

Sunday's Scripture

The Third Sunday of Advent

From Father George Wenzinger, Pastor

Dear friends,

This past Friday, we laid to rest the body of Father Thomas Leyland, previous and beloved pastor of Saint Rose Parish.

It is not every priest who has the honor of being pastor of the very parish of his infant baptism and then, to have his liturgy of Christian burial celebrated in the same church by the bishop presiding in the midst of a full church of family, priests and parishioners, the place of the beginning of the journey of faith and its conclusion. "Eternal rest grant unto him O Lord and let perpetual light shine upon him."

As the current pastor of Saint Rose, I was given the honor of offering the homily for Fr. Leyland's funeral Mass. I took this responsibility seriously as a time not only to honor his memory and his witness to Christ as a faithful intentional disciple of Christ, but also recognize him as a priest who was faithful to his vocation for over 55 years. Only God knows the details of his entire life from his birth, March 11, 1938---December 4, 2020; the dash of 82 years. Consider with me the history of the world during his lifetime, and the history of the Church he served. The 82 years of his life were times of great change and challenge for the world and especially for the Church, the Body of Christ. Those of us who understand what Fr. Tom lived through can appreciate his contribution to the common good of humankind.

My personal reflection on his legacy is this:

Father Thomas Leyland was an example of the diocesan priest as an icon of the living Christ, Jesus, who said to his disciples, "I am with you always, do not be afraid." Father Leyland, as an icon of Christ was called by God to be of service to the people of God, by accompanying us on the pilgrim journey of faith, as the Body of Christ, the church with a living face. He was generous in response to whatever part God wanted him to play in salvation history. Fr. Tom had a life of many joys and many sorrows, as do we all.

As a priest, he offered his life as a ministry of service to God's people. Like the rest of us, he was human and had his own way of being himself. Let us remember him above all as a kind and loving shepherd in the person of Christ the Good Shepherd who laid down his life for others. As we pray for the repose of his immortal soul and reverently place his mortal remains to sleep now in the hope of the resurrection of the body in our Saint Rose cemetery, let us ask him to pray for us, from his place in eternity that we, who remain, can respond daily to the call of the Holy Spirit to do justice, love goodness, and walk humbly with our God!

Greetings Parishioners,

Here we are, at the end of 2020, and what a year it has been! I want to invite your support in helping accomplish two larger updates for our campus: a GPS Ionization System and an updated Dimming System for the interior lighting in our church building.

Campus-wide Ionization System - A GPS Ionization system is designed to improve air quality. This newer technology has demonstrated many benefits and is increasingly recommended by professionals. We would like to take advantage of this technology for our school and church facilities. Pollutants, dust, dander, pollen, smoke, and even pathogens such as mold, viruses and bacteria are often in the air we breathe, even when we don't see them. Ionization technology safely creates and releases positive and negative ions into the airstream using an existing ventilation system. When these ions disperse throughout a space, they seek out and form bonds with particles in the air and they begin to cluster. The larger a cluster of particles becomes, the easier it is to safely filter it out of the air. This process is proven to be both safe and effective. The GPS Ionization System also reduces the need of outside air for our venting system which provides energy savings in addition to the above benefits.

This system's benefits, while especially important now in the time of COVID-19, will have a lasting impact for our students and parishioners. We will be able to install these systems on our entire campus for less than \$50,000.

Church Interior Light Dimming System - Over the year's we have been replacing our lights within the church to utilize more energy efficient LED lights. Our current system is outdated and incompatible with LED lights. The plan to upgrade our dimming system was anticipated and we are now at a point to take action. The total cost of this replacement is \$22,500.

Support - The total cost for Saint Rose to accomplish both of these projects will be approximately \$70,000. With that being said, we are conscious that this year has brought hardship and financial challenges to many, and that not all of our parishioners are in a position to support these projects. For those who are in a position to donate, we would like to ask for your support. We will not host a Moonlight and Roses event this spring due to COVID and would invite those who typically sponsor or donate to consider this appeal instead.

Our Parish and School leadership, Finance Council and Building and Grounds Committee believe these projects are important and worth the investment. It is our hope to continue to provide our students and parishioners with a safe and holy atmosphere. Thank you for your prayerful consideration and support.



How does the CARES Act Impact Year-end gifts?

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act has established two temporary changes to how charitable donations are treated this year.

The CARES Act will allow taxpayers who take the standard deduction, can claim an additional deduction up to \$300 for charitable gifts made in cash. This means that married families filing jointly will get a deduction of up to \$600.

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash donations was increased for individuals donors. Donors can now deduct qualified contributions of up to 100% of their AGI (up from 60%). The AGI limit for corporate donors who make a cash donation was also increased. Corporations can now deduct qualified contributions of up to 25% of their taxable income (up from 10%).

The Influence Which Fr. Leyland Had on Me

It was a cloudy spring day, around 2007. I was at the time involved with the Saint Rose Children's Choir, and the choir director Mrs. Mariasy was gathering us in to get ready for our rehearsal. That was when I saw Fr. Leyland. I went up to him, asking him to see the inside of the tabernacle. Through most of my conversations with Uncles Earl and Trevor, they had already told me about its significance - that it held Jesus, the Blessed Sacrament. So long as those doors were closed, Jesus was alive and present - meaning that the tabernacle would only be opened during Good Friday and the eve of Holy Thursday. Yet this was not enough for me. I wanted to see what was inside. It was clear that Father had business to attend to, but many of us, including Anjali, were eager for him to open the doors, and sure enough, he did.




To my surprise, I did not see a magnificent icon of Jesus, but rather, a simple brown wooden cross with a wafer enclosed at its center. Knowing that this was the same wafer that undergoes transubstantiation for the Sacrament of the Eucharist made me realize enough that this was truly Jesus. The simple appearance of the Blessed Sacrament further reflected Jesus's human nature - he humbled himself as a lowly servant who came to serve others, rather than taking the form of an elite and wealthy king or entrepreneur. Father was willing to show us for that moment what was inside - or more specifically, he attested to the notion that God's Son understood and was pleased with the curiosity of elementary and middle-school aged children. It was one of the closest encounters with Jesus which I have had in my early childhood, and it was something that I never forgot.

I normally never thought of that moment very frequently thereafter. As a 10 year-old I clearly thought "so that is what Father meant when Jesus was present". Even with the evolution on how I go about my faith, there will be so much about the Blessed Sacrament I will never fully understand. However, I was able to understand, just with this episode, the type of priest that Fr. Leyland was.

Fr. Leyland was, as John 10:11 says, a good shepherd who lays his life down for his sheep. He always stood up for the parishioners of Saint Rose, and wanted all of them to learn about the Faith which he intimately embraced. He was always "slow to anger, and rich in kindness". He not only extended this care to the youngest of us, he extended it to all parishioners or visitors of Saint Rose, particularly my mom who was Hindu while he was still the head pastor of Saint Rose. When the new parish, St. John XXIII, had started to emerge in southern Perrysburg, he refused to abandon his sheep at Saint Rose, desiring to bolster it to the vibrant, welcoming community it is today. Even after his retirement, he always continued to ensure that his beloved parish was nourished - especially with powerful yet personal homilies that helped me understand the role of being a Catholic in an ever-changing society. It was through these homilies that people understood he truly was the good shepherd - one who established fruitful relationships of goodwill and trust so that his flock could go out and make disciples of all people.

Though he is no longer with us physically, his spiritual impact on the Saint Rose community will endure for a very lengthy time to come. And in his name, I will never forget the importance of Jesus' presence in my life and his presence in the Blessed Sacrament. Perhaps, this one experience of being so close to Jesus, almost fourteen years ago, is one to cherish, and joyfully reflect on for the years to come.

Saint Rose School Awarded the 2020 Eco-School Award

Saint Rose Catholic School was selected by the Lourdes University's Science for Valuing the Environment to be awarded the 2020 Eco-School Award for its Trout in the Classroom middle school elective course, and for promoting an understanding and respect for the environment.

Here is a summary of the program as presented to S.A.V.E.

Saint Rose Catholic School started the *Trout Unlimited* "Trout in the Classroom" in 2019 as part of the spring semester course selections for 7th and 8th grade students. Working with *Trout Unlimited* and the Ohio DNR, trout eggs are delivered to school in early January. The eggs are placed in a tank that has been specially prepared by the students for the eggs and eventual trout fry. Students monitor water temperatures, chemical, and biological levels as the eggs hatch and the trout grow. During the first year, only about 18 trout survived to be released. This year, out of the 100 or so eggs that were received, about 70 or so trout were released at Cold Creek in Castalia, Ohio. During the course, the students learn about the habitat that trout require. They need cold, clean water, without pollutants or silt. Trout streams are very rare, especially in Ohio, where it is difficult to find streams with consistent water temperatures in the mid 50 to mid 60 degree fahrenheit range. The students check on the trout everyday, record data, clean the water, and feed the fish as they grow. The class typically ends in the spring with a field trip to Castalia for the release of the trout into the stream. Last year was a great trip and the students took a tour of the hatchery, the stream, and learned about the blue hole, where perfectly cooled water percolates to the surface while being filtered by the area's limestone. This year, Dr. Borgelt, the class's teacher, and his family took care of the trout during the remote learning time due to COVID and released the trout in the stream. "It was disappointing that the students could not participate with the daily care of the trout and help with their release, but I was able to send images and reports to them through email. My daughter, who is a third grader at Saint Rose, did a great job helping me with the trout and enjoyed seeing them find their new home."

Saint Nicholas Day

Saint Nicholas recently visited Saint Rose School to share the story of life as a bishop and saint. The students received prayer cards and candy canes to remind them of the sacrifice that Christ made for them and their salvation.






