Chili Cook-off

Calling all chili chefs! Parish Life is hosting our second Chili Cookoff on Friday, January 28 at 6:00 pm in the PLC. Please plan to make and share your secret beef, chicken, veggie, or any chili recipe! If you are not able to submit a recipe, please join us for tasting and voting for the best chili in the PLC! Entry rules below:

ST. AUGUSTINE CHURCH CHILI COOK-OFF RULES - FRIDAY, JANUARY 28, 2022

- Entries may be an individual, team of two, or a family. All entrants must register by Friday, January 21, 2020 and submit their chili name to Leslie Kelly at Idaviskelly@comcast.net.
- For this Chili Cook-Off, chili will be defined as ANY combination of meat, spices and seasonings along with tomatoes, onions, peppers, beans, and liquid such as broth. Whatever you call CHILI, then we will call chili. You may enter meatless, beanless, beef, pork, chicken, turkey, or venison chili. All entries must be homemade.
- You may choose to provide garnishes such as but not limited to cheese, cilantro, sour cream, crackers, Fritos, etc. This is only optional.
- Please bring chili in a crock pot to Parish Life Center by 5:30 pm on Friday, January 28. Crock pots will be plugged in and left on "warm" setting
 until 6:00 when judging will begin. Judging and tasting will end at 6:30 when dinner will be served with remaining chili. There will be no food prep
 on location.
- Please bring your own ladle and serving utensils. Spoons and bowls for judging and dinner will be supplied.
- Labels with your submitted chili name will be provided day of event. Please list ingredients on an index card for food allergy info.
- Judging will be based on "People's Choice"-please see below.
- After judging, chili will be served as dinner.

CHILI COOK OFF JUDGING

Before judging begins, entrants will fill small labeled cups with samples of their own chili. At the time of judging, all attendees will be given a piece
of paper with chili names/titles. Attendees will circle their top two choices. Adults and children will put their votes in corresponding voting boxes.
After all votes are cast, votes will be counted and all winners announced. Winners will be "First Place", "Second Place", and "Kids' Choice".
