## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

There's an old story of a "training program" of three demons who are apprentices to Satan. They each meet with the devil to complete their training and propose ideas to wreak havoc in the lives of men to turn them away from Christ. The first demon proposes to convince people that there is no sin, but the devil responds that it will not work because people know the reality of sin from their experiences. The second demon proposes to convince people that there is no hell. The devil rejects this also, saying that people would not buy the idea that there are no negative eternal consequences for what we do on this earth. Finally, the third demon suggests to tell people "don't worry, there is no hurry - you have TIME." The devil responded by telling the apprentice his plan was perfect! Convincing man of the fact that no real urgency is needed and that there is no need to inconvenience themselves at this moment with living their faith.



Time is a limited resource. Most of us feel we don't have enough time for all the things we want to do. Everyone is given the same amount of time: 24 hours each day, 168 hours each week. The question is: How do we choose to use our time? Henry David Thoreau once said "It is not enough to be busy, so are ants. The question is what are we busy about?"

Time is God's greatest gift to us, and we should be so grateful for it. No matter what our position in life or how many demands are put on us, all of us have exactly the same number of hours available each day. Making good use of that time requires keeping our priorities straight. Since our time is limited, we need to make sure our highest priorities, like our faith, get the 'yes'. Remember, our faith is fulfilled when we act on it. No act is too small if it builds up the Body of Christ.

A few months ago, I introduced a new Stewardship initiative, titled P.R.A.Y. which stands for: **P**- Pause **R** - Reflect **A** - Act **Y** - YOU! In the next few weeks, we will be starting our first stewardship drive to participate in faith activities and increase time in prayer. We are only asking that you find at least one thing - just one thing - that you can add or participate in to grow in your faith in God.

One of the best uses of our time in regard to stewardship, is formal prayer. This can be time spent in God's Word in the morning, attendance of daily Mass, praying the Rosary privately or with others, saying the Liturgy of the Hours, praying the blessing before your meal, or singing songs of praise. We can also make our very lives a prayer, transforming even the most menial of tasks - like changing a diaper, writing an email, preparing a meal - into a gift of prayer to the Lord. Another element of the Stewardship of Time is spending time forming and educating ourselves in the faith. This can mean participating in a parish Bible Study, joining a small faith-sharing group, reading a spiritual book, or actively participating in Parish programs like the upcoming ADVENTure!

In the near future, there will be a dedicated space on our website with different options and suggestions that you can look at for making a commitment for adding one element to our faith and prayer life. If we can all find at least one extra item to act on, we can make a huge difference in our relationship with God and in our Parish.

With building-wide collaboration, teachers have guided All students with indoor planting in **aerobic Tower Gardens!** The seeds have sprouted and the students are now measuring and analyzing growth.

Mrs. N. Wilson has begun implementing the GAR Grant, "**Mathematics through the Art of Baking,**" including demonstration and instruction from professional baker Christina Hafner! Lessons not only include converting measurements, measuring accurately, and following a recipe, but also involve identifying and learning new vocabulary pertinent to baking and cooking as well as those terms specific to the recipe at hand. The first lesson produced s'mores on a stick. The end result? Yummy knowledge!

The 2nd **TRUNK-or-TREAT** event was "**SPOOK-tacular!**" The Treaters had a great parade route to pay close attention to detail in
