# **Notes** from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a joyful and blessed Pentecost Sunday during this Jubilee Holy Year!

Come, Holy Spirit, today and always!

Each year, at the conclusion of the Easter Season, we commemorate and celebrate the great event of Pentecost and the sending of the Holy Spirit of God into the individuals and life of Jesus' community, his Church. It was the Holy Spirit of God who inspired the Apostles to leave their hiding place and go into Jerusalem to proclaim Jesus. It was also the Holy Spirit which allowed all the peoples in Jerusalem to comprehend the Apostles' speech in their very own languages.

From that very first Pentecost Sunday ('Pentecost' being the Greek word meaning 'fiftieth', that is, the fiftieth day after Passover - and now Easter), the Holy Spirit of God - who is the Divine Love shared between the Father and the Son - has been with the Lord's disciples in the Church. From that first Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit of God has inspired faith in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit in billions of throughout Christians the past centuries. It is the Holy Spirit to whom we turn today as well to inspire Christian faith in each of us and in all those baptized in the Church.

Throughout these nearly 2,000 years, the Holy Spirit has given divine life to the New People of God. For nearly 2000 years, the Holy Spirit has guided and blessed our One, Holy,

Catholic, and Apostolic Church in every aspect of our life as the Lord's people.

First, the Spirit of the Lord brought about faith, hope, charity, and community among the first Christian disciples. Second, the Spirit directed the Apostles and disciples in their life, their tremendously mission, and important decisions as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles. Third, the Holy Spirit inspired the Church to grow and to share our faith through evangelization. Fourth, the Holy Spirit guided the Apostles, Saint Paul, and the other writers of the New Testament to record the events and teachings of Jesus' life along with their sacred and inspired writings. Fifth, from that first Pentecost, the Holy Spirit has brought about the sacraments of the Lord which share the very life and grace of God in these seven sacred gifts. Sixth, throughout these twenty centuries, the Spirit of God has guided the People of God - as well as the Church's wonderful faith in the teachings of our apostolic shepherds.

In every way, the Holy Spirit has shared the Lord's divine life and truth with all Jesus' disciples and with the entire Church! Without the Holy Spirit, there would be **NO** Christianity and NO Church. With the Holy Spirit, the Church and the world continue to receive Jesus' Good News - as well as the divine life of God, and our holy faith, and our promise and hope of Resurrection and eternal life!

As we celebrate Pentecost this Sunday, may we truly rejoice in the gift of the Lord's Holy **Spirit**. May we appreciate the Holy Spirit every day of our lives. May we call upon the Spirit in our daily prayers - inviting the Holy Spirit to inspire faith in us, in all our loved ones, and in all people! May the Spirit inspire our Catholic Christian faith in all people and lead us to salvation and glory in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit!

Our new Saint Philip shrine candles are currently on order from the Root Candle Company and should all be received in the coming 4-6 weeks.


While we wait for their arrival, all of our generous donors are most welcome to visit - or telephone - the parish office to review the memorial inscription which will be placed on the candle/s you donated.

**REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN:** As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, we can take a few moments to reflect upon Pope Francis' words on the action of the Holy Spirit in the Church and in our lives. In The Church of Mercy, Pope Francis notes the following:



"So how does the Holy Spirit act in our life and in the life of the Church in order to guide us to the Truth? First of all, The Holy Spirit recalls and impresses in the hearts of believers the words Jesus spoke and, through these very words, the law of God-as the prophets of the Old Testament had foretold-is engraved in our hearts and becomes within us a criterion for evaluation in decisions and for guidance in our daily actions. Ezekiel's great prophecy is brought about: 'A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you...And I will put my spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statues and be careful to observe my ordinances.' Indeed, it is in our inmost depths that our actions come into being; it is the heart itself that must be converted to God, and the Holy Spirit transforms it when we open ourselves to Him."

Let us ask ourselves: Am I open to the action of the Holy Spirit? Do I pray to Him to give me illumination, to make me more sensitive to God's things? This is a prayer we must pray every say: "Holy Spirit, make my heart open to the word of God, make my heart open to goodness, make my heart open to the beauty of God every day."

We need to let ourselves be bathed in the light of the Holy Spirit. We are not Christian "part time," only at certain moments. We are Christian all the time! May Christ's truth, which the Holy Spirit teaches us and gives to us, always and totally affect our daily life. Let us call on Him more often so that He may guide us on the path of disciples of Christ. Let us call on Him every day.



#### Prayer for Openness to the Holy Spirit's Work in Us

Lord our God, through the light of Your Holy Spirit You instruct the hearts of the faithful, Your sons and daughters. Grant that we may always be open to the Spirit working in our lives, that we may know and appreciate what is right and good, and so find happiness in Your presence. Help us to recognize the Spirit's invitation to service and respond with joy and eagerness. We ask this through Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.

# Our Christian faith in God

As you know, the name which our Northern European ancestors gave to the Divine Creator is the name "God" ('Gott' in German; 'Gud' in Scandinavian languages). The English name "God" comes from the same basic understanding that the One Creator is "Good." In Southern European languages, the name of the Almighty comes from the practice of speaking about the "Divinity" (in Latin, 'Deus'; in Italian 'Dio'; in Spanish 'Dios'; in French 'Dieu').

Speaking the name of Almighty God is quite common in our daily living and in our society. Many of us speak the name of God with great reverence, gratitude, and respect. Unfortunately, far too many people regularly speak the name of God with terrible disrespect and, yes, even animosity.

For most people who speak the name of God - whether reverently, or "in vain" as we traditionally say - there's a mistaken sense that all people have the very same understanding of the Divine God. Of course, if you spend some time learning about human history and human culture, you'll soon realize that NO, we don't all have the same understanding when we speak the holy name of God. There are many non-Christian concepts of God that are very much unlike our belief in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

As Catholic Christians, when we speak of profess our very specific we understanding of Almighty God as God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit - the understanding of God given to us by Jesus of Nazareth, Jesus the Christ, Jesus the Lord. Our belief in God as Trinity and our understanding of God as Trinity is exclusive to our Christian faith in the divine! This proclamation of God as Trinity is the belief that is at the heart of Christianity thanks entirely to Jesus.

Again, when many people speak the holy name of God, they have NO specific sense of what they mean. It's simply a name that's frequently spoken in our culture today. That's truly unfortunate because our Catholic Christian belief in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit means so much to us. Our belief in God as the Holy Trinity means everything to our Christian faith, to our Christian living, and to our Christian hope in the Resurrection and everlasting life. We believe that it's only the Holy Trinity who promises goodness and salvation to all of us who are the faithful people of God.

Our Christian understanding of God - the God of Jesus Christ - is such extraordinary gift from Jesus, from the New Testament writers, and from the earliest shepherds and teachers of the Catholic Church. Beginning with the revelation of Jesus, our ancestors in the Church worked for centuries to clearly explain and illuminate our belief in the Holy Trinity.
