

### **Notes** from the **Pastor**

Greetings once again, and best wishes for a iovful and blessed Sunday - and a very good month of August - during this Jubilee Holy Year!

### Dedication to Jesus first

From time to time, I'm asked this question: "Father Jim, why is it that so many Catholic Christians - especially among our younger generations - have no interest in our faith and in the Sunday Liturgy?"

I'm sure that there are a variety of reasons why participation in the life of the Church is not as strong as it used to be. You can probably also compile a list of reasons yourself.

Personally, I think there's one primary reason why participation in the life if God's People has decreased. My #1 reason is that our society and our lives are filled with an incredible number of **distractions**.

**Of course, from the time of Moses** when so many people turned away from the Lord - and then found themselves mired in chaos - until our own day, a great many individuals and families have simply had no interest in the divine. They've been caught up with the details of daily life and don't look beyond their earthly existence.

Likewise, many persons in past millennia have ignored - and many continue to ignore any semblance of a spiritual life or any life beyond this existence.

Yes, it's sad that these individuals have NO sense of a Creator who loves them and who graciously gives life to them and to the entire world.

That unfortunate human mindset has always characterized the lives of so many persons.

Today, however, we are also inundated by countless distractions of entertainment and media like never before in human history. With the arrival of sports fandom, then radio, then movies, then television and the internet and social media, the voice of the Lord has been drowned out by the ceaseless and ubiquitous noise that's with us 24 hours every day.

Our ancestors who lived before the early 20th century had plenty of time to spend in prayer and reading - as well as personal and family development and enrichment. Today, many people simply pass the time wanting to be continuously entertained in one way or another.

Yet, in today's Gospel reading, Jesus reminds us that if we are NOT focused on God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, then we risk losing the blessings which He offers us in this life - and in the eternal existence with Almighty God which only Jesus offers us.

Today, the Lord calls each of us to be entirely dedicated to Him, to His Gospel, and to our Catholic Christian life and community. May we protect ourselves from the unending, poisonous, and deadly distractions of our society today, and may we make Jesus and the Kingdom of God our most important focus and goal - now and always. Amen!

### **Two Notes** about your Contribution **Envelopes**



First, thank you so very much for your continuing support of our Saint Philip Catholic Parish and our work and mission of growing the Kingdom of God and the Church of the Lord Jesus! We are all blessed by God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit in so many, many ways. Your generosity in offering some of your blessings back to the Lord every Sunday is much appreciated, and your contributions are truly essential to our parish's continued presence and ministry here in Pittsburgh's West End, in Crafton, in Ingram and in Thornburg!

From time to time, a few members contact our parish office with the message that they have NOT received their packet of contribution envelopes. This is a truly regrettable occurrence when it happens!

Whenever we receive this message in the parish office, our staff contacts our envelope provider - Our Sunday Visitor, Inc. in Indiana - to report the missing envelopes. The OSV staff checks their records and always reports that the missing contribution envelopes were, in fact, placed in the postal mail service. OSV sends out 1,052 sets of parish envelopes every two months to our registered households. Unfortunately, the only answer is that, from time to time, some of our parish envelopes do NOT get delivered by the postal service.

If there's any time that you don't receive your parish envelopes, please contact your local Post Office to report this issue - and to inquire whether or not the Postal Service can find and deliver your household's parish contribution envelopes. Thank you!

Second, as you can see in the Financial Report on Page 5, about 28% of the envelopes distributed to parish members are actually used for contributions. This means that a great deal of postage and paper go to waste every time contribution envelopes are sent to our households.

At the suggestion of our parish Finance Council - and of our envelope provider and our staff - we will begin looking into discontinuing the envelopes sent to those who haven't used any parish envelopes since 2020. However, before any envelopes are discontinued, our staff will send a letter to households to alert them that their envelopes are about to be discontinued.

All of us who appreciate the community and life of Saint Philip Parish truly need to support and participate in our parish life every week! Thankfully, about 30% of our households make this parish possible. If we want to have a strong and vital Saint Philip Parish for many decades to come, then everyone in the parish needs to return a regular and grateful offering to the Lord in our weekly offertory collection - and in other contributions. By doing so, Jesus' holy Church will continue to advance the Kingdom of God - and to share the Good News and life of Jesus with all those in this local flock of our Good Shepherd and Lord!




REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: In the August 3 bulletin, we noted that at age 60 spiritual writer Joyce Rupp began a 37 day pilgrimage along the Camino De Santiago in northern Spain to the grave and church dedicated to Saint James, the Apostle. In her book, Walk In A Relaxed Manner, she reflects on what it means to be a pilgrim and life lessons learned. This week we reflect upon some of those lessons and what they may mean for

each of us as we transition during these last few days of August.

- Walk the Pilgrimage in a relaxed Manner. The stress of hurrying and worrying denied me the inner harmony and spiritual adventure of the Camino Pilgrimage. Once my companion and I decided to pace ourselves differently, we grew more peaceful and enjoyed our time with other pilgrims. The beauty of the Spanish countryside took on a deeper color and its peoples seemed to grow friendlier. We were more at home with ourselves and one another.
- Let go. Deep down I realized the necessity of letting go as the only thing to do. Holding too tightly to anyone or anything deprives oneself of growth. Hanging on prevents one from future offers, even the unexpected ones.
- Live in the now. The pilgrim has to be awake and watchful for options on the route-such as crossings, intersections, side streets or anything that looks like a footpath. One has to be constantly alert, in the NOW moment. When any of us is not focused and attentive to the NOW, we can lose our way. We miss the direction for our life's journey. We can easily get lost in the past or in the future when things don't go the way we plan for them to go.
- Acknowledge the kindness of strangers. I need to make an effort to be alert to daily kindnesses and not just ignore or brush them off when they occur. When I am totally engaged in MY activities, MY work, MY shopping, My schedule, MY life, how easily I ignore the goodness extended to me by another. How much each of us misses when we over focus on life's busyness. Many times the kindness is there. We need only receive it with awareness.

As we read some of these lessons from Joyce's pilgrimage, which one will each of us focus on during these last few weeks of Summer as we continue our Pilgrimage of Hope.
