

From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parishioners,

The month of August signals for me a few things. Certainly, the most obvious fact is that summer is winding down and daylight gradually becomes shorter. Athletic practices increase with the intent of preparing for the fall sports season. On our own campus, preparations intensify for the first day of school which, by the way, begins on Thursday, August 19. Organizational meetings for parish and school committees begin to ramp up their activities. The combination of these and many other end-of-summer related activities during the month of August signal a vibrant community at Saint Rose. It's great to see and to be very much a part of.

Two weeks ago, Bishop Thomas alluded in his homily that the Lord's Day scripture readings for the next several Sundays would offer the Catholic faithful at Mass images and narratives pertaining to the Holy Eucharist. These Eucharistic "discourses," as they are called, have as their aim the profound fact and reality that Jesus is the Bread of Life. The spiritual food of the Lord's Body and Blood transcends anything this world might provide in the way of nourishment, but provides spiritual sustenance for the journey we all take in this life to heaven.

Surprisingly enough, we become the obstacle to the grace God desires us to have in the act of receiving Holy Communion. Our sin and behaviors that block the grace constantly offered to us can evolve into a tepid faith to the point that we feel lost and maybe even forgotten. It is in these moments that I often hear people observe and claim that "God has forgotten me." Really? Seriously? All the more a reason to find ourselves connected with a faith community.

All of us, every member of the Body of Christ, the Church, need one another to assist along the journey of life. Jesus is the food for that journey. His mercy and forgiveness offered in the Sacrament of Reconciliation opens the doorway for us when we are separated from him and one another. Going to confession can be one of the most freeing experiences, especially if we have been away wandering in our faith, maybe even from the faith community, maybe even from the Lord himself.

In today's gospel, Jesus makes the bold claim that he is "the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever." One cannot find such a promising hope other than from the Lord himself. How good is the God who created us in love and guides our path to him. Stay the course!

Saint Rose Cemetery Board will host a walking rosary beginning at 6:30 p.m. on Sunday, August 15. Walking is optional, a designated shaded area for seating will be available, **bring your own lawn chair.**

The Feast of the Assumption is one of the oldest holy days in the Church, with accounts of celebrations going back to the sixth century. Christians in the East, both Catholic and Orthodox refer to it as the Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos, or "the falling asleep of the Mother of God." The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God."

The document is written in the voice of the Apostle John, to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of His mother, and it recounts the death, laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin.

Sunday Mass Mystery is Solved!

Those attending the 10:00 AM Lord's Day Mass at St. Rose Church on Sunday, July 25 were greeted by a unidentified voice and cryptic message over the sound system just as the words of consecration were spoken during the Eucharistic Prayer. It was a fearful moment which caused some individuals and families to leave church immediately. The Perrysburg Police Department was called. The oddity of having such an occurrence during Mass caused many to think that a form of "hacking" had been imposed on the sound system by someone outside of the church building.

After a thorough investigation, it was determined that the frequency for the sound system in church was paired on the same frequency with our school gymnasium on campus. In preparation for Bishop Thomas's 12 Noon Mass and reception following in the school gymnasium, someone was testing the wireless microphone in the gym for the reception at the same time Mass was being celebrated in church. Thankfully, the causes many assumed in fear were none of the theories some thought.

We apologize for the fear experienced during that Lord's Day Mass, especially at the time when the interruption happened. We have addressed the sound system frequency issue in the school gym and church and have hopefully averted any future issues. Mystery solved!




THEMES FROM CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

The Church's social teaching is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society. Modern Catholic social teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar, and episcopal documents. The depth and richness of this tradition can be understood best through a direct reading of these documents. In these brief reflections, we highlight several of the key themes that are at the heart of our Catholic social tradition.




LIFE AND DIGNITY OF THE HUMAN PERSON

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, human life is under direct attack from abortion and euthanasia. Human life is threatened by cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the use of the death penalty. The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.



CALL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY, AND PARTICIPATION


The person is not only sacred but also social. How we organize our society—in economics and politics, in law and policy—directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. Marriage and family are the central social institutions that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.



RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES


The Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met. Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities—to one another, to our families, and to the larger society.






OPTION FOR THE POOR AND VULNERABLE

A basic moral test is how our most vulnerable members are faring. In a society marred by deepening divisions between rich and poor, our tradition recalls the story of the Last Judgment (Mt 25:31-46) and instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.




THE DIGNITY OF WORK AND THE RIGHTS OF WORKERS

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God's creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected—the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organization and joining of unions, to private property, and to economic initiative.



SOLIDARITY

We are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, wherever they may be. Loving our neighbor has global dimensions in a shrinking world. At the core of the virtue of solidarity is the pursuit of justice and peace. Blessed Pope Paul VI taught that "if you want peace, work for justice."¹ The Gospel calls us to be peacemakers. Our love for all our sisters and brothers demands that we promote peace in a world surrounded by violence and conflict.



CARE FOR GOD'S CREATION

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.
