

# From the Pastor's Desk



Dear Parishioners of Saint Rose,

The month of June this year has been chocked full of significant milestones for a good number of people in our church community. Graduations, weddings, anniversaries of marriage and ordination these past weeks have been numerous,

especially for those marking these moments. This second to last weekend in June is no exception as the Catholic Diocese of Toledo rejoices that God has called two men to the holy priesthood. Several weeks ago, I shared with you in my bulletin column that the three men ordained to the transitional diaconate were the last group of candidates I had the pleasure of processing before their entrance into the seminary.

This weekend (June 22), Deacons Jacob Livecchi and Christopher Turner were ordained priests in service to the people of God in the Diocese of Toledo. They, too, like the diaconate candidates ordained in May, are the last men I had the pleasure of processing for seminary studies as Director of Priestly Vocations. They are fine men and will be dynamic priests for our diocese.

I had the pleasure of conversing with both of them earlier this past week during the Biennial Convocation for Priests in Huron, Ohio. Both men made a point to express thanks to me for getting them to this moment in their life. It warmed my heart knowing that these young soon to be priests persevered in their formation. Now, they come to the point where the "rubber truly hits the road", as they say. Their enthusiasm and courage to make this step, which the Church has now affirmed, will be a great gift to the communities they will serve in the years ahead. Father Livecchi will be returning to Rome this fall to complete one additional year of graduate study before his pastoral appointment to a parish in the Spring of 2025.

While he will likely know his first priestly assignment sometime this weekend, Father Chris Turner, who happens to be a graduate of our own Saint Rose of Lima Catholic School in Perrysburg, has many fond memories of his school days on our campus. He promises to return sometime this fall to offer Mass with our children at one of their weekly all school Masses.

Join me this weekend in thanking God for giving us these newly ordained priests. Additionally, I ask your prayers that God will give our diocese more seminarians (and priests), that more young men truly discern God's will in their lives and respond generously to his call to a lifetime of service as priests.

For those parishioners who regularly visit the cemetery, you'll notice this summer that we will be making a few improvements. In the next few weeks, a new water pump will be installed and improvements will be made to the drainage system.

The current water pump will be replaced with a modern stainless-steel pump. The goal of this pump is to make water more accessible while still maintaining the natural ambiance of the cemetery. The drainage improvement project will begin along Florita Lane; the last asphalt drive that runs east to west along the back of the cemetery.

Leadership.

St. Maria Goretti (1890-1902) was a courageous



young woman in Italy who defended her moral virtue by refusing the advances of a young man. Despite being mortally wounded by the man, she forgave him before her death. While in prison, her murderer experienced a vision of St. Maria. He repented of his sin and was converted to the faith, even attending her canonization ceremony. A moral virtue is a habitual and firm disposition to do the good. Moral virtue is the main source for a good and happy life, whether for the community, a family, or each individual. The virtues are acquired by education, by deliberate acts, and by perseverance and discipline. As the source of all good, God helps us grow in virtue through the power of his Holy Spirit. At Saint Rose School we seek to promote, model, and coach growth in virtue—imitating Jesus himself--helping each person to grow in character and to set out on the path to a happy life. The student selected for this award is recognized for his or her moral character, which is evident to his or her classmates and teachers.



# Father Jacob Livecchi



My name is Dcn. Jacob Livecchi and my home parish is St. Ignatius in Oregon. I grew up in a large Catholic family of ten kids (I am number five). I was homeschooled and after graduating from high school in 2015, I went to the University of Toledo. After one year of college where I studied visual arts, I felt the Lord calling me to something more. I felt within my heart the Lord calling me to discern the priesthood. So, I entered college seminary at the Pontifical College Josephinum in Columbus studying philosophy. I finished my Bachelor of Philosophy and graduated in 2019 from Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. I then began my theological studies at the Pontifical North American College in Rome. I graduated in June 2022 with a Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology from the Pontifical Gregorian University. I spent my internship year serving at three parishes: St. John the Evangelist in Delphos, St. John the Baptist in Landeck, and St. Patrick in Spencerville. At the end of my internship year, I was ordained a transitional deacon. Last year I returned to Rome to complete my last year of seminary formation.

As I near priesthood ordination I am filled with excitement and gratitude. I am honored and humbled by what God has done in my life with my simple yes to follow his will. I entered seminary not convinced I wanted to be a priest, today I could never imagine doing anything else. I am also aware that I am not approaching this great sacrament on my own strength. I am able to approach the sacrament priesthood because of all the prayers, support, and formation that I have received from all of you, but most of all because of God's great grace.

# Father Chris Turner



My name is Deacon Chris Turner and my home parish is St. John XXIII in Perrysburg. I am the son of John and Theresa, the brother of Sara, and the uncle of Reese and Lucy. I graduated from Central Catholic High School in 2004 and went to The Ohio State University following that. My plan was to run a large resort or hotel, and as a result, I received a degree in Hospitality Management in 2008. However, God had other plans, and upon graduation he called me to serve in youth ministry instead. I was the youth minister at St. Catherine Parish in Toledo for two years and then moved to Atlanta to become Events Director for Life Teen International. After serving in that role for three years, I missed parish life and became a youth minister again at St. Ann in Marietta, GA. It was at St. Ann that I fell in love with parish life and first felt the call to become a priest. While I loved living in Atlanta, Toledo was always home to me and I knew I needed to go back home to discern my vocation. As a result, I entered seminary formation in 2017 for the Diocese of Toledo. force. The number of children in our community living in poverty and in need of resources is growing. We invite you to consider becoming a member to help us reach out to more children here in northwest Ohio. We currently have over 200 members who donate over 10,000 service hours annually.

CCS Toledo volunteer members can choose to participate in a variety of programs and projects offered to serve the needs of underserved children. CCS Toledo's largest program is CLOTH-A-CHILD. Each Fall the organization purchases and distributes over 2,000 new winter coats, hats and gloves to children from birth to eighth grade. Each child also receives an age-appropriate new book to promote literacy and last year a hygiene bag was included for students in grades 4-8.

The LAYETTE program supplies a newborn layette package full of essential items for underserved new mothers to take home with their newborns. We supply over 1,000 layettes each year to local hospitals and social service agencies for distribution to moms in need of these resources. Tutoring students in Reading and Math skills at four local elementary schools is a favorite program for CCS Toledo members. Running and staffing the school libraries at two of the schools is also a CCS Toledo program.

CCS Toledo offers additional volunteer programs; there is something for everyone! Our motto is "Nothing is ever too much to do for a child". CCS Toledo members joyfully make this a reality!
