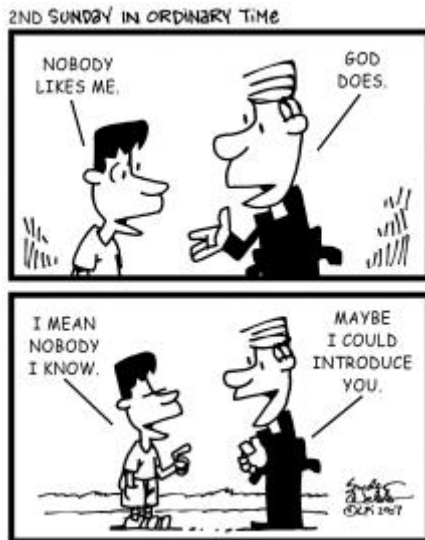
Food for Thought

Pastor's Paragraphs

I have a problem, and there are a number of possible solutions.

Before I was ordained, the one thing that terrified me most was preaching. Of course it was something totally new for me at Ordination. However, I found that I loved preparing homilies and delivering them.

I received good feedback from parishioners. In general, people thought my content was good, and my delivery was good. I always wrote out the text of my homilies. I did not exactly read the text, but it helped me to say things succinctly. My homilies were always between seven and ten minutes long.

As the years went on (can't believe it is 35 years this year), my ministry mostly consisted of teaching, administration and preaching.

Now to my problem: I love to preach! Over the years, my homily content matured, I dropped writing the text, and my homilies got longer.

What I found was that when I got good feedback from the congregation, the more comfortable and enthusiastic I became. When I say feedback, I mean something very specific. If you are unaccustomed to public speaking you might not understand this.

When I know that people are listening to me, when their body language seems to let me know they are engaged, I am encouraged. That is exactly what is happening now .

Hence, the problem. I can easily preach for a half hour and not even realize it.

I know that is too long. People may be listening, but their backsides are saying "Father, please wrap it up." I recognize the problem here, and I am committed to disciplining myself, and once again preaching seven to ten minutes.
