**FROM THE
PASTOR'S DESK**

Dear fellow parishioners, something I have noticed is that God does not always give straight to the point answers. Yes, at times He does... but not always. Sometimes it is a new question or answer to a question that we didn't ask. As an example, it sometimes feels like God answers: "It's about 7:00 pm." when we've asked, "how are you doing today?". Look at the Gospel for today, Philip and Andrew ask Jesus if He would speak to the Greek group and Jesus goes into His famous "grain of wheat instruction", not quite the answer the two or the group for that matter were seeking.

I would hazard to guess that has happened to some of you who are reading this. You've asked for guidance, an answer, *something* and get an answer or response that is seemingly totally off the wall or not what you asked. It has happened to me. I know the Lord has changed topics on me many MANY times and I often end up thinking some variations of the following: "What?" "Huh?" "Where are we?" "How did we get here?" "Did I miss something?" Sometimes it is "where are You?" That last one has many dimensions...

In the book of Lamentations there is a passage that describes the difficulty of life and its effect in our lives and how depressing life is... but then changes course and says: "*but this I will hold as my reason to have hope, the mercies of the Lord are not exhausted; they are renewed each morning...*". It goes on but this part continues to come to me – well, sometimes I have to *really* force myself to bring it mind, to try to find balance. And that is where the first reading from Jeremiah comes into reality: "...*I will place my law within them and write it upon their hearts; I will be their God and they shall be My people.*"

God is confusing and confounding sometimes, for some us *a lot of the time*. He answers questions with questions. He gives laws that to go against our basic feelings: "love your enemies?" "Bless for those who persecute you? Bless and do not curse them?" *Are you REALLY SERIOUS God?* Yes. He is serious. When we begin to get God more and more into our heads and lives then another part of Jeremiah comes to bear: "*No longer will they[we] have need to teach their [our] friends and relatives how to know the Lord...*" we will be showing them then, "*all, from the least to the greatest, shall know...*" the Lord.

For some spiritual reading this week and as we approach Easter, I invite/urge you to read and ponder Psalm 51. It might bring you to be more open to loving the confounding part of God, because He wants to do Psalm 51 for us which is confounding in itself... *to save a sinner, He offered Himself as ransom.* Some thoughts to ponder this week.

Let us pray for each other – know that you are in mine always.

Liturgy Column

I bought a garden jar a month or two ago. It was a big mason jar with dirt in it, some tomato seeds and the lid had a couple of holes in it. It was drastically reduced in price, so it came home with me. I followed the directions and soon little tomato seedlings were sprouting. Right now, I have blossoms starting to open and now I am dreaming of fresh tomatoes! The scent of the tomato plant smells so good. It helps me focus because Spring and Summer are on their way.

I know you are wondering, why I am talking about tomatoes. In today's Gospel, Jesus talks about a grain of wheat. It would remain just a grain of wheat, but if it falls to the ground, it will produce much fruit. Jesus uses this parable to let his followers know he will be going forth to die. Because of this selfless act, the hold that death and evil have on us will forever be changed. Through Jesus' love for us, we are changed.

This Sunday, we can experience God's love and forgiveness first-hand by going to our Reconciliation Service at 4 PM. During this time of pandemic and unrest in our country, we probably have many things that we have said or done that need cleansing from our souls. Instead of harping on the bad that is happening, we need to pray for a change of heart and each other. Praying **for** peace of mind, what a novel idea! Maybe, you are feeling depressed and have said somethings to family that you wish were unsaid. Maybe, you have already asked for forgiveness of the family members, but it still weighs heavy on your heart. You can kick it to the curb by asking for God's forgiveness.

There will be another Day of Reconciliation on Monday, March 29 from 4-7pm here at Our Lady of Mount Carmel, more details will be coming soon.

Lenten Recipe

Tuna Pie with Egg Sauce: 2 eggs beaten; 3/4 tsp. Basil leaves; 1/2 C milk; 1/4 tsp. salt; 1 Tbsp butter, melted; 2 cans tuna drained and flaked; 1/4 C onion chopped; 2 Tbsp parsley minced, package of pre-made pie crust (or your own pie crust recipe). Mix all together, pour into a pastry lined pie pan. Top with pastry, poke holes to vent steam. crumble more parsley on top. Bake at 425 for 35-40 minutes. serve with egg sauce.

Egg Sauce: 1/4 C butter; 1/4 tsp. pepper; 1/4 C flour; 2 C milk; 1/2 tsp salt; 4 hard-boiled eggs, diced.

Melt butter, blend in flour, salt, pepper. Cook over low heat until smooth and bubbly. Stir in milk and heat to boiling stirring constantly. Boil and stir 1 minute, carefully stir in the eggs. Season to taste. Pour over the tuna pie.
