## NOT SO INSIGNIFICANT

Whenever I author an article for the bulletin, I pray for something to inspire me and for the Holy Spirit to give me the right words. I am writing fresh off the 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary time where we heard in the Gospel the story of the multiplication of the fishes and loaves. It happens to be one of my favorite gospel readings! Of course, if you know me, I say that a lot about the Gospels! But to be honest, it is not just the Gospel but also a reflection from a priest in Indiana that really inspired me. You see, when I was reading the gospel, the boy who had the fish and bread really stuck out to me. I thought how lucky he was there. How would the story have played out if he had not been there? But Fr. Hahn, (the priest for Indy) hit the “nail on the head” when he mentioned the boy and he used the word *insignificant*. The boy seems insignificant, yet he was so important to the miracle Jesus was to perform and the lesson we all can learn.

We often feel *insignificant*. If you are anything like me, we often think “what do I have to offer when it comes to serving God or playing a part in His plan?” We question ourselves and our ability to share our faith. We do not think we are smart enough or that we know enough. We compare ourselves to others. But you see, we all have something to offer; after all, God gave each of us unique gifts and talents. He created us — each of us — uniquely. He gifted each of us with many talents. He only asks us to share those gifts and talents with others. We may not be able to perform great miracles, but we can share our love of Christ with others. We can be living witnesses of our faith at work or within our circle of friends. When the opportunity presents itself, we can share with others about our faith or be so bold as to invite a friend to weekend Mass or a parish activity. This is how we play a *significant* role in God’s plan; we use our lives to evangelize. Yes, I know that sounds scary, but to really evangelize means to share the gospel. And through our baptism, each of us is called to do just that – evangelize or in other words we are called to live and share our faith. But how do we do that?

There are many ways that we, *insignificant* as we may feel, can play a *significant* role in the life of our parish. There are many ministries where we can find an outlet for our talents, time or simply to share our love with others. We have many ministries around the parish in need of you and your talents. There are

opportunities for all of us, depending on how we would like to “evangelize.” Inviting someone to join RCIA is a huge evangelization move and especially important to the life of the church, but there are many ways to share the gospel message of love with others. We have ministries of service such as visiting the sick and homebound, the sunshine committee who host lunches for those mourning a loved one, the St. Vincent de Paul society who serve those in need and the SJA food pantry. The Parish Life Committee is a ministry of volunteers who work to foster discipleship through community engagement. We also have a ministry for those who love to garden, CYO coaching for those who like to work with student athletes, catechist who teach religious education and many other opportunities to share faith with others. These are just a few ways for each of us to make a small but *significant* contribution to our parish community.

In this week’s Gospel we see Jesus telling people “I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst.” Jesus is offering us the gift of himself – the bread of eternal life. The people in today’s gospel want a sign. It is as the feeding of a crowd of 5,000 was not enough of a sign. The people want another sign! They failed to see that God was already providing for their needs by sending His Son. Often it is easy to overlook or take for granted the miracle of the Eucharist. Just like those people in Capernaum we fail to see the miracle right before us. After our participation in the Eucharistic feast, we are sent out to share the message of the Gospel; you may notice the deacon of the Mass always sends us out with a declaration that begins with the word GO. The church is telling us to GO and live a life of service sharing the love of Christ with others.

I would like to leave you with a question, one I ask myself a lot these days; “What can I do to serve God today?” The answer may seem *insignificant* to you, but it may be *significant* to God’s plan!

\*\*Shameless plus – we will be hosting a liturgical ministry fair in September and a service ministry fair later in the fall. I am hoping to have “planted a seed” and that when the time comes, you will consider being a part of one our many ministries!

## SOME CATECHESIS ON THE HOLY EUCHARIST, CONTINUED...

This is the next part in a series of catechetical selections from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' document, "Happy Are Those Who Are Called to His Supper: *On Preparing to Receive Christ Worthily in the Eucharist.*" You can find this document in its entirety at the USCCB website:

### 5. HOW CAN WE PREPARE TO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION MORE WORTHILY?

The Mass is not simply a private encounter between an individual and Jesus Christ. In a mystical manner, the whole Church is present in every celebration of the Mass, including the angels and the martyrs and saints of all ages. While the celebration of the Eucharist itself is a communal act, the benefit that each individual receives from the Eucharistic celebration depends on the way he or she approaches the sacrament. We would like to point out various ways in which each individual can better prepare himself or herself for Mass and can enter more deeply into the Eucharistic celebration, in order to receive the Body and Blood of Christ more worthily. There are two interrelated ways in which we foster the worthy reception of Holy Communion. One is through "remote preparation," and the other is through "proximate preparation." The first has to do with how we live our Christian lives every day. The second has to do with how we come to and participate in the Eucharistic liturgy itself.

*Remote preparation* includes the following:

- *Regular prayer and Scripture reading*  
Both allow the Holy Spirit to work within us and so engender a love for Jesus and a desire to do the will of the Father in our lives. Especially recommended is the Liturgy of the Hours, which is the prayer of the Church with Christ and through Christ to the Father. All of these are particularly appropriate before the Blessed Sacrament.
- *Faithful and loving fulfillment of the duties and responsibilities of our state in life*  
These responsibilities will differ insofar as one is a single person, a spouse, or a parent; a child, adolescent, or young adult; a grandparent; a bishop, priest, deacon, or one in consecrated life; a worker or retired person; one who is healthy or one who is infirm. It is by faithfully living out in our daily lives the call of the Gospel to love God and our neighbor—especially the poor and the vulnerable—that we grow in charity, and so draw closer to Jesus and to one another.
- *Daily repentance of sin and regular participation in the Sacrament of Penance*  
Sin undermines and weakens our communion not only with the Blessed Trinity but also with one another. Therefore, in order to overcome the damage caused by

sin, we are called to daily repentance and to regular participation in the Sacrament of Penance. Briefly examining our consciences and making an act of contrition, such as before retiring at night, helps guide our repentance and fosters holiness of life. Through these means, not only are the destructive forces of sin vanquished in our lives, but love is once more inflamed for God and for others. Communion is healed and strengthened.

Furthermore, if we are conscious of having committed a mortal sin, we are obliged to confess it in the Sacrament of Penance with true sorrow and a purpose of amendment before receiving Holy Communion. If a grave reason for approaching the Eucharist exists and the opportunity for confession is lacking, we are permitted to receive Holy Communion provided that we first make an act of perfect contrition and resolve to go to Confession as soon as possible thereafter. It should be noted that, while Confession is not required before receiving Holy Communion when one is not conscious of having committed a mortal sin, frequent Confession is strongly encouraged as an aid to growth in holiness. Moreover, the frequent reception of Holy Communion strengthens us against temptation and sin and helps us cultivate a life of virtue.

*Proximate preparation* includes the following:

- *Prayerful recollection*  
We should prayerfully recollect ourselves prior to coming to Mass. We should strive to arrive on time, allowing ourselves to prepare our minds and hearts for the liturgy. Upon entering the church, we should maintain reverent silence so that we and those around us are able to pray before Mass begins. This will ensure that we are at peace within ourselves and with others. Such recollection helps to eliminate distractions and allows us to focus more easily on the great mystery of the Eucharistic celebration in which we are about to participate. A prayerful and reflective reading of the Scripture selections for the Mass of the day will help make our hearts and minds ready to receive God's Word more deeply.
- *The Eucharistic fast*  
We are required to keep the Eucharistic fast, that is, refraining from food and drink (except for water and medicines) for at least one hour prior to receiving Holy Communion. This fast demonstrates reverence and respect for the Body and Blood of Christ that we are going to receive. It also teaches us to hunger for Jesus in Holy Communion.
- *Appropriate attire*  
We should also come to the sacred liturgy appropriately dressed. As Christians we should dress in a modest manner, wearing clothes that reflect our reverence for God and that manifest our respect for the dignity of the liturgy and for one another.

## PREP REGISTRATION AND DEADLINE - AUGUST 15

If your child is not enrolled in a Catholic school where part of the curriculum includes religion, then our Parish Religious Education Program is here to help you with faith formation for your children. We are accepting registrations right now. Forms are available in the narthex on the "Welcome Table", or you can visit the parish website and click on the link for PREP Registration to download the form. You can also pay your registration fee by clicking on the "we share" button and following the prompts. We will get an email alerting us that you have completed this step. New this year we will also host a registration weekend August 14 and 15 after all Masses where you can register your children and pay this year's fees in person. Please note: all 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders wishing to make their First Communion in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade must be registered. Those wishing to be confirmed in 8<sup>th</sup> grade must attend religious education for a minimum of 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade. We need to order books and supplies, so *we need your registration and fee paid by AUGUST 15*. PREP begins with orientation on September 1 at 6:30 p.m. in the church for parents and students.


