebration of the Lord Jesus' Resurrection in what we call "the Easter Season" in the spring. Both of these most important events receive their own weeks of preparation and their weeks of celebration.

The holy seasons of Advent and Christmas and Lent and Easter are the highlight of every Catholic Year. Then the remaining days and weeks of each year call to mind the full list of events and teachings in the life of Jesus and His mother Mary – as well as many of the saints, holy ones, and heroes of the Church's history.

My hope is that this beginning of the new Catholic Year 2025 will bring joy and anticipation to your soul and your life. During the next 365 days, we will indeed celebrate the entirety of our holy faith, and we will remember and relive all that is important in the birth, life, death, and Resurrection of the Lord Jesus.

In a very particular way, this new Catholic Year will also be the holiest year of the past quarter century as we observe and celebrate the Holy Year of Jubilee 2025 – and the 2025th Anniversary of the Birth of the Lord Jesus.

As we begin this new Catholic Year, may it be a year of divine grace, mercy and charity for you – as well as a year of renewed faith and hope in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit! May every season and every day of this Catholic Holy Year draw you closer to Jesus as we celebrate him and all that he accomplished for each of us and for humanity. Finally, may you and your family enjoy the 365 days of Christian faith and life which begin today, and may the Jubilee Year 2025 ahead be blessed for you in every way!

December 9 will be a Holy Day of Obligation this year!

Last month, all the bishops of the Catholic Church were sent a clarification from the offices of the Vatican. A new decree by the Holy See will now change our past practices.

Regarding the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, this year's celebration has been transferred (*as usual*) to Monday, December 9 because December 8 is a Sunday - the Lord's Day - this year. In the past, the Obligation to celebrate the Holy Day was set aside when a Solemnity was transferred to another day.

However, beginning this year, the Vatican decree states that now the Obligation to worship will be observed on Monday, December 9.

As such, our Liturgies for the Holy Day of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (our own nation's Holy Day) will be celebrated at:

8:00am Saint Philip church4:00pm Saint Philip church7:00pm Ascension church

Thank you for planning to join us for the December 9 Immaculate Conception Holy Day. How this decree of the Vatican might affect other Holy Days in the months and years ahead remains to be seen.



"Oplatki" will be available in the coming days once they're received in the parish office. The donation for each packet is \$3.00.





The bishop especially encourages everyone who's been away from Confession for a number of years to celebrate this healing sacrament on the evening of December 11.





JUST WHAT IS CHIMBOTE?





Chimbote (pronounced "chim-bo-tay") is a city on the northwest coast of Peru (directly south of Pittsburgh) where a Catholic maternity hospital and medical clinic have been funded by Catholics of Pittsburgh for nearly 60 years. In 1965, Bishop John Wright sent several Pittsburgh priests to South America to locate a poor community that our Diocese could adopt as a sister church. The priests landed in the fishing town of Chimbote, Peru, and the mission began then and has flourished for nearly 60 years.

In these six decades, supported by Catholics of our Diocese, the maternity hospital has delivered 100,000+ babies. Moms, dads, and infants have been given excellent care. The medical clinic gives free treatment to thousands of needy residents each week. Also, a medical outreach program provides in-home visits and care for many poor families living in the barrios of Chimbote.


