

This Sunday's Gospel passage from Luke is a wonderful assurance from Jesus that our prayers are heard by God the Father and that, in His generosity, we will receive goodness and blessings from God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As His disciples, Jesus indeed encourages us to make our requests of God in our prayers and to trust in the goodness that will be shared with us.

ENSURING SAFETY ON OUR PARISH PROPERTIES



TO THIS YEAR'S AUGUST 2-3 MISSION VISITOR, SISTER INVIOLATA KESSY, SHS

Each year, every parish in the United **States** is asked to welcome a member of a Catholic missionary community to speak to our members regarding their work to share the Good news and to grow the Kingdom of God.

In addition to speaking at our Liturgies, a second collection is taken to help fund the efforts of this particular Catholic community.

Next weekend, August 2-3, we will welcome Holy Spirit Sister Inviolata Kessy, SHS, from Tanzania in East Africa. This African Catholic religious order, the Sisters of the Holy Spirit, was established in 1964 in Tanzania and is now an international community. Their charism is to educate and to care for the poor and those on the margins of society. The Sisters serve in a number of African nations as well as in the United States and other countries.

In a number of African locations, the Sisters serve many orphans whose parents died due to illness as well as grandparents whose daughters and sons - having succumbed to deadly illnesses - have left the elderly grandparents the responsibility for their grandchildren. As we also know full well here in the United States, this societal issue presents incredible challenges for senior citizens.

The Holy Spirit Sisters in Africa are asking our help to continue work on their planned nursing homes and assisted living centers to care for grandparents and the elderly. REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: We have been blessed as we continue this Pilgrims of Hope Jubilee Year at Saint Philip Parish. We see the wonderful ministries of Gardening, Kitchen Table. Saint Vincent de Paul and Our Ladies of Charity continuing to flourish. We prepare with great anticipation for the new ministries to include Baptism Family Gatherings, High School Programs and Seasonal Catholic Book Clubs.

We look forward to growth in our Faith Formation Program to include a middle school EDGE format and opportunities for service in Fifth through Eighth grade. Our Sacramental Programs, Small Faith Groups, Men's Group, Retreat Weekends, OCIA, and Music Ministry continue to enlighten the faith and we look forward to the opportunities provided by our Adult Faith Formation in the Fall, Winter and Spring.

But how can we continue to be Pilgrims of Hope? How can we continue to grow and share the love of Jesus Christ with others? In an adaptation toward Hope of Every Year is a Year of Faith from 5 things with Father Bill, I might suggest the following:

1. REMEMBER. Most of us don't remember our Baptism, but we should remind ourselves from time to time that we are baptized. If we call ourselves Catholics, we believe that Iesus is the Son of God, sent to redeem the world and show us the love of the Father. Jesus gives us the command to "Love One Another."

- **2. LEARN.** When Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14;6), He does not say that He's "a way" or "a truth" or "a life." We have to learn why His message is The message, the secret to happiness, and not just one gate among many to enter the Kingdom of God. Participate in the Liturgy each week. Attend one of the many Faith Formation offerings throughout the year. You will be glad you did.
- **3. PRAY.** Mother Teresa once said, "When we look at the cross, we know how much Jesus loved us. When we look at the tabernacle, we know how much Jesus loves us now." In the Eucharist, Jesus is truly present body, blood, soul, and divinity. So if you want to deepen your faith, get in touch with Jesus.
- **4. SERVE.** In his letter, St. James asks, "What good is it, if someone says he has faith, but does not have works?" Yikes, that means Mass alone does not cut it. Time to look in the bulletin and see what service opportunities there are. Help out Saint Vincent de Paul or the Ladies of Charity. Make food for the poor or homebound, visit the sick, or sign up for a holy hour to pray for the needs of others. It's all good; just pick one and give it a try.
- **5. SHARE.** If a movie star or famous athlete showed up on your doorstep wanting to meet you, wouldn't you tell someone about it? How about if God came to meet you? Well. He did and does. He is in the Church. He is in the Eucharist at Mass, in our prayer with Scripture and in our neighbor who needs us. It would be a pity if someone did not get to meet Him because I never said anything. It won't be a Year of Hope if you don't tell anyone.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

We often report (including today) that a friend in need received a clothing voucher and/or a household goods voucher, but what are those things and where do the items come from?

Many of you know that the St. Vincent de Paul Central Council of Pittsburgh operates thrift stores, and you may have even donated by placing items in their blue bins (in front of the Hope House and behind the Ascension worship site) or by dropping donations off at one of the thrift stores. There are stores in Coraopolis, Castle Shannon, Monroeville, Penn Hills and Butler. These stores not only provide employment opportunities and low-cost items for sale, but they also supply our friends in need with free items!

When we meet new friends in need, we often find that they are lacking in clothing and/or basic household goods like pots, pans, silverware, towels or sheets. We are able to fulfill these needs by ordering a clothing voucher and a household goods voucher. A clothing voucher entitles the recipient, and everyone in their household, to obtain three free outfits from a St. Vincent de Paul thrift store. There is no cost to the conference for a clothing voucher.

A household goods voucher allows a friend in need to obtain a certain dollar amount (usually \$50) of items from one of the thrift stores for free. The referring conference pays for the value of the goods that the friend in need "purchases," but our money goes much further by allowing the friend in need to purchase gently used items from our thrift stores than it would if we had to purchase new items.


