Dear fellow parishioners, the Letter of James is one of my most referred to letters in the Bible. It is a to the point reference that answers the “all we want are the facts” issues of living out the Gospel. The Old Testament Book of Sirach is a very similar how to live book which is more fleshed out in presentation, though a dear female friend once declared that she didn’t think Sirach liked women, I responded with, “read it by adding men to it as well.”

James gives us the “why” of good works. The Catholic Church has faced a backlash regarding the doing of good works or donating to bypass conversion of heart and ways to buy their way into heaven. In some cases, it has been warranted, however, not in all. There were times/situations when some in the Church taught that the donating sums of money or tangible things would let a person to gain entrance to the glories of heaven or to “buy” forgiveness from the Church. That is not how it works. While remuneration may be considered a part of a penance, only repentance and conversion are the ways to forgiveness. But... that doesn’t mean one should *not* donate out of gratitude or remembrance.

When something is given for use in or to enhance the beauty of the liturgy, the person/s for which the item was given is remembered in prayer by direct thought and/or by mere use of the item. The donation of vestments, vessels (chalices, patens, ciboria), windows, buildings, etc. are practical example. Give – it makes a difference just as any prayer you might offer. God’s generosity will not be outdone... He takes everything and multiplies it.

Back to James, if you have been around me for any length of time, you will have heard me say “so what are you going to do with it?”. This is basically James’ message today: “*What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works?*” All blessings and well wishes are good but if you don’t do something to help to fulfill them well, they are just words. James indicates if you claim to be a follower of Christ and being part of His Body, you have to put your money or actions, or whatever, where your mouth is.

Jesus gives a similar spin by His statement, “*Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever ... loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it.*” Taking up a cross can include offering, without expecting anything back, what we hold precious: money, time, talents... these latter things might even be more precious than money to some. How about you? What can you do to be active in faith? What haven’t you done, that you ought, might and can? Some thoughts to ponder...

Let us pray for one another – know that you are in mine always.

Our son graduated from OTS exactly one month to the day after the attack. As I flew into Newark airport, not knowing our plane would pass the Statute of Liberty, I burst into tears seeing her standing there, remembering that horrible day.

So let us all pray for all our men and women who gave their lives for our country from the beginning of our existence, and for those who are serving now. For without them, we would not have our freedom to say or do, or even live our lives they way we want.

As Jesus said, "we must have faith, hope and love, but the greatest is love." May we take up our cross and follow Jesus, spreading faith, hope and love.
