

## CONGRATULATIONS **Bishop Mark A. Eckman**

13th Bishop of Pittsburgh

Along with all the parish communities, religious women and men, deacons and priests of our Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh, our parish also warmly congratulates our newly appointed Diocesan Bishop, the Most Reverend Mark Anthony Eckman, D.D.

Having served as an Auxiliary Bishop of Pittsburgh since 2022, Bishop Mark Eckman is a native of Saint Valentine Catholic Parish in Bethel Park. He studied in the Saint Valentine Parish School and well as South Hills (now Seton LaSalle) High School. In 1981, Bishop Eckman graduated from Duquesne University as well as Saint Paul Seminary on Noblestown Road. After participating in the Priestly Formation Program at Saint Vincent Seminary in Latrobe, Pa., our new Bishop was ordained to the priesthood in 1985.

Bishop Eckman has been a priest of our Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh for 40 years serving as a parochial vicar and a pastor for many years. He was pastor of Saint Sylvester Parish in Brentwood, as well as pastor of Saint Thomas More Parish in Bethel Park.

In recent years, Bishop Eckman assisted Bishop Zubik as the diocesan Director of Clergy Personnel for eight years, then as Secretary for Clergy and Religious, and most recently as General Secretary and Vicar General of the Diocese.

As Bishop Zubik enters into retirement at the age of 75, he will continue to reside here in the Diocese. Bishop Zubik lead and served our Catholic Diocese since September 2007 and is also native of Ambridge in Beaver County.

May the good Lord continue to bless both Bishop Mark Eckman and Bishop David Zubik now and in the years ahead, and may God bless our diocesan church as Bishop Eckman begins his ministry as our chief shepherd!

## **Notes** from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a joyful and blessed Holy Trinity Sunday during this Jubilee Holy Year!

**Celebrating Trinity Sunday** 

Every year, following Pentecost Sunday, we as Catholic Christians celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity - or simply, Trinity Sunday. This Sunday is an important day for celebrating the most fundamental belief in all of Christianity. Our belief in the Holy Trinity comes to us from the teachings of Jesus the Christ, and this belief was officially proclaimed by the Catholic Church in the early centuries of Christianity.

Along with this most important belief in the Holy and Divine Trinty, we also cherish our other fundamental Christian belief in the Incarnation of the Divine Son of God - as well as our belief in the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus following His death on the cross in Jerusalem. These three beliefs - the Divine Trinity, the Incarnation, and the Resurrection are the most important and basic beliefs of all Christians throughout the world.

For many centuries, theologians and writers have given expression to the many facets of our belief in the Divine Trinty. Ours is a magnificent faith in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Existing as the One Eternal God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit have brought about all creation (from the Father) and redemption (through Jesus), and the promise (in the Holy Spirit) to bring about our salvation. Actually, this is a fairly simple

belief, but it is a most profound understanding of the Divinity from which all things proceed and the Divinity in which we are all called to find our own eternal life.

Among all of the aspects of our belief in the Holy Trinity, one facet is truly important today. That aspect of our Trinitarian faith is that all life and existence are lived to the full only in a community of love. God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit have eternally shared life and love with each other. From their divine life and love they have shared life and love with all that exists - and with their most significant creation - humanity. Likewise, human life (like Divine life) is only lived to its fullest when it's lived in community and in love. This should be the highest priority for all of us as Catholic Christians - to live in a community of love with our family and our fellow disciples of Jesus.

May we all make holy this Trinity Sunday in our prayer and in the profession of our Catholic Christian faith! May we also dedicate ourselves to living like the Divine Trinity as Christians who live in a loving community with one another always!

Best wishes for this celebration of Holy Trinity Sunday!



Give them warm and open hearts to forgive failures. Provide them with the words needed for encouragement and perseverance. We ask all this in the name of Jesus.



REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: This Sunday we celebrate The Most Holy Trinity. Throughout his book, The Church of Mercy. Pope Francis speaks of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit in the following way: The light of faith is unique. A light this powerful cannot come from us but from a more primordial source; it must come from God. Faith is born of an encounter with the living God who [created us], calls us and reveals His love, a love that precedes us and upon which we can lean for security and for building our lives.



The grace of Jesus Christ saves us from sin. If we accept the grace of Jesus Christ, He changes our hearts and from sinners makes us saints. To become holy we do not need to turn our eyes away and look somewhere else, to become saints only one thing is necessary: to accept the grace that the Father gives us in Jesus Christ. This grace changes our hearts. To do this, let yourself be gazed upon by the Lord. Find a way best suited to you to be with the Lord.

Often, we follow God, we accept Him, but only up to a certain point. It is hard to abandon ourselves to Him with complete trust, allowing the Holy Spirit to be the soul and guide our lives in every decision. Whenever God reveals Himself, He brings newness - God always brings newness - and demands our complete trust. The Holy Spirit gives us the courage to strike out along the new path that God sets before us.



## Prayer to the Trinity:

Father, creator of all things, Jesus, redeemer of our sins and Spirit, love of the Father and of the Son, I offer You my daily work, my every action, my every breath. Grant that today and every day I may attend to You and, in all things, accomplish Your will. Amen.

# The Blessings of our own Baptism

Baptism has been a sacred religious ceremony for thousands of years, and for all Catholic Christians, it remains a sacred religious ceremony today as well. As we see in the ministry of Saint John the Baptist, Baptism was practiced among the people of Israel, and as we see in the Gospels and the early Church, Baptism is the first Ritual of Initiation for all those who are called to be disciples of Jesus and members of His holy Church.

As you know, *Baptism* (and the divine grace that it shares with us) lasts a lifetime. In fact, we believe that Baptisms marks us as God's people for all eternity, and in our prayers, we ask the Lord to renew and revitalize our Baptismal Grace throughout our lifetime.

#### There are three most important gifts which we receive in our Baptism. These gifts are:

- 1.) Our being cleansed from the sin of this world (Original
- 2.) Our receiving divine life (grace) in our souls and in our lives for the first time; and
- 3.) Our membership among the People of God in the Catholic Church.

All of these gifts are very important to our Christian faith, life, and discipleship - and to our sharing in the eternal life and goodness of God.

May we always appreciate and give thanks for the gift of our Baptism! May we live in the life of the Lord every day. May the divine grace within us be renewed in the Eucharist and all the Sacraments - as well as in our prayer, Liturgy, service, and daily discipleship!

#### ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

A couple of weeks ago, we told you about the Allegheny GO program, which provides 50% discounted Pittsburgh Regional Transit (PRT) fares to those ages 12 though 64 who live in a household that receives SNAP (also known as food stamp) benefits - for more information, see https://discountedfares.alleghenycounty.us or call 412-255-1381. This week, we will talk about discounted fare programs for those under the age of 12 and over the age of 64.

Adults can have up to four children ages 5 and under ride with them for free. Additional children ages 5 and under will be charged half-priced fares. Children ages 6-11 can apply for a Kid's ConnectCard, which entitles them to half-priced fares. You can apply online at www.rideprt.org/fares-and-passes/discounted-fares/kidcard-application or you can go to the Downtown Service Center at 623 Smithfield Street, Pittsburgh, PA 15222, which is open Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 5:00pm.

Seniors 65 years of age and older can sign up for a Senior Citizen ConnectCard and ride for free! You can obtain a Senior Citizen Connect-Card by visiting the Downtown Service Center or by visiting your local state senator or representative's office. You can sign up for a Senior Citizen ConnectCard at Senator Wayne Fontana's office at 524 Pine Hollow Road, McKees Rocks, PA 15136 by appointment by calling 412-331-1208. You can also sign up for a Senior Citizen ConnectCard at Representative Dan Deasy's office at 1074 Greentree Rd, Pittsburgh, PA 15220. Please call the office at 412-928-9514 for availability.


