

Do you know of a parishioner that is in the hospital, care facility or homebound?

We often do not know when someone is in the hospital or that they are in a nursing home or assisted living facility unless the parishioner or a family member contacts us. The parish sick and homebound ministry visits those that are homebound or in a care facility, and brings Holy Communion from Lay Ministers. **It is important that you let us know where you are or that you would like us to visit you.** Even if it is only temporary due to chemotherapy/medical treatments, rehabilitation, or if the need is long term, contact Beth to set up weekly visits from the parish.

On the moment to stand at the presentation of the gifts.

After the bread and wine is placed on the altar and the priest washes his hands, he stands in the middle of the altar and says, "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the almighty Father".

The directions from the Roman Missal state the following: "The people rise and reply: 'May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church'". So, **the moment to stand is after the priest has concluded his invitation to pray** and simultaneously as the congregation's reply begins. You may check the Breaking Bread Hymnal on page 11 and see the directions to stand at the presentation of the gifts.



The Liturgy of the Eucharist

The Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the preparation of the gifts and the altar. As the ministers prepare the altar, representatives of the people bring forward the bread and wine that will become the Body and Blood of Christ. The celebrant blesses and praises God for these gifts and places them on the altar, the place of the Eucharistic sacrifice. In addition to the bread and wine, monetary gifts for the support of the Church and the care of the poor may be brought forward. The Prayer over the Offerings concludes this preparation and disposes all for the Eucharistic Prayer.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Liturgy of the Eucharist. In this prayer, the celebrant acts in the person of Christ as head of his body, the Church. He gathers not only the bread and the wine, but the substance of our lives and joins them to Christ's perfect sacrifice, offering them to the Father.

The introductory dialogue establishes that this prayer is the prayer of the baptized and ordained, is offered in the presence of God, and has thanksgiving as its central focus. Following this dialogue, the celebrant begins the Preface, which consists of four different Eucharistic Prayers. After these prayers, communion is then given.

The following timeline follows the traditional Liturgy of the Eucharist:

- Presentation of the Gifts and Preparation of the Altar
- Prayer over the Offering
- Eucharistic Prayer
- Preface
- Holy, Holy, Holy
- First half of prayer, including Consecration
- Mystery of Faith
- Second half of prayer, ending with Doxology
- The Lord's Prayer
- Sign of Peace
- Lamb of God
- Communion
