Greetings once again, and best wishes for a iovful and blessed Sunday - and a very good month of September - during this Jubilee Holy Year!

# More than an occasional pastime

Each of us makes decisions in our young and adult years as to what our interests and our commitments are. Many are very dedicated to their spouse, their children and their families. Many are dedicated to their education and/or to their profession and their career. Others are dedicated to exercise and sports and spend many hours in the gym or at the field or the court. Some aren't really dedicated to anything in particular. Some simply let their days pass by occupying their time with television, games, gossip, relaxation, or other various pastimes.

When it comes to our Catholic Christian faith and life in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, there are also different levels of commitment in the lives and discipleship of the many members of the Lord's Church. Some Catholic Christians live a very intense life of faith, prayer, and service. These individuals are often amazing in their commitment to Jesus, the Gospel, the Church, and the faith! This intense Catholic living isn't common, and commentators say this group is less than one percent of the Church.

There are many, many Catholic Christians who believe in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit and are committed to our life and

faith. We participate in the Sunday Liturgy, and we make a true effort to live the Way of the Lord Jesus within their families, in the parish, and in their community.

Of course, there are also a great many Catholic Christians who participate to a small degree. After their Baptism and Communion, they and their families aren't seen again in Church or in the parish community until (perhaps) the day of their Funeral. These Church members - along with those who don't even make it to the Baptism Font - sadly comprise the majority of Catholic Christians in our day. In fact, these non-participants have probably been the majority of Catholic Christians for centuries.

However, Jesus doesn't call us to simply be Baptized - or to only be occasional disciples. Jesus invites us all into the Kingdom and eternal Life of God, but this invitation to salvation requires a lifelong, daily commitment to the Lord, to His Gospel and Way, to His holy People, and even to His Cross.



# PRAYER CARDS FOR ONE OF **OUR NEWEST SAINTS**

This Sunday, September 7, two of the youngest saints in Christian history are scheduled to be formally added to the Canon (the List) of the Lord's Holy Ones. "canonization" event at Saint Peter Basilica in Vatican City will recognize and proclaim the sainthood of both Carlos Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati.

Carlo Acutis was a young teenager who was

fervent in our Catholic Christian faith. He also lived a profound life of charity and holiness, and he used his internet skills to compile a collection of all the miracles of the Eucharist in Church history. Carlo died in October 2006 after a rare illness. His life and story have rapidly come to inspire millions Catholics around the world.



Pier Giorgio Frassati was also a young man dedicated to our faith, to charitable works, and to the Eucharist. Pier Giorgio died in July 1925 at the age of 24.

# Our Christian faith in God

As you know, the name which our Northern European ancestors gave to the Divine Creator is the name "God" ('Gott' in German; 'Gud' in Scandinavian languages). The English name "God" comes from the same basic understanding that the One Creator is "Good." In Southern European languages, the name of the Almighty comes from the practice of speaking about the "Divinity" (in Latin, 'Deus'; in Italian 'Dio'; in Spanish 'Dios'; in French 'Dieu').

Speaking the name of Almighty God is quite common in our daily living and in our society. Many of us speak the name of God with great reverence, gratitude, and respect. Unfortunately, far too many people regularly speak the name of God with terrible disrespect and, yes, even animosity.

For most people who speak the name of God - whether reverently, or "in vain" as we traditionally say - there's a mistaken sense that all people have the very same understanding of the Divine God. Of course, if you spend some time learning about human history and human culture, you'll soon realize that NO, we don't all have the same understanding when we speak the holy name of God. There are many non-Christian concepts of God that are very much unlike our belief in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

As Catholic Christians, when we speak of profess our very specific God, we understanding of Almighty God as God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit - the understanding of God given to us by Jesus of Nazareth, Jesus the Christ, Jesus the Lord. Our belief in God as Trinity and our understanding of God as Trinity is exclusive to our Christian faith in the divine! This proclamation of God as Trinity is the belief that is at the heart of Christianity thanks entirely to Jesus.

Again, when many people speak the holy name of God, they have NO specific sense of what they mean. It's simply a name that's frequently spoken in our culture today. That's truly unfortunate because our Catholic Christian belief in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit means so much to us. Our belief in God as the Holy Trinity means everything to our Christian faith, to our Christian living, and to our Christian hope in the Resurrection and everlasting life. We believe that it's only the Holy Trinity who promises goodness and salvation to all of us who are the faithful people of God.

Our Christian understanding of God - the God of Jesus Christ - is such an extraordinary gift from Jesus, from the New Testament writers, and from the earliest shepherds and teachers of the Catholic Church. Beginning with the revelation of Jesus, our ancestors in the Church worked for centuries to clearly explain and illuminate our belief in the Holy Trinity. For all Christians, our belief in one Divine God who is the Holy Trinity is a remarkable treasure filled with countless spiritual riches which are, in truth, the light and salvation of all humanity. Glory be to God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit! Amen!

# ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

This Tuesday, September 9, is the feast day of our organization's founder, Blessed Frederic Ozanam. He founded the Society of St. Vincent de Paul in 1833 while he was a student at the University of Paris. There were many desperately poor people in the city, who were underserved by the social service organizations that existed at the time. When Frederic realized that those organizations and the Catholic Church were not doing enough to serve the poor, he knew he had to act.

Inspired by the work that St. Vincent de Paul did with the poor of France, Frederic named the new organization after him. The early members of the Society were mentored by Blessed Rosalie Rendu, a Daughter of Charity (an organization started by St. Vincent de Paul), on the importance of home visits when ministering to the poor. The home visit continues to be one of the most critical things that a Vincentian does, as it allows us not only to determine how best to assist our friends in need, but it also allows us to show our friends in need that they are loved by spending time with them in their homes.

The small charity started by a humble college student has now grown to be an international organization of more than 800,000 members in 155 countries. We at the St. Philip Conference of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul are proud to be part of the legacy started by Blessed Frederic Ozanam. We ask that everyone perform some act of charity or kindness on September 9 in honor of our founder's feast day!


