Dear fellow parishioners, in this weekend of Lent we hear of the Transfiguration of Jesus. The apostles were taken aback at the experience and I believe were troubled and excited by it. I am sure they did not know how to even take the experience and I am sure were scratching their heads, at least figuratively.

This same type of thing happens, or should, when we encounter Christ in a major way and even in the small ways. Excited and troubled... because in the very least we have been affected by God and Wow! that should move us to think that the most powerful God has thought enough to do something for us.

I saw on a news station this past week that a young woman had used a majorly known pop star's music for her gymnastic routine and it "went viral" on social media. The pop star contacted the young woman and a brief part of their interaction was shown and the pop star praised her on her routine. The young woman was in tears and said: "This means everything to me." I was happy for the girl, but I always look through a filter and I wondered out loud (Lilo didn't care...) if she knew about the sacrifice Jesus made for her and would she respond the same way. I then applied the thought to myself... when was the last time I really expressed that to God, myself... To be honest, I don't remember when it was.

Now, that doesn't mean I am not grateful or that I don't thank God, because I do many times a day. But, to tell Him that He, anything/everything He has done for me especially His passion and death "means everything to me", I can't put a date or time on it. I put out the challenge to you who are reading this... when was the last time you said "this means everything to me" to God?

I have been researching and gathering some various sets of Stations of the Cross. The phrase "means everything to me" is in at least one of them, but I wonder how many folks really pay attention to it and say it wholeheartedly and really mean it. I admit it myself, I don't always pay full, mindful attention in devotionals and I am sure I miss a lot of depth and realization especially of how much the passion and death of Jesus SHOULD MEAN EVERYTHING TO ME.

I have decided as my Lenten practice this year to focus on the depth of the words I am praying/saying and not just saying them. I want to honestly think/discern... "do I mean this, really"? Then to act accordingly if the answer "yes". While I always want to answer this way, in reality... I don't. The back half of my "penance" is to ask for the graces I need to really mean it. I invite you – give it a try this year.

Let us pray for each other – know that you are in mine always.

### CRS RICE BOWL:

#### **Lord, when did we see you? —Matthew 25:38**

Matthew's Gospel invites us to remember that we are responsible for helping all our sisters and brothers, even those who are strangers to us. When we do this, we care for Christ. The season of Lent gives us a wonderful opportunity to reflect and make room in our hearts to welcome the stranger. Through our prayer, we encounter Jesus, who is present in the face of every member of our human family. When we fast, we encounter the obstacles that stop us from fully loving God and our neighbor. When we give alms, we share what we have with others. This Lent CRS Rice Bowl takes us to three countries—Madagascar, El Salvador and Timor-Leste. Hunger and malnutrition, which happens when we don't get the right amount of nutrients, are challenges that too many families face each day. One out of every 10 people worldwide don't have enough to eat. Sometimes this is caused by natural disasters like floods and droughts. Other times, families don't have enough money to buy the food they need, or the food they can get doesn't have all the vitamins and minerals they need to stay healthy. CRS helps communities find solutions to each of these problems. Farming families learn new skills and grow stronger, healthier harvests. Communities train health care workers so children can get regular check-ups and parents can learn new nutritious recipes to make sure their families get a balanced diet. People in vulnerable areas prepare for unpredictable weather that could destroy crops. Jesus calls us to help those in need. Our Lenten prayers, fasting and sacrificial gifts help us answer this call.

### Lenten recipe - Parmesan Baked Fish

1 lb fish fillets	1/2 tsp dried dill
1/4 C flour or crushed crackers	2 Tbsp. butter or marg.
1/4 tsp onion powder	2 Tbsp grated Parmesan Cheese
1/8 tsp. salt	
1/8 tsp pepper	

Preheat oven to 450. In shallow bowl combine the flour, onion powder, salt, pepper and dill. dredge fish fillets in mixture. Coat a shallow baking dish with non stick spray. Place fish in baking dish. Drizzle melted butter over fish. Then sprinkle with parmesan cheese bake 7-10 minutes or until the fish flakes easily. You can add fresh herbs, too. Haddock, cod or sole filets work well.


## Disciple Maker Index Survey

This nationally recognized survey has been administered at parishes around the United States and Canada since 2013. **Our Lady of Mount Carmel**, as part of the Diocese of Columbus *Real Presence Real Future* planning process, will participate in this survey during Lent. The results from our parish survey will not only be used for information and planning for our own parish but will also be included in the national results which track trends, growth, and Church-related opportunities nationwide. This is an exciting opportunity for our parish, and I hope you will participate!

The DMI survey was developed by the Catholic Leadership Institute in conjunction with advising US bishops and Catholic lay leaders in 2013. The DMI Survey was created as a tool to help more Catholics to grow along their faith journey with Christ and to become more engaged in the community life of the parish. The DMI Survey seeks to provide parishioners an opportunity to reflect on their spiritual growth as well as provide parish leadership with invaluable insights regarding a parish's strengths and opportunities.

By **Our Lady of Mount Carmel** participating in this survey, the results will provide meaningful input about our parish as we begin our own planning process as part of *Real Presence Real Future*. The information from the DMI Survey will give insight into our priorities and into the allocation and realignment of resources over the next few years as our parish strives to help parishioners more effectively along their personal journey of faith.



### LIVE THE LITURGY Inspiration for the week


How is your Lent going so far? In changing the circumstances and order of our lives a bit, perhaps we can hear God's voice more clearly and drink more deeply of graced moments we experience. Having God as a friend always involves several things. First, there is God's call. We become attuned to the echo of God's voice in the depth of our souls calling and beckoning us to listen. Second, there is a request. We begin to see that God asks us to do certain things, to order our lives a particular way, and become more intentional in the choices we make. Third, there is trust. Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are. Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence. God's call came through a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." This is the call and the request. Can we give God our trust and do as God asks?
