## From the Pastor's Desk



### YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

DECEMBER 8, 2020 – DECEMBER 8, 2021

#### PART 3 ~ Saint Joseph: An Obedient Father

As he had done with Mary, God revealed his saving plan to Joseph. He did so by using dreams, which in the Bible and among all ancient peoples, were considered a way for him to make his will known. Joseph was deeply troubled by Mary's mysterious pregnancy. He did not want to "expose her to public disgrace", so he decided to "dismiss her quietly" (*Mt 1:19*).

In the first dream, an angel helps him resolve his grave dilemma: "Do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins" (*Mt 1:20-21*). Joseph's response was immediate: "When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him" (*Mt 1:24*). Obedience made it possible for him to surmount his difficulties and spare Mary.

In the second dream, the angel tells Joseph: "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him" (*Mt 2:13*). Joseph did not hesitate to obey, regardless of the hardship involved: "He got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, and remained there until the death of Herod" (*Mt 2:14-15*).

In Egypt, Joseph awaited with patient trust the angel's notice that he could safely return home. In a third dream, the angel told him that those who sought to kill the child were dead and ordered him to rise, take the child and his mother, and return to the land of Israel (cf. *Mt 2:19-20*). Once again, Joseph promptly obeyed. "He got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel" (*Mt 2:21*). During the return journey, "when Joseph heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. After being warned in a dream" – now for the fourth time – "he went away to the district of Galilee. There he made his home in a town called Nazareth" (*Mt 2:22-23*).

The evangelist Luke, for his part, tells us that Joseph undertook the long and difficult journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem to be registered in his family's town of origin in the census of the Emperor Caesar Augustus. There Jesus was born (cf. *Lk 2:7*) and his birth, like that of every other child, was recorded in the registry of the Empire. Saint Luke is especially concerned to tell us that Jesus' parents observed all the prescriptions of the Law: the rites of the circumcision of Jesus, the purification of Mary after childbirth, the offering of the firstborn to God (cf. *2:21-24*).

In every situation, Joseph declared his own "fiat", like those of Mary at the Annunciation and Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane.

In his role as the head of a family, Joseph taught Jesus to be obedient to his parents (cf. *Lk 2:51*), in accordance with God's command (cf. *Ex 20:12*). During the hidden years in Nazareth, Jesus learned at the school of Joseph to do the will of the Father. That will was to be his daily food (cf. *Jn 4:34*). Even at the most difficult moment of his life, in Gethsemane, Jesus chose to do the Father's will rather than his own, becoming "obedient unto death, even death on a cross" (*Phil 2:8*). The author of the Letter to the Hebrews thus concludes that Jesus "learned obedience through what he suffered" (5:8).

All this makes it clear that "Saint Joseph was called by God to serve the person and mission of Jesus directly through the exercise of his fatherhood" and that in this way, "he cooperated in the fullness of time in the great mystery of salvation and is truly a minister of salvation.

Nyitray, Seventh Graders Emma Bryant & Ryan Tackett, and Eighth Graders Connor Maxwell & Elena Rizzo. Congratulations, to these students who consistently live out the Tenets of a St. Joseph Parish School Student and make them a part of all they do.

With modified restrictions we were able to end the year with "X-STREAMLY" fun learning integrated with our faith. The little Falcons created their own bubble wands and tested four different bubble solutions in order to identify the best one. As exploration continued, the students realized that God's gift of their hands actually made the best wands regardless of which solution was used! Older Falcons combined ingredients to create a chemical reaction and make ice cream

while Falcons in 4th and 5th grade furthered their scientific experimentation by creating a chemical reaction to make glitter slime. The students learned that though they used the same ingredients, the end result was a unique creation, just as it is with us humans; though our "ingredients" are the same, each of us is God's unique creation. The students took time to reflect on this FALCON-tastic gift from God in their Journey Journals.



Our rising 8th grade Falcons (aka the 7th grade) stepped into their first leadership role to organize and run Field Day for Falcons in PreK - 6th grade! It was a great success and we look forward to the start up of Stu Crew in the fall with some of these same students looking to take on Officer roles. We should have ended Field Day with a treat from Kona Ice; however, due to the weather, Field Day had to

be postponed to our rain date. The weather held off and everyone was able to enjoy this good for you snow cone surprise on it's original day.


