Dear fellow parishioners, the Gospel this week continues with John's "Bread of Life Discourse" and even as much as I would like to expound on the Eucharist, St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians again is hitting me. Partially because of some personal happenings that are affecting my spirit. My vocation is not in question, it is just this letter (think Roberta Flack's *Killing Me Softly with His Song*). I would hazard to guess, others are affected as well. Pray for us in quandary.

St. Paul addresses some heart-held negatives that need to be removed from our spirits; those coming from interactions with others and that which *we chose for ourselves*. I tell you; it can be very difficult. We might *think* we have, but like that stray animal you feed... it comes back, even if it was gone for long time. A triggered memory, maybe by contact from the person, situation, etc. and "boom" right back are the old feelings and practices! Then wound/s opened and right back to the beginning. Negativity messes up our spirit, and since we are united in one Spirit, it grieves the Holy Spirit and the church at large as well. As I've read, "mess with me and you mess with the whole 'darn trailer park'". This is because of our connection in Christ: Body of Christ, Eucharist, John 6 – see how it all works together? Wonderful isn't it!?

Now, we may not have to deal with *everything* with the person/situation because we have come to terms, but we may have to deal with the root (again), just like weeding a garden. You can *say* you've "weeded" when you take off the part that shows, but if you don't get *all* the root (and sometimes we can't) it grows back and sometimes stronger – thank you herbicide commercial. I saw this many moons ago and thought how true for our spirits as well – or at least, mine.

So, how do you properly "weed"? Well, first pray (I know cliché), but is the first and repeating step. We can't do anything without grace. That is why *we* need to pray for the graces *we* need and to pray also for others who need them. Nothing binds people like sorrow and negativity and nothing helps like prayer! How many times do "good stuff" get together happen and then break down to negativity? I have observed a lot of "adult beverage consumption celebrations" that revert to discussions of negativity. That is what Paul tells us to change our Spirit so outward fruit becomes "good": forgiving, compassionate, kindness not "bad" so to be the *real* Christ to others as we want Him for us. After praying – act! Do something to counter the negativity. Forgive – even if 70 times 7 times for the same thing, even daily. Offer the person/situation to God; and remember you have given God a "gift" and you don't want to continue to berate it do you? Then pray again for the grace to find peace, basically: *Rinse, repeat as necessary*.

Let us pray for one another; know that you are in mine always.

Liturgy Corner

Nourishment ...we all need it to keep our minds and bodies strong and healthy. But what about our spiritual nourishment? How are we preparing to meet Jesus when we are called home? What can we do to become closer to our Lord?

In today's First Reading, Elijah journeys into the desert where he gives up and asks God to take his life. God, however, has greater plans for Elijah. God sends an angel to Elijah, who has fallen asleep and is waiting to die. The angel orders Elijah to get up and eat, which Elijah does; however, Elijah lies down and falls asleep again. God sends the angel again who orders Elijah to get up and eat because the journey will be long. Elijah follows God's orders and is strengthened by the food so he may complete his journey.

This week's Gospel deals with Jesus telling the Jews, "I am the bread of life. No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him up on the last day." Again we are sent nourishment only this time it is heaven sent. Jesus becomes our nourishment and our redemption. It is our responsibility to accept this nourishment and use it to make us spiritually strong so as to be raised up on the last day. Each week we listen to God's word, receive the Most Holy Eucharist, offer praise to our Lord and are sent out into the community to spread the Good News. What wonderful spiritual food He gives us in the Mass to share with our Christian family! So, be open to the nourishment God provides for us. Like Elijah, our journey is long but God will provide.

“The opposite of love isn’t anger, its apathy.” While this quote rings true, when the result of anger is un-love, we have reached into a sinful area just as we do when we treat our faith with little concern. Thankfully, we have the perfect role model in Christ. Paul speaks of the sinful results of anger in today’s second reading. The reaction of Jesus’ adversaries to Him in today’s gospel preclude the anger that will lead to His crucifixion.
