DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

This Sunday marks the last “green Sunday” for a while, as this week’s Ash Wednesday kicks off the great season of Lent. Our scripture readings today give us the image of a tree bearing good fruit. So, by God’s grace, are we to bear good fruit for the Lord. The word “lent” comes from the old English word for spring or springtime. The Lenten season, therefore, is a spiritual springtime—a time for spiritual growth and new life. Have you made any special plans for observing the Lenten season? The Church’s liturgy, devotions, and traditions offer many options that help draw us closer to Christ and His Cross. Whatever you choose, remember that it’s by being open to God’s grace that we bear good fruit for the Lord. The tree bears good fruit by being deeply rooted in rich soil and watered by rain from above. This Lent, we respond to the Lord’s invitation to sink our spiritual roots ever more deeply into the mystery of His death and resurrection. Nourished by the grace of the sacraments and prayer, we will indeed bear good fruit for the Lord, ready to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus at Easter, the “first fruits of a new creation.” Have a great Lent!

COMING THIS MONTH: CLARITY FOR MISSION

In the coming weeks, you will be invited to complete a survey, giving your input on the state of our parish life and ministry: what we do well, what needs to be improved, what we need to focus on, etc. With the assistance of the Diocese of Toledo Office of Family Life and Discipleship, the survey results will be used to help us set goals and action plans for the parish for the coming years. It’s a kind of “strategic planning” process that we are calling “Clarity for Mission.” Your input will help clarify the mission and ministry of the parish. The survey will be on-line via a QR code, but a “hard copy” option will be available for parishioners who prefer to complete the survey that way. The survey is designed to take about 10 minutes to complete. Your input will be anonymous. Your input is important. More information on this will be coming next week. COMFORT QUILTS

The Comfort Quilt group will be distributing Comfort Quilts after all Masses next weekend. The quilts are for anyone in need of comfort or prayers. There is no charge for the quilts. They are a gift from the Parish. Stop by our table in the Narthex.

FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. Those who are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.

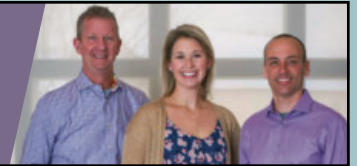
