
Marriage: Arrangements must be made with the parish priest at least six months prior to the anticipated celebration.

Therefore, when he was raised from the dead,
his disciples remembered that he had said this,
and they came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus
had spoken. While he was in Jerusalem for the feast of
Passover, many began to believe in his name when they saw
the signs he was doing. But Jesus would not trust himself to
them because he knew them all, and did not need anyone to
testify about human nature. He himself understood it well.

From Fr. Dan...

With a gradual decrease in the number of new Covid cases and more people getting vaccinated, we here at St. Catherine Labouré Parish, in both of our churches, are seeing a gradual increase in our Sunday Mass attendance in recent weeks. That is certainly a wonderful and welcomed sign that even though the *obligation* to attend Mass for Sunday is still suspended, and even though there is a option of *watching* the Mass on our own parish website or from countless other places through a variety of media, more and more people have the desire to gather in person and celebrate the Mass. One important purpose and role of the Church, throughout history, has been to enable people to do just that. In our current circumstances, the goal has been to do that in a way that is as safe and responsible as possible. In our parish community, we resumed our full schedule of Masses, Reconciliation, and Eucharistic Adoration as early as possible (much earlier than many other parishes, I might add). But there were some modifications to do so safely: maintaining distance between people by closing off every other pew; requiring the use of masks in church, promoting the use of hand sanitizer by having dispensers available throughout the church; and cleaning the church between Masses. People who attend our Masses have been cooperative with these measures, for which I am grateful! However, as all these things continue, at least for the foreseeable future, I am asking for your continued cooperation and perhaps even in a greater way. As the number of those attending Mass increases, there also needs to be an increased effort to accommodate more people. The main way for that to happen is in seating. If you are the first and/or only person in a particular pew, please move to the center of the pew so that people who come after can find seating without climbing over someone or having to ask someone to move. (While some people may have a reason that they need to sit on an aisle, hopefully they could be attentive to others looking for a seat and be ready to step out of the pew so others are able to get past them and make use of the rest of the pew.) Finding seats for people isn't just something the ushers can help with, but hopefully something that everyone in a welcoming Catholic parish community would be mindful of.

We'd like to accommodate as many people as we can, but we do still need to observe safety protocols. Even with that, and although our staff has done a tremendous job keeping the churches clean, for those who have to be more cautious (e.g. the elderly, those not vaccinated, those with underlying health conditions) there IS risk involved in coming to Mass. For some, watching the Mass remotely might still be the safest option; for others, attending a less-crowded weekday Mass instead of a Sunday Mass may be a good idea; or even going to one of the Sunday Masses that tends to have lighter attendance (such as the 8:00 AM or 4:30 PM Masses) may be helpful.

We have dealt with this pandemic for a year now, and while it's tested everyone's patience and been the cause of great anxiety, frustration, anger, fear, etc., there is "light at the end of the tunnel." Lent is a perfect time to reaffirm our spirit of cooperation, practice our patience, and work on our compassion and understanding with other members of the Body of Christ as we gather to celebrate the Mass.

* * * * *

Regarding Mass, one important consideration throughout this pandemic, has been the safe, reverent and efficient distribution of Communion. As Mass attendance increases, so do the length of the Communion lines. To keep the lines moving and avoid congestion in the aisles or in the front of the church, we have only been distributing from two places at St. Joan and three places at St. Louise. However, at St. Louise, as Ministers of Communion on the side aisles finish, they move toward the center aisle to help with what is typically the longest line of people. If you are in the center aisle to receive, please be mindful that this is happening and make use of the additional ministers. Often times, the priest in the center aisle, finds himself with a line all the way to the back of the church, while Ministers of Communion on one or both sides of him stand there idle. We all sanitize our hands before we begin distributing and as needed during the distribution. Plus, we are all distributing the very same Body of Christ. Obviously, one can go to whomever they want to receive Communion, but it does provide for a smoother process if we make use of all the Ministers who are assisting.

* * * * *

To make our Lenten journey a fruitful time of growing closer to God and becoming more Christ-like, we should make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in order to weed sin out of our lives and receive God's healing mercy and grace. This coming week, across our Diocese, there will be a special opportunity to make use of this Sacrament. "THE LIGHT IS ON FOR YOU" has become a Lenten tradition in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. Every parish of the Diocese will have a church open and a priest available at the same time on the same day as an invitation to prayer and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

**This event will take place on Wednesday, March 10, from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM.
Within St. Catherine Labouré Parish, on this evening, there will be two priests available
at St. Louise de Marillac Church during this time period.**

(Due to the Faith Formation Classes and the Edge Program at St. Joan of Arc that evening, the Sacrament of Reconciliation will not be available at that site.)

Many Catholics have discovered what a powerful tool this Sacrament can be in their on-going efforts to grow closer to Christ and, as a result, make regular use of it. However, other Catholics, for various reasons, may make use of this Sacrament only rarely, or not at all. This is a perfect opportunity to go to Confession, especially if it's been a while. If you forget how, just tell the priest that and he can help you through it. The Diocese has also provided a web site ([HTTP://DIOPITT.ORG/LIGHTISON](http://DIOPITT.ORG/LIGHTISON)) with a variety of information to assist in every aspect of making a good Confession. There will also be printed information at each of our churches to assist in one's examination of conscience, the Rite of the Sacrament (i.e. how to do it, what to say,...), and the Act of Contrition.

This Lent can be a powerful season to make use of the gift God gives us through this Sacrament, thus renewing our Baptismal grace and gaining God's help in amending our lives.

At Saint Joan of Arc Church please leave your donations in the back of church and those in need can call the office for assistance Monday-Thursday.






LITURGY OF THE HOURS MORNING PRAYER

PARISH NURSE MINISTRY

Celiac Disease and Gluten Sensitivity

Gluten is a protein found in wheat, barley, and rye. If you are experiencing symptoms like abdominal pain, stomach upset or bloating after consuming gluten you should be tested for Celiac disease, an autoimmune condition where gluten triggers an inflammatory response in the lining of the small intestines and can cause a host of serious problems. Getting tested involves a blood test for the presence of antibodies against a protein called tissue transglutaminase and is confirmed through an intestinal biopsy. Those with similar symptoms, but do not test positive for celiac disease, may have non-celiac gluten sensitivity. This differs from celiac disease in that it does NOT result in the serious effects of inflammation in the intestines. Current recommendations for those with celiac disease and non-celiac gluten sensitivity should follow a gluten-free diet.




