

Notes from the Pastor

Welcome to our celebration of the Lord's Day this Sunday as we continue our Jubilee Holy Year 2025!

We're all about mercy and forgiveness

In ten days, on Ash Wednesday, March 5, we will begin our annual Season of Forgiveness and Reconciliation - the Holy Season of Lent! As you know, Lent is the old English word which indicates that the davlight is "lengthening" as we approach the new life of Spring. In other languages, the Holy Season before Easter is referred to as the "Forty Days." Even though our ancestors in the English language did things in their own way, the practice and the purpose of the Season of Lent are still the same for all of us. It's the time to prepare for our celebration of the Lord's Resurrection by observing a Season of Forgiveness.

Today's Reading from the Gospel according to Luke is an inspiring message from Jesus recorded in Luke's "Sermon on the Plain" (*see Luke 6:20-49*). In twelve verses today, Jesus gives us the wonderful message that He will share divine forgiveness with us. That is a promise that may not mean much to many people today. However, for many of Jesus' disciples still participating in the Church today, the promise and the gift of forgiveness are extremely important in their discipleship and daily living – both sacramentally and personally.

At the same time, Jesus calls each of us and all of us to imitate the forgiveness of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit in our own lives, families, relationships, and communities. We are called as Catholic Christians to forgive if we ourselves ask the Lord's forgiveness.

Years ago, a veteran priest told me that many people make holding grudges their favorite pastime. All too many of the Lord's disciples brood over injuries and offenses done to them. Too many Christians remain angry toward family members and neighbors and refuse to be forgiving. Sadly, this leads to hardening of a person's heart and a great deal of unfortunate anger and sadness. Instead, we're called to forgive as we ourselves are forgiven by the Lord!

One reminder that I like to share is that, if the Lord has and continues to forgive all our sins and faults which we confess, then the least that we can do is forgive others as Jesus forgives us. Each of us sins and hurts others. That's true of others, and it's true of each one of us as well. Hurting and offending others is an unfortunate element of our imperfect, sinful human condition. As such, if we expect to be forgiven, then as Catholic Christians, we should truly be forgiving ourselves.

In ten days, we begin the Lenten Season of Forgiveness. Be sure to call upon the Lord's forgiveness in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and be sure to forgive your family members, relatives, friends, and neighbors (*and all people*) as Jesus calls us to do every day!

Best wishes for this Holy Year 2025!

May this Jubilee Holy Year of 2025 be a blessed time of hope, gratitude, service, prayer, and reading the Word of God in the Bible! May the Lord Jesus fill you and your family members and friends with peace, health, holiness, and divine goodness. God bless!







ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

We often report (including today) that a friend in need received a clothing voucher and/or a household goods voucher, but what are those things and where do the items come from?

Many of you know that the St. Vincent de Paul Central Council of Pittsburgh operates thrift stores, and you may have even donated by placing items in their blue bins (in front of the Hope House and behind the Ascension worship site) or by dropping donations off at one of the thrift stores. There are stores in Coraopolis, Castle Shannon, Monroeville, Penn Hills and Butler. These stores not only provide employment opportunities and low-cost items for sale, but they also supply our friends in need with free items!

When we meet new friends in need, we often find that they are lacking in clothing and/or basic household goods like pots, pans, silverware, towels or sheets. We are able to fulfill these needs by ordering a clothing voucher and a household goods voucher. A clothing voucher entitles the recipient, and everyone in their household, to obtain three free outfits from a St. Vincent de Paul thrift store. There is no cost to the conference for a clothing voucher.

A household goods voucher allows a friend in need to obtain a certain dollar amount (usually \$50) of items from one of the thrift stores for free. The referring conference pays for the value of the goods that the friend in need "purchases," but our money goes much further by allowing the friend in need to purchase gently used items from our thrift stores than it would if we had to purchase new items.

In order to help the thrift stores to be able to continue the clothing and household goods voucher programs, you can shop at one of the thrift stores or make a donation of new or gently used clothing or household goods. Clothing, shoes and accessories (purses, scarves, etc.) can be placed in the blue bins in front of the Hope House and behind the Ascension worship site, or donated directly to one of the thrift stores. If the blue bins are full, please do not place your donations on the sidewalk or in the parking lot, as any donations left outside of the blue bins must be thrown away regardless of their condition. Household goods like pots, pans, lamps and towels must be donated at one of the thrift stores (they cannot go in the blue bins). 
