The First Sunday of Lent

Genesis 9:8-15

1 Peter 3:18-22

Mark 1:12-15

From Father George Wenzinger, Pastor

Dear friends,

Today, the first Sunday of Lent, we begin our annual journey with Jesus into the desert for 40 days to prepare ourselves for Holy Week and the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. Because we are spiritual beings as well as physical beings, we practice our faith not only with our bodies, but especially in the spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving which are outward expressions of our inner dispositions. We do this in response to the challenge of Jesus who instructed us in the gospel of Ash Wednesday to do these things not for other people to see and be impressed with our sacrifices, but so that our Heavenly Father, who knows everything, will see the intentions of our hearts and how grateful we are for our eternal salvation.

As we begin our Lenten journey of 2021, let us see it in the context of the great 90 days: 40 days of Lent, and 50 days of Easter. We can see this time frame as divided into two parts: Lent for our purification, and Easter for our enlightenment. These terms are used in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), as a model for all of us to follow.

We begin by humbly admitting the harsh reality that we are mortal, that we are dust, and unto dust we shall return. This is the meaning behind the distribution of ashes on our heads. Humility for our vanity and our ego.

As we meditate on the suffering and death of Jesus, out of love for us, we ask God for the grace to see our own sufferings and death as a participation in His sacrifice of mercy and love. No one escapes the cross in life. How we embrace it makes all the difference. It can be a blessing.

Since the 7-week program called "The Search," on Formed was so greatly accepted by the parish, we have decided to continue on into the season of Lent with a similar program that can also be found on Formed called, "Forgiven." It is further clarified in this week's bulletin. This new series has 5 episodes:

"Where are You?"

"An Encounter with Mercy"

"Embraced in Mercy: Rite of Reconciliation Explained."

"Answering Common Questions About Confession"

"For Parents Preparing Your Child for Confession"

As we now enter this time of grace, the 40-day season of Lent, as time of purification for our minds, bodies, and souls in preparation for Easter, join me in reconsidering the place of this sacramental gift of Reconciliation in our lives as intentional disciples of Christ.

A Reflection on Our Spiritual Battle during Lent



Since the time of Adam and Eve, there exists a spiritual battle between the faithful and the powers of darkness; it's a battle that will continue until the end of the world. In this battle, there are two armies: on the one hand, Satan and his demons; on the other, St. Michael and the Christians. You might ask: why

St. Michael, and not Christ himself, given that St. Benedict speaks of the monastic life as military service under the banner of Christ, the true King? The reason is simple and employs the principle of *aequitas*. Satan is an angel, Michael is an angel, and so, the battlefield is the same. Christ, on the other hand, is true God and true man, and has already fought the good fight: *mors et vita duello conflixere mirando*: death and life contended in a spectacular battle, recites the Easter Sequence (cf. *Victimae Paschali laudes*). So, the Lord leaves the battlefield to us, helping us with His grace.

JOURNEY TO THE FOOT OF THE CROSS: BISHOP RICKEN OFFERS 10 THINGS TO REMEMBER FOR LENT

Bishop David L. Ricken of Green Bay, Wisconsin, former chairman of the Committee on Evangelization and Catechesis of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), offers “10 Things to Remember for Lent”:

1. Remember the formula. The Church does a good job capturing certain truths with easy-to-remember lists and formulas: 10 Commandments, 7 sacraments, 3 persons in the Trinity. For Lent, the Church gives us almost a slogan—Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving—as the three things we need to work on during the season.

2. It's a time of prayer. Lent is essentially an act of prayer spread out over 40 days. As we pray, we go on a journey, one that hopefully brings us closer to Christ and leaves us changed by the encounter with him.

3. It's a time to fast. With the fasts of Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, meatless Fridays, and our personal disciplines interspersed, Lent is the only time many Catholics these days actually fast. And maybe that's why it gets all the attention. “What are you giving up for Lent? Hot dogs? Beer? Jelly beans?” It's almost a game for some of us, but fasting is actually a form of penance, which helps us turn away from sin and toward Christ.

4. It's a time to work on discipline. The 40 days of Lent are also a good, set time to work on personal discipline in general. Instead of giving something up, it can be doing something positive. “I'm going to exercise more. I'm going to pray more. I'm going to be nicer to my family, friends, and coworkers.”

5. It's about dying to yourself. The more serious side of Lenten discipline is that it's about more than self-control—it's about finding aspects of yourself that are less than Christ-like and letting them die. The suffering and death of Christ are foremost on our minds during Lent, and we join in these mysteries by suffering, dying with Christ and being resurrected in a purified form.

6. Don't do too much. It's tempting to make Lent some ambitious period of personal reinvention, but

it's best to keep it simple and focused. There's a reason the Church works on these mysteries year after year. We spend our entire lives growing closer to God. Don't try to cram it all in one Lent. That's a recipe for failure.

7. Lent reminds us of our weakness. Of course, even when we set simple goals for ourselves during Lent, we still have trouble keeping them. When we fast, we realize we're all just one meal away from hunger. In both cases, Lent shows us our weakness. This can be painful, but recognizing how helpless we are makes us seek God's help with renewed urgency and sincerity.

8. Be patient with yourself. When we're confronted with our own weakness during Lent, the temptation is to get angry and frustrated. “What a bad person I am!” But that's the wrong lesson. God is calling us to be patient and to see ourselves as he does, with unconditional love.

9. Reach out in charity. As we experience weakness and suffering during Lent, we should be renewed in our compassion for those who are hungry, suffering, or otherwise in need. The third part of the Lenten formula is almsgiving. It's about more than throwing a few extra dollars in the collection plate; it's about reaching out to others and helping them without question as a way of sharing the experience of God's unconditional love.

10. Learn to love like Christ. Giving of ourselves in the midst of our suffering and self-denial brings us closer to loving like Christ, who suffered and poured himself out unconditionally on the Cross for all of us. Lent is a journey through the desert to the foot of the Cross on Good Friday, as we seek him out, ask his help, join in his suffering, and learn to love like him.



Alumni Spotlight - Mike Shroyer



Mike Shroyer has a long history at Saint Rose. His mother, Karen Shroyer, graduated in 1970 from Saint Rose School. His parents were married at Saint Rose Church. 
Mike fondly recalls some of the many traditions at Saint Rose, including the Teens High on Life lock-in at the Catholic Club, the 6th grade trip to Camp Storer, and the 8th grade visit to Washington DC. He also enjoyed playing on the greenspace in between the two school buildings, where the present gymnasium is housed, and running up and down the hill behind the Compte House.

Mike thoroughly enjoyed Mrs. Leyland and Mrs. Sanderson as teachers and remembers the respect which Sr. Joy Gray held when, during all-school assemblies, she would raise a hand and the entire school would immediately stop talking. He said that both Father Thomas and Father Lamantia were great leaders of the parish while he was a student.

After graduating from Saint Rose, Mike continued his education at Saint Francis de Sales High School and the University of Toledo. While at UT, Mike began working at Shawn’s Irish Tavern. After several years of working and managing Shawn’s, Mike eventually bought two of the locations of Shawn’s Irish Tavern (the Waterville and Heatherdowns locations).

Mike and his family are active members of the Saint Rose community, not only sending their children to Saint Rose school, but also frequently donating Shawn’s food to various Saint Rose events, including the 150th celebration, school musical dress rehearsals, and the Moonlight and Roses auction. Let’s hope the Shroyer family tradition at Saint Rose continues for many future generations!



2. Confess your sins at least once a year.
3. Receive the Lord in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season.
4. Observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence.
5. Help provide for the needs of the Church. (CCC 2041 –2043)
