Dear fellow parishioners,

This weekend the readings are ones that are part of a collection selected for weddings. The Church's stance on marriage sometimes brings up a lot of emotion, positive and negative depending on a person/s' situation/s. The ideal is upheld while striving to support those who have been hurt in the tumult of divorce/separation. It is difficult to keep the balance. I know; I have been with folks in their fallout of situations, emotions and disruptions of life. I had a person tell me they once walked out of Mass because of these readings due to the feelings that were too heavy on the person's heart and mind to stay. I sympathize and empathize because I know it is hard to face and/or relive harsh feelings, but... to ignore or "water down" the ideal is not the answer either. It requires a compassionate balance and I pray always to have the right balance when situations like this arise.

Marriage, like holy orders as a sacrament of vocation is to be held in the highest regard and esteem, even if societal norms seem to have come to consider it as potentially "temporary", entered into on a whim, lightly with little thought, preparation or sense of the reality. There is a difference between "a wedding" and "a marriage". The former is a moment or event; the latter is a way of life. Few media outlets seem to tout or celebrate the longevity of celebrity or well-known public figures' marriages as opposed to quickie or secret weddings or much more public break-ups. Those long-termers are not asked about how they strive and work to endure the difficulties or work to build up their marriages. They just must not be "interesting" enough.

While Holy Orders requires one person to make a decision that affects his life and those of family, friends as well, Marriage takes two to fully and completely agree, which is difficult, yet absolutely necessary. The two individuals ontologically change (metaphysical term meaning "how things are in their most basic/simple existence or being") into one couple. This ideal is still the ideal and some marriages are not ideal... for folks in those, we pray and work to save or comfort in loss of the ideal. Pray for those who are seeking this sacrament; may they be truly what God intends. Pray for those who do not have that ideal that those folks may find peace of heart and resolution to life situations associated with such loss.

Let us pray for one another – know that you are in mine always.

BISHOP ROBERT J. BRENNAN NAMED 8TH BISHOP OF BROOKLYN



COLUMBUS, OHIO – September 29, 2021 – The Vatican announced today that Pope Francis has appointed the Most Reverend Robert J. Brennan, Bishop of Columbus, as the Eighth Bishop of the Diocese of Brooklyn, New York.

The appointment was announced in Washington, D.C., this morning, by Archbishop Christophe Pierre, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States. Bishop Brennan will be introduced to the Diocese of Brooklyn at a news conference at 10 a.m. at the Co-Cathedral of St. Joseph, Brooklyn. A Mass of Installation for Bishop-Designate Robert Brennan will be celebrated on Tuesday, November 30, 2021 at 2 p.m. at the Co-Cathedral of St. Joseph.

"I have been very happy here in Ohio and am heartbroken that I will be leaving," Bishop Brennan said. "I came to know amazing people here, and there is tremendous sadness leaving you behind. As I prepare to return to New York, I am ready and eager to embrace the people of Brooklyn and Queens as their pastor. Knowing we are loved by Jesus, we will strive to show others his face, bearing the Joy of the Gospel and the Splendor of Truth. In the end, that's what it is all about – in Columbus, Brooklyn, and around the world.

"To the people of the Diocese of Columbus, I recognize this announcement comes as an enormous surprise, but we entrust ourselves to the Lord, and we will move forward confident that the Holy Spirit is the constant guide for the Church and its people, especially when a new bishop will be chosen to lead the Diocese of Columbus. All of you are in my prayers in a very special way today, and you will remain in my prayers and my heart every day of my life. Please pray for me as well. Continue placing your trust in our loving Lord and carry on this marvelous journey of faith that we have been on together these last two and a half years as fellow missionary disciples of our Lord and savior."

"In the selection of Bishop Robert Brennan, the Holy Father has called upon a native New Yorker to return to lead the faithful of Brooklyn and Queens" said Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio of Brooklyn. "On behalf of the Diocese of Brooklyn, I welcome Bishop Brennan who I have known for many years, with confidence in his ability to lead our Catholic community and build upon the pastoral achievements we have made. It has truly been an honor to serve as Bishop of the Diocese of Brooklyn for nearly 18 years.

"This is a historical moment for the Diocese of Brooklyn, which is a very active place, and Bishop Brennan's energy makes him a perfect choice. I ask for God's blessings on this transition so that the work of God, in service to His people, can effectively continue for the more than 1.2 million Catholics throughout Brooklyn and Queens," continued Bishop Nicholas DiMarzio.

The Vatican will announce a successor to Bishop Brennan at a future date. In the meantime, Bishop Brennan will lead the Diocese of Columbus until November 30. Then the diocesan College of Consultors will elect a diocesan administrator to lead until a new bishop is appointed and installed.

But we must also look at ourselves. Do we speak up for the innocent abortion victims? Do we promote pro-life values? Do we vote for pro-life politicians? Do we do anything tangible to protect the unborn?

We can definitely help change our society to become a culture of LIFE, but we must be active, informed and faithful witnesses.

Real Presence, Real Future reflections: Humility and Collaboration


Joseph Zaino, St. Margaret of Cortona Parish & RPRF Commission Member:
