

### **Notes** from the **Pastor**

Welcome to our celebration of the Lord's Day this Sunday as we continue the Season of Lent during our Jubilee Holy Year 2025!

Mercy first, last and always

Have you ever wanted to see someone else hurt? Have you ever wished harm to another person? Do you - does any Christian - think that's what Jesus wants of us?

I don't know why, but some people really like to see other people punished. In fact, some people really enjoy punishing others their spouse, their children, their relatives, their co-workers, and their neighbors. I'm NOT certain why that is the case, but I've seen it often in my own experiences with individuals.

Those people who like being punishers might feel that they are simply doing the work of the Lord. Some have anger issues and are looking to hurt others. Some want to retaliate for the hurt they've experienced. Others are simply troubled mentally and have developed something of a sadistic nature.

However, in the Gospel according to John today, we hear once again that Jesus - the very Son of Almighty God - does NOT want to punish. Nor does Jesus want us to harshly or unfairly inflict punishment. Those who were ready to stone to death the woman caught in adultery felt that they were doing the work of God, but in truth, they were actually satisfying their own lust for blood.

Jesus rejects such deranged bloodlust, and He shows us very clearly that Almighty God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit desires

repentance, conversion, and new life rather than brutality, harsh punishment, and death.

Thank goodness that Jesus promises us mercy and forgiveness. Thank goodness that Jesus gives us Divine Mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Truly, if the Lord punished us as the crowd in today's Gospel wanted to punish the sinner whom they brought to Jesus, would there be many Christians left alive?

As Jesus forgave in His own day, and as He forgives us today - especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, may we too be merciful and forgiving toward our spouses, our children and their spouses, our grandchildren, family, relatives, co-workers, neighbors, and in fact, everyone - today and every day!

Best wishes for a blessed Season of Lent

May the Season of Lent and this Jubilee Holy **Year of 2025** be a blessed time of hope, gratitude, service, prayer, forgiveness and reconciliation! May the Lord Jesus fill you and your family members and friends with peace, health, holiness, and divine goodness. God bless!

Before celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation/Confession, it's important to conduct a personal examination of conscience in order to offer a complete confession.

### "You shall love the Lord with all your heart, all your mind, and all your soul!"

- Is God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit of greatest importance in your life?
- Do you spend time in prayer each day?
- Do you offer thanks and praise to God each day?
- Do you give higher priority to your work, recreation, or possessions?
- Do you speak respectfully of the Lord at all times?
- Do you respect the name of God, and especially of Jesus, at all times?
- Have you missed church worship on any Sunday or any Holy Day?
- Do you keep Sunday as the day of the Lord and a day of prayer?

### "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

- Are you a person of love as Jesus commands us to be?
- Do you treat your parents, other adults, and all people with respect?
- Do you speak of family members, friends, neighbors, and strangers with charity?
- Have you taken the life of a human person or harmed someone?
- Have you ended or helped to end the life of a pre-born child?
- Have you mistreated or harmed other life?
- Have you broken your marriage commitment or intruded on another's marriage?
- Have you engaged in marital relations before or outside of married life?
- Have you used pharmaceuticals, prophylactics, or surgery to prevent conception?
- Have you made use of pornography or engaged in self-abuse?
- Have you engaged in theft of another's property or money?
- Have you damaged the property of someone else?
- Have you abused or damaged the natural resources of the earth?
- Have you told lies about other people? Have you lied about other matters?
- Have you spoken poorly of others or treated others with little or no respect?
- Have you spoken profanity or curses or sacrilege or blasphemy?
- Are you judgmental or critical of others without cause?
- Do you hold grudges and refuse to forgive family members or others?
- Are you envious and jealous of others, their families, or their possessions?
- Do you appreciate and give thanks for your own blessings?
- Do you share your blessings and possessions with others? With the Church?

An Act of Contrition - Lord God, I am sorry for all my sins. In choosing to do wrong, and failing to do good, I have offended you, whom I should love above all else. With the help of your grace, I promise to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Our Savior, Jesus Christ, suffered and died for our sins. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.



### — A Memorial Opportunity — **NEW shrine candles in Saint Philip church**

This month, in Saint Philip church, our parish will replace the shrine candles located on the side altars dedicated to the Blessed Mother and to Saint Joseph. Most of the shrine candles on those altars were broken in recent decades, and so, as we continue to refurbish the small items of Saint Philip church, those shrine candles will finally be replaced.

This purchase of 36 shrine candles presents a new Jubilee Year opportunity for our parish members to contribute a memorial donation for these NEW shrine candles - and to add an inscription to one or more candles. We are purchasing 24 BLUE shrine candles for the Blessed Mother's altar - and 12 FROSTED shrine candles for the Saint Joseph altar.

Since each candle base and glass container costs \$200, a memorial donation of \$200 will fund one candle (the base and the glass candle container) on which we will place a printed label (for example, "In memory of...", "From the \_\_\_\_\_ family...", "In thanksgiving for / from...", etc.).

**REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN:** In the first reading for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we hear: "Thus, says the Lord...Remember not the events of the past, the things of long ago consider not; see, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? In the desert I make a way." In this time of Lent, we try to turn our hearts from our old way of doing things. We try, in this time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving, to become more aware of our relationship with God. However, we are not in this alone. God desires a relationship with each one of us. If we surrender our hearts, we can discover that God is doing something new in our life. In the desert of loneliness, sickness, broken relationships, disappointments, frustrations, unmet expectations, financial burdens, and loss, God is making a way! In the expectation and joy of Easter, God is bringing something new into the desert of our lives.

So, in these final days and weeks of Lent and throughout Holy Week, let us especially prepare our hearts to recognize and receive the "New" that God has planned for us. Let us think about doing something extra, something that we have not done thus far. Let us spend extra time in prayer. Let us pray the Stations of the Cross. Let us attend daily Mass. Let us participate in Holy Week Services on Holy Thursday or Good Friday. Let us give of our time and treasure to the Saint Vincent de Paul Society. Let us call or visit a relative we have not seen in a while. Let us do something nice for our elderly relatives. Let us be on guard to recognize, welcome and receive the something "New" that God has planned for us. Let us trust that in all things and in all circumstances, God is making a way in the desert of our lives. Then at Easter, filled with Paschal Joy, we will be ready to embrace the New Life in Christ planned for us.

### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

If you read our weekly column, you know how many neighbors in need reach out for assistance with their Duquesne Light bill. We always encourage them to sign up for the Duquesne Light Customer Assistance Program, or CAP, which provides year-round savings for eligible households who take advantage of the program. In order to qualify for CAP, monthly household income for a household of one must be at or below \$1,956; \$2,644 for a household of two; \$3,331 for a household of three; and \$4,019 for a household of four (and there are higher limits for even larger households).

Qualifying households are billed based on their income and household size, not their electric usage. If you heat your house with electricity, you may qualify for a payment as low as \$40/month. If you do not heat your house with electricity, you may qualify for a payment as low as \$20/month. CAP can also be a big help to customers who enter into the program with a delinquent account balance. That balance will be forgiven over 24 months as you make your monthly CAP payments on-time. However, please note that you do not need to have a delinquent account balance in order to join the CAP program - all that you need to do is meet the income eligibility criteria.


