

Why do Catholic schools exist?

When you look at this from a student's view, there are two clear goals: 1) College and 2) Heaven. While we hope that students realize these goals in this order, Heaven is clearly the more important of the two.

Catholic schools strive to put students firmly on the path to holiness that one day they may attain Heaven. Catholic schools introduce students to Jesus and invite them to form a relationship with Him so they may discern His call for their lives, strive for holiness, and attain Heaven.

Teach body, mind, soul

In this context, Catholic schools teach students by forming their whole being: body, mind, and soul so they may fulfill their Godgiven potential to become the people God is calling them to be and in so doing, serve their neighbors, contribute to their communities, and find joy in their lives.

These are lofty goals, so how are we doing? Let's consider the research. A study published May 31, 2018, "Self-Discipline and Catholic Education," concluded that, "Regardless of demographics, students in Catholic schools exhibit more self-discipline than students in other private schools or public schools. Specifically, they were more likely to control their temper, respect others' property, accept their fellow students' ideas, and handle peer pressure."

All of these are skills necessary for further education and success in employment, participation in a global economy, and contributing to one's community.

Impact on Church

Regarding the positive impact of Catholic schools on the Church,

studies conducted in the last five years by the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) at Georgetown University show that among millennials, those who attended Catholic schools are three times more likely to consider a priestly vocation (for men) and twice as likely to consider entering Religious Life (for women).

They are also over six times more likely to attend Mass weekly, participate in their parish, volunteer, and tithe.

Academic excellence

Academically, Catholic schools hold high expectations for students, instilling solid study skills and work ethic.

Results from the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) over the last 20 years show that students in Catholic schools consistently score higher in reading and math than students attending public schools.

Catholic schools focus on faith, working to form the whole child academically, physically, intellectually, spiritually, emotionally, and socially. As the Church has said,

The Catholic school is committed to the development of the whole person since in Christ, the Perfect Person, all human values find their fulfillment and unity. (The Catholic School, 35)

This is done in a community imbued with high expectations emphasizing personal responsibility and the dignity of each person with Christ as the model. In this way, Catholic schools instill students with morals, virtues, self-discipline, and knowledge, preparing them to succeed in further education, seek holiness, and live meaningful lives. - from NCEATALK.org, 8/9/18

School News

Math Class Never Tasted So Good! By: Nancy Wilson, 6th Grade Teacher

After observing students get excited about measuring flour and sugar in the baking elective

that I teach, I began to reflect on why they are so excited baking cookies, cakes, decorating cupcakes, etc. Yet, when we begin our unit on measurement and ratios, I see blank stares. So, I began thinking about how I can link the excitement of baking to mathematics and measurement. Students love to mix their own ingredients, and use the measuring resources as needed. The level of engagement is unbelievable, much more than in our math class. Having seen students love to bake, and use math concepts while doing so, I believed they would be able to easily practice their fraction skills and reinforce the ratio and proportions standards





through baking. The life skill of baking, and being able to convert recipes to different portions, is so needed in our students today. Using basic skills to complete a task and then taking that skill and applying it to higher level thinking is very important as we prepare our students for life. Baking does this.

Students have started with basic fraction and ratio concepts. They will delve deeply into analyzing recipes, reading recipes, creating new recipes and teaching other classmates how to experiment with a new recipe, whether it is doubling, tripling or "halving" a recipe, as the school year continues. Children light up when given a chance to teach a friend something they enjoy doing and that fosters confidence. Baking brings out that joy and an opportunity for social and emotional growth, as well as learning the difficult concepts of proportions, ratios and fractions.

With one baking class each month, our students have learned basic kitchen skills from a professional baker, learned how to use a hand mixer to change heavy cream into whipped topping

and decorated their own Christmas cookies by using different piping techniques. Each class emphasizes, and reinforces, fraction and ratio concepts while allowing everyone to have fun and create a delicious treat. These treats are then shared with the staff at SJPS. Students are even sharing their favorite recipes with me, wanting these to be used in our next baking class!

The Middle School at Saint Joseph Parish School has wonderful, caring teachers. With the collaboration of Miss Megan Fearon, Mrs. Corrine Mack, Mrs. Chrissy Davis and Mrs. Kari Tackett, every student has a chance to shine in a new setting. We all see the benefit of students working with each other, as they open their minds to new ways to learn life skills. And the big smiles on their faces make all the hard work worthwhile.
