Notes from the **Pastor**

Welcome to our celebration of the Lord's Day this Sunday as we continue to observe the Season of Lent during our Jubilee Holy Year 2025!

It is good, Lord, that we are here!

In these first Sundays of Lent, we hear of some remarkable events in the life and ministry of Jesus. Last Sunday, we heard the account of the temptations visited upon Jesus by Satan temptations which Jesus turned aside just as we should shield ourselves from the many temptations that afflict us in these modern times.

This Sunday, we hear once again of the amazing manifestation of Jesus' divine glory that He shared with Peter, James, and John on Mount Tabor prior to their arrival in Jerusalem for Jesus' final days. This manifestation which we call the "Transfiguration" hopefully assures us that Jesus is the Son of God and our Lord. Hopefully the Transfiguration also strengthens our faith in Jesus just as it bolstered the faith of the Apostles in their time and lives.

In addition to these two remarkable events, this Season of Lent reminds us to deepen our faith and our lives in the Lord Jesus. We are indeed the Lord's people thanks to our faith, our the Eucharist Baptism, and the other Sacraments, our prayer and worship, as well as our discipleship and our Christian service. Yet we are called to deepen and to strengthen our life in Christ Jesus each day and every year.

During Lent (and during the Easter Season, and in fact, throughout the entire year), we're called to increase our life in the Lord through prayer, penance, and charity.

Prayer deepens our communion with God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Prayer is NOT only making requests of the Lord. Prayer is also listening to the Holy Spirit in silence and meditation. Prayer is also reading the Word of God in the Bible and allowing God's Word to speak to our hearts. Prayer is also thanking, praising, and giving glory to God in gratitude for the life, Good News, and divine grace that are given to us.

Penance is an important way to discipline ourselves and to make real our contrition for the sins we have committed. Penance, fasting, and self-sacrifice are important elements of the self-discipline which makes our stronger in our Christian discipleship and in our faithfulness to the Lord.

Finally, acts of charity deepen our life in Christ by our imitating the love and charity of Almighty God in real and helpful ways. Just as God is truly generous and charitable to all of us, so too are we called to live just like the Lord Iesus by being generous and good to others especially those who are truly poor and in need of our help and support.

As we make our way through Lent, may we increase our discipleship during each week of this season. May we also continue this effort during the Easter Season and all throughout the year. Now and until we are joined with the company of all the Lord's Holy Ones - his Saints - in the eternal life and Kingdom of God, we're called to deepen our life in Christ Jesus each and every day!

REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: Here we are on the Second Sunday of Lent. We are invited to make this Lent one of the best experiences of drawing closer to the Lord Jesus. At Saint Philip Parish, our theme this year is Accompanying Jesus. Each Friday in Lent, we are offered the opportunity to pray the traditional Stations of the Cross at 8:30am in Saint Philip church and 7:00pm in Ascension church.

In the book, Station to Station, author Gary Jansen notes that in 1991, Pope John Paul II, wanting to give believers an alternative set of stations upon which to pray and meditate, proposed a new list based solely on events described in the New Testament. Our theme this year is based upon these Scriptural Stations which are:

FIRST STATION: Jesus Prays in the Garden of Gethsemane. **SECOND STATION:** Jesus is betrayed by Judas, is arrested. **THIRD STATION:** Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin.

FOURTH STATION: Jesus is denied by Peter. **FIFTH STATION:** Jesus is judged by Pilate.

SIXTH STATION: Jesus is scourged and crowned with

thorns.

SEVENTH STATION: Jesus bears His cross.

EIGHTH STATION: Jesus is helped by Simon of Cyrene to

carry His cross.

NINTH STATION: Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.

TENTH STATION: Jesus is crucified.

ELEVENTH STATION: Jesus promises His Kingdom to the


good thief.

TWELVE STATION: Jesus speaks to His mother and the

disciple.

THIRTEENTH STATION: Jesus dies on the Cross. **FOURTEENTH STATION:** Jesus is placed in the tomb.

As we pray these Stations, we see how Jesus reacts in each situation and as we accompany Him, we can learn how to be greater disciples throughout the situations in our lives.



The Feast of Saint Joseph March 19

The month of March is traditionally dedicated to Saint Joseph, a model of faith, obedience, and humility. He is the patron saint of fathers, workers, and immigrants. He is also invoked as a patron for the Universal Church, the dying, and social justice.

Saint Joseph's traditional colors are red and gold. He often carries a white lily to symbolize his protection of Mary. We usually see images of him with carpentry tools.

Our Soup, Salad and Speaker Series will further reflect upon Jesus' responses through the journey of the Stations and show us how to respond to trouble, pain, suffering, hurts and hope in the Ressurection.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

The Dollar Energy Fund, which was previously only open to people whose service had been terminated or who were facing a shutoff, is now open to anyone, regardless of whether your account is delinquent. You just need to have a minimum account balance of \$100.

In order to qualify for a Dollar Energy grant, you must meet certain income guidelines (\$2,608/month for a household of one: \$3,525/month for a household of two: \$4,442/month for a household of three; \$5,358/month for a household of four) and you must have made at least one good-faith payment of \$150 (\$100 if you are age 62 or older) or three CAP payments within the last 90 days. The maximum grant amount is \$600.

To find out if you qualify and to apply, you must go through one of Dollar Energy's partner agencies. Two local options are the Holy Family Institute located at 19 May Avenue in McKees Rocks, and the Salvation Army located at 39 W. Main Street in Carnegie. The Holy Family Institute's phone number is 412-331-8665, and the Salvation Army's phone number is 412-276-4757.
