

Dear fellow parishioners,

I have been using the Eucharistic Prayers for Various Needs during Advent. The wording has been inspiring to me and I wanted to share some excerpts with you.

VI: The Church on a Path of Unity:

Lord, renew your church by the light of the Gospel. Strengthen the bond of unity between the faithful and the pastors of your people, together with Francis, our Pope, and the whole Order of Bishops, that in a world torn by strife your people may

shine forth as a prophetic sign of unity and concord.

V2: God Guides His Church Along the Way of Salvation:

And so, having called us to [Y]our table, Lord, confirm us in unity, so that together with Francis, our Pope, and the whole Order of Bishops... Priests and Deacons, and your entire people, as we walk your ways with faith and hope, we may string to bring joy and trust into the world.

V3: Jesus the Way to the Father:

By our partaking of this mystery, almighty Father, give us life through your Spirit, grant that we may be conformed to the image of your Son, and confirm us in the bond of communion, together with Francis, our Pope, and the whole Order of Bishops,, with Priests and Deacons and with your entire people. Grant that all the faithful of the Church, looking into the signs of the times by the light of faith, may constantly devote themselves to the service of the Gospel. Keep us faithful to the needs of all, that sharing their grief and pain, their joy and hope, we may faithfully bring them the good news of salvation and go forward with them along the way of your Kingdom.

V4: Jesus Who Went About Doing Good:

Bring your Church, O Lord, to perfect faith and charity, together with Francis, our Pope, and the whole Order of Bishops, Priests and Deacons, and the entire people you have made your own. Open our eyes to the needs of our brothers and sisters; inspire in us words and actions to comfort those who labor and are burdened. Make us serve them truly, after the example of Christ and at [H]is command. And may your church stand as a living witness: to truth and freedom, to peace and justice, that all people may be raised up to a new hope.

Common to All:

Grant also to us, when our earthly pilgrimage is done, that we may come to [our] eternal dwelling place and live with you for ever... in communion with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, St. Joseph her husband... the Apostles and Martyrs and... all the saints we shall praise and exalt you through Jesus Christ, your Son.

I hope these prayers grant you peace – even if in sorrow. Blessed Christmas and Peaceful New Year to you from myself, Fr. Gribble and the Staff and Parishioners at our sister parishes: Our Lady of Mount Carmel and St. Leonard.

Let us pray for each other. Know that you are in mine always.

Among the gifts, food and family we long to celebrate Christmas with you. Amen."





Real Presence, Real Future reflections: Mary Keeps Our Work in Her Heart Fr. Michael Hartge, Moderator of the Curia, Diocese of Columbus

In the many Parish Consultation Sessions I was

privileged to be part of, many asked questions like, "If we're expecting some shrinking of parishes, where is the effort to raise up the vocations and leaders we need?" That effort starts in the domestic family and is ultimately for the benefit of the family of the Church. When families are healthy, centered on Jesus, and supported to live their faith, the Church will be healthy. Last year on the Feast of the Holy Family, Pope Francis recommended three words or phrases that should be common in all families, "please, thank you, and I'm sorry." This is just as relevant to our Church family as we review over 1,000 pieces of feedback from our Parish Consultation Sessions and continue to engage in dialogue about our future.
