

Dear fellow parishioners, the dogwoods are beginning to bloom. I have always liked them – mainly because of the flowers. I liked them even before I was made aware of the *"Legend of the Dogwood"* while in seminary.

The Bible does not say what kind of wood was used for the cross. While it is common in China, Japan and the US it is not in the Holy Land. So, it is unlikely the cross was actually made from the dogwood; however, “all things are possible for God” (Mt 19:26). Dogwood wood is very hard, but trees large and straight enough to provide lumber for a cross are extremely rare. The legend of it, similar to the shamrock in Ireland, probably came about to remind one of the crucifixion. I would like to share it with you as it was described to me with a few enhancements from my own observations.

Legend has it that the cross was made from the dogwood which at that time grew straight and strong. In response to the remorse offered from the tree, the Lord blessed the tree in the following way so that it could never again be used in such a terrible way, yet be a beautiful reminder of His sacrifice:

- you will still be strong, but narrow and gnarled so you can never again be used as an implement of torture;

- you will bloom in the spring as a reminder of the new life I give through my death and resurrection;

- your flower will take the shape of a cross with two longer and shorter petals with a “thorny” center so all who see it will be reminded of the cross on which I died and the thorny crown placed on My head;

- each petal will have an indentation at the tip and be tinged in reddish brown as a reminder of the nail holes and of My blood shed for all;

- each flower will face the sky offering for every person My sacrifice to The Father;

- your seeds that come in the fall will be food for birds and resemble drops of blood to remind people of the sustenance of My Blood in the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Jesus then said to the tree: “All who see you will remember Me, crucified on a cross made from the dogwood tree. Now cherished and protected, you shall be a reminder to all of My agony and My love.”

Good stuff, huh? Speaking of Holy Communion – please remember in prayer the little ones in our sister parishes who will be receiving their First Communion this weekend. Pray that the sacrament will continue to bring them to closer unity with God every day of their lives. This year is the 50th year since my first reception – even after all these years I still cherish the gift each time I receive our Precious Lord.

Let us pray for each other this Easter season. Know that you are in mine always!


A Parents Prayer
