





CONGRATULATIONS Bishop Mark A. Eckman 13th Bishop of Pittsburgh

Along with all the parish communities, religious women and men, deacons and priests of our Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh, our parish also warmly congratulates our newly appointed Diocesan Bishop, the Most Reverend Mark Anthony Eckman, D.D.

Having served as an Auxiliary Bishop of Pittsburgh since 2022, Bishop Mark Eckman is a native of Saint Valentine Catholic Parish in Bethel Park. He studied in the Saint Valentine Parish School and well as South Hills (*now Seton LaSalle*) High School. In 1981, Bishop Eckman graduated from Duquesne University as well as Saint Paul Seminary on Noblestown Road. After participating in the Priestly Formation Program at Saint Vincent Seminary in Latrobe, Pa., our new Bishop was ordained to the priesthood in 1985.

Bishop Eckman has been a priest of our Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh for 40 years – serving as a parochial vicar and a pastor for many years. He was pastor of Saint Sylvester Parish in Brentwood, as well as pastor of Saint Thomas More Parish in Bethel Park.

In recent years, Bishop Eckman assisted Bishop Zubik as the diocesan Director of Clergy Personnel for eight years, then as Secretary for Clergy and Religious, and most recently as General Secretary and Vicar General of the Diocese.

As Bishop Zubik enters into retirement at the age of 75, he will continue to reside here in the Diocese. Bishop Zubik lead and served our Catholic Diocese since September 2007 and is also native of Ambridge in Beaver County.

May the good Lord continue to bless both Bishop Mark Eckman and Bishop David Zubik now and in the years ahead, and may God bless our diocesan church as Bishop Eckman begins his ministry as our chief shepherd!

Welcoming our new Diocesan Bishop

In today's reading from the Gospel according to Luke, Jesus sends out His Apostles and other disciples to go forth and proclaim the real presence and the Kingdom of Almighty God. Jesus Himself proclaimed His Good News of God's love and salvation, and He appointed helpers to share this message and to bring divine life to all people.

Since the ministry of Jesus and His apostles, new generations of ministers, servants and leaders have been raised up to preach the Good News and to shepherd the Lord's holy people.

Our own local church - the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh - has been blessed with very fine shepherds since our establishment as a Diocese in 1843.

On Monday, July 14, we will welcome our new shepherd as Bishop Mark Eckman enters into his office as our new Diocesan Bishop! Bishop Eckman has been a priest of our diocese for 40 years and – since 2022 – an Auxiliary Bishop. He is well known to our diocesan church, and he knows our parishes, our people, and our diocese very well.

The Installation Liturgy on Monday afternoon, July 14, will be celebrated in Saint Paul Cathedral in Oakland and will be attended by Pope Leo XIV's representative to the United States, Cardinal Christoph Pierre – as well as Archbishop Perez of Philadelphia and many bishops from around the United States. The clergy and members of our diocese are also welcome to attend and participate!

For the past seven years, Father Joe has been a resident priest in the Saint Philip church rectory, and he has shared his priestly ministry with our community as a presider at our parish liturgies.

Please plan to join us for this special parish event! Mark your calendar now. Information and a Parish Barbecue Order Form will be placed into the parish bulletin in the coming weeks!







REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: We continue our Summer rest and refreshment. During these hot days, we are advised to drink plenty of water and keep hydrated to stay healthy. Father William Byrne in his book, <u>5 Things with Father Bill</u>, gives us advice to avoid getting *"Spiritually Dehydrated."* The following practices are well tested ways of keeping us from getting spiritually dehydrated.

1. The examination of conscience. Although this is actually the last thing we should do each day, I place it first because it is so important and it lays the groundwork for a great next day. This is the method recommended by St. Ignatius of Loyola, and I think it works very well. First, say thanks to God for your day. Recall all the blessings of the day. Second ask for the grace to know your sins and to move away from them. Third, play the movie of your day and recall the moments and times you failed to love well. Fourth, tell God you're sorry. Fifth, make "The Plan" for tomorrow to love better. Be specific! Do not just say "I will be better tomorrow," but say, "I will be better tomorrow in this specific area, to this person, etc."

2. The morning offering. When you get up, before you brush your teeth, stop and thank God for the day and offer all that happens to Him for His glory and your salvation. Recall, "The Plan" from the night before. If your're not a morning person, put a Post-it on your mirror with M.O. written on it.

3. The commute. When I listen to the traffic report in the morning, I not only think of all those people stuck on the highways; I also think of all the prayer potential each morning. The drive/ride/jog is a perfect time to say some extra prayers. Freestyle you own prayers, say your favorites, or maybe pray the Rosary.

4. Grace. *"Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts which we have received from Thy bounty through Christ our Lord. Amen."* Now how hard was that? Pray before each meal and remember to cross yourself. Crossing yourself in public should not just be for professional athletes, and you may inspire a friend to know Jesus also.

5. The examination of conscience. It is so good it made the top-five list twice. We can also add the additional practice of *"Come Holy Spirit"* before we answer or make a phone call or whenever we think of it.

Thankfully, when we have extremely hot temperatures, the CitiParks Cooling Centers are there for those who need them.

The Cooling Centers are just the CitiParks Healthy Active Living Centers, which are normally restricted to individuals 60 and older, open to anyone who needs to get out of the heat. These centers open when the high temperature is forecasted to be at or above 90 degrees and they are open from 8:00am to 7:00pm. The closest Cooling Center is located at the Sheraden Healthy Active Living Community Center, 720 Sherwood Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15204. The phone number is 412-777-5012.
