



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As we begin 2022, we are still in the Christmas season for the Church and are presented with two great feast days, the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord, that remind us of the Light of the World that is now in our midst. The first feast day, the

Epiphany, reminds us of how the Light of the World did not stay hidden or come for just one small group of people. That Light came to draw all to the love and mercy of God. When the Magi sought and found the Lord, it reminds us that even those who do not know Christ are searching for Him. You and I know many people like this, and we even try to encourage them to come to Church or to begin a prayer life. Often times they refuse. Let us not be discouraged. May this feast day remind us that the Lord's light can still draw everyone to Him. Let us invoke the Holy Family and the Magi to pray that our family, friends, and all who we encounter may come to know the Lord.


The second feast day we celebrate during this month is the Baptism of the Lord. While it might seem like a big jump from His nativity and the visit of the Magi, having this feast day in the Christmas season reminds us of the Light that you and I received at our baptism. Our Lord did not need to be baptized. However, His baptism sanctified water and humanity itself. This feast day serves as the transition between the seasons of Christmas and Ordinary Time, reminding us that as we focus, once again, on the mission of our Lord and are called to follow His example, we have received His spirit and have been illuminated by the Light of the World.

I hope this provides you some insight as we celebrate the Christmas season, even if the world has already moved on. Let us continue to celebrate this season with great joy and share it with others.

Finally, I would like to provide some practical updates. First, this bulletin is being used for two weekends due to our office being closed through January 3. Second, I will be out the first week of January for a trip that was postponed last year due to COVID restrictions. I will be returning on Sunday, January 9. Third, please offer a prayer for our Confirmation candidates, as they will be confirmed by Bishop Duca on Friday, January 14 at a special Mass here at Immaculate Conception.

STUMP THE DEACON!

Why does the Catholic Church refer to our Eucharistic Celebration as the "Sacrifice of the Mass?" How can there be another sacrifice because St. Paul says in his letter to the Hebrews that there is only one sacrifice, "For by one offering He has made perfect forever those who are being consecrated" (Heb 10:14).

St. Paul was correct; there is only one sacrifice, but it is re-presented at each Mass. Here is what the *Catechism of the Catholic Church states:*

"The Eucharist [the Mass] is thus a sacrifice because it re-presents (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross... at the Last Supper 'on the night when He was betrayed,' [He wanted] to leave to His beloved spouse the Church a visible sacrifice (as the nature of man demands) by which the bloody sacrifice which He was to accomplish once for all on the cross would be re-presented, its memory perpetuated until the end of the world, and its salutary [beneficial] power be applied to the forgiveness of the sins we daily commit" (CCC 1366).

"In the sense of Sacred Scripture the memorial is not merely the recollection of past events but the proclamation of the mighty works wrought by God for men. In the liturgical celebration of these events, they become in a certain way present and real. This is how Israel understands its liberation from Egypt: every time Passover is celebrated, the Exodus events are made present to the memory of believers so that they may conform their lives to them" (CCC 1363). The Mass is the celebration of Christ's Passover, His sacrifice on the cross.

"The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice: 'The victim is one and the same: the same now offers through the ministry of priests, who then offered Himself on the cross; only the manner of offering is different. And since in this divine sacrifice which is celebrated in the Mass, the same Christ who offered himself once in a bloody manner on the altar of the cross is contained and is offered in an unbloody manner. . .'" (CCC 1367).

During the consecration at Mass, we hear, "This is my Body, which will be given up for you...this is the chalice of My Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in memory of Me." Another translation of the last sentence would be "Offer this in memory of me," words of sacrifice.

So, every Mass is a sacrifice, not a bloody one, but an unbloody one, exactly why Jesus said "Do this in memory of Me."


The RCIA Process is a Journey of Faith:

The Catechumenate Phase marks the beginning of formal instruction in the Catholic faith. Prospective Catholics learn the basics of the faith and how to live the Catholic way of life. During this time, the catechumen/candidate will take part in the Sunday Liturgy of the Word although they do not participate in the Eucharist. With a blessing, they will leave the assembly after the homily, and they will continue instruction with a catechist. This dismissal is a powerful sign and public witness to the community of faith of the sincerity and determination of those seeking to become Catholic. It shows that they are seriously pursuing their call and preparing to become full-fledged, committed Catholics. The Catechumenate phase will resume January 9.
