



Welcome to our celebration of the Lord's Day this Palm Sunday as we begin Holy Week during our Jubilee Holy Year 2025!

Commemorating Palm Sunday and Holy Week

For the past 37 days, we've been observing the Holy Season of Lent during which we've made progress in our life of holiness, penance, prayer, and charity on our individual and community journey toward a deeper life in the Lord Jesus – and toward our eventual sainthood. I truly hope that each of us – and all of us – have benefitted from a good Season of Lent.

Now, we come to our commemoration of Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion when we remember Jesus' welcome and entry into the holy city of Jerusalem as well as His arrest, trial, suffering, and death on the cross. Please accept my best wishes for a prayerful Holy Week and a joyful Easter Sunday celebration and Easter Season! Please be sure to join us for the Liturgies and services of this week - as well as for our Liturgies at the great Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday. Also, please consider celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation this week OR during the coming Easter Season. May God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit bless you, your family, and our parish community with renewed faith - and faithfulness - this Holy Week and throughout the glorious Easter Season!

- Do you treat your parents, other adults, and all people with respect?
- Do you speak of family members, friends, neighbors, and strangers with charity?
- Have you taken the life of a human person or harmed someone?

- Have you mistreated or harmed other life?
- Have you broken your marriage commitment or intruded on another's marriage?
- Have you engaged in marital relations before or outside of married life?
- Have you used pharmaceuticals, prophylactics, or surgery to prevent conception?
- Have you made use of pornography or engaged in self-abuse?
- Have you engaged in theft of another's property or money?
- Have you damaged the property of someone else?
- Have you abused or damaged the natural resources of the earth?
- Have you told lies about other people? Have you lied about other matters?
- Have you spoken poorly of others or treated others with little or no respect?
- Have you spoken profanity or curses or sacrilege or blasphemy?
- Are you judgmental or critical of others without cause?
- Do you hold grudges and refuse to forgive family members or others?
- Are you envious and jealous of others, their families, or their possessions?
- Do you appreciate and give thanks for your own blessings?
- Do you share your blessings and possessions with others? With the Church?

An Act of Contrition - Lord God, I am sorry for all my sins. In choosing to do wrong, and failing to do good, I have offended you, whom I should love above all else. With the help of your grace, I promise to confess my sins, to do penance, and to amend my life. Our Savior, Jesus Christ, suffered and died for our sins. In his name, my God, have mercy. **Amen**.



— A Memorial Opportunity — NEW shrine candles in Saint Philip church

This month, in Saint Philip church, our parish will replace the shrine candles located on the side altars dedicated to the Blessed Mother and to Saint Joseph. Most of the shrine candles on those altars were broken in recent decades, and so, as we continue to refurbish the small items of Saint Philip church, those shrine candles will finally be replaced.

This purchase of 36 shrine candles presents a new Jubilee Year opportunity for our parish members to contribute a memorial donation for these NEW shrine candles – and to add an inscription to one or more candles. We are purchasing 24 BLUE shrine candles for the Blessed Mother's altar – and 12 FROSTED shrine candles for the Saint Joseph altar.

Since each candle base and glass container costs \$200, a memorial donation of \$200 will fund one candle (*the base and the glass candle container*) on which we will place a printed label (*for example, "In memory of...", "From the _____ family...", "In thanksgiving for / from...", etc.*).



REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: As we begin Holy Week, we take a look at <u>5 Things with Father Bill</u>, by William Byrne. *"Holy Week is a power punch of grace. Starting with Palm Sunday and moving through Holy Thursday and Good Friday to Easter, each step is filled with signs and symbols that explain how deeply we are loved by God."* Here are 5 ways to make every week a Holy Week:

1. "Hosanna to the Son of David." We hear this line from Matthew 21:9 on Palm Sunday. The crowds shout this when Jesus enters Jerusalem. A few days later they turn and we



hear, "Crucify Him!" Their fickle nature should ring a bell. How is it that we can sometimes be so kind and other times be petty, jealous, gossipy, and grudge holding? We are made for love, yet often we choose otherwise. Pick the most persistent struggle, the thing you say sorry for the most, and decide to leave it at the foot of the Cross. Then start working to build up the opposite blessing. For example, if you are critical from time to time, start working on noticing and commenting on the good in others.

- **2. Washing of the feet.** On Holy Thursday, Jesus gives His church the priesthood, and He explains to His apostles how they are to lead through service. This model should be the basis for all we do. It's not just priests who are ordained to serve, but all the baptized are to do so as well. In essence, we have been baptized to be inconvenienced. Go the extra mile: volunteer to help a homebound friend walk her dog, stop and talk to the neighbor even when you are feeling busy. Each inconvenience is a way for us to wash Jesus' feet this time.
- **3. Take this, all of you.** With these words, Jesus gives us the Eucharist. On the Cross, Jesus offers Himself as a sacrifice for our sins. He gives us the Liturgy so that we can participate in His victory without having to die on the Cross ourselves. Our gifts placed on the altar become His gift to all humanity. He is truly present in body, blood, soul, and divinity. Try extra hard to be conscious of the great mystery and the gift we receive.
- **4. Easter Fire.** The Great Easter Vigil, the first Liturgy of Easter, begins with the lighting of the paschal fire. From it we light the paschal candle. The fire reminds us of God's generous initiative in creating us and His overwhelming mercy of recreating us after we have sinned. Jesus is the light of the world. This year we should try to shine His light to the world. Light and snarky comments don't go together. Greet people with a kind smile and avoid commenting to others when they don't treat you the same way.
- **5. Holy Water.** At the Easter Liturgies we renounce sin, renew our baptismal promises, and are sprinkled with holy water. We recall our Baptism so that we can remember that it is this moment where we

became part of Christ for all eternity. Each time we enter church, we bless ourselves with holy water again. As we make the Sign of the Cross, we usually are looking for our seats while simultaneously checking out who is also at Liturgy. Try to be conscious in that moment that you are renewing your Baptism. Quickly renounce Satan and sin, and with a smile say, "I believe."

To begin the great Easter Vigil each year, we first welcome the new light of the Lord's Resurrection by blessing the Easter Fire and then lighting the Easter Candle (the 'Paschal Candle'). Once the Paschal Candle is processed into the sanctuary, the Exsultet (the Easter Song of Praise) is then sung either by the clergy or cantors, choir, and assembly. Today, many parishes employ a more modern version of the Exsultet so that everyone can easily participate. However, so that you might read and know this beautiful, traditional Easter Proclamation, we present the complete Exsultet:

Exult, let them exult, the hosts of heaven, exult, let Angel ministers of God exult, let the trumpet of salvation sound aloud our mighty King's triumph! Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness.

Rejoice, let Mother Church also rejoice, arrayed with the lightning of His glory, let this holy building shake with joy, filled with the mighty voices of the peoples.

Therefore, dearest friends, standing in the awesome glory of this holy light, invoke with me, I ask you, the mercy of God almighty, that He, who has been pleased to number me, though unworthy, among the Levites, may pour into me His light unshadowed, that I may sing this candle's perfect praises.

It is truly right and just, with ardent love of mind and heart and with devoted service of our voice, to acclaim our God invisible, the almighty Father, and Jesus Christ, our Lord, His Son, His Only Begotten, Who for our sake paid Adam's debt to the eternal Father, and, pouring out His own dear Blood, wiped clean the record of our ancient sinfulness.

These, then, are the feasts of Passover, in which is slain the Lamb, the one true Lamb, whose Blood anoints the doorposts of believers.

This is the night, when once You led our forebears, Israel's children,

from slavery in Egypt and made them pass dry-shod through the Red Sea. + + + +

This is the night that with a pillar of fire banished the darkness of sin.

This is the night that even now, throughout the world, sets Christian believers apart from worldly vices and from the gloom of sin, leading them to grace and joining them to His holy ones.

This is the night when Christ broke the prison-bars of death, and rose victorious from the underworld.

O wonder of Your humble care for us!

O love, O charity beyond all telling, to ransom a slave You gave away Your Son! O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ! O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!

This is the night of which it is written: the night shall be as bright as day, dazzling is the night for me, and full of gladness.

The sanctifying power of this night dispels wickedness, washes faults away, restores innocence to the fallen, and joy to mourners, drives out hatred, fosters concord, and brings down the mighty.

On this, Your night of grace, O holy Father, accept this candle, a solemn offering, the work of bees and of Your servants' hands, an evening sacrifice of praise, this gift from Your most holy Church.

Therefore, O Lord, we pray You that this candle, hallowed to the honor of Your name, may persevere undimmed, to overcome the darkness of this night. Receive it as a pleasing fragrance, and let it mingle with the lights of heaven. May this flame be found still burning by the Morning Star; the one Morning Star who never sets, Christ Your Son, who, coming back from death's domain, has shed His peaceful light on humanity -- and lives forever and ever. Amen!

Full information and registration forms will be made available beginning Saturday evening, April 12, in both Saint Philip church and Ascension church. Be sure to join us!




