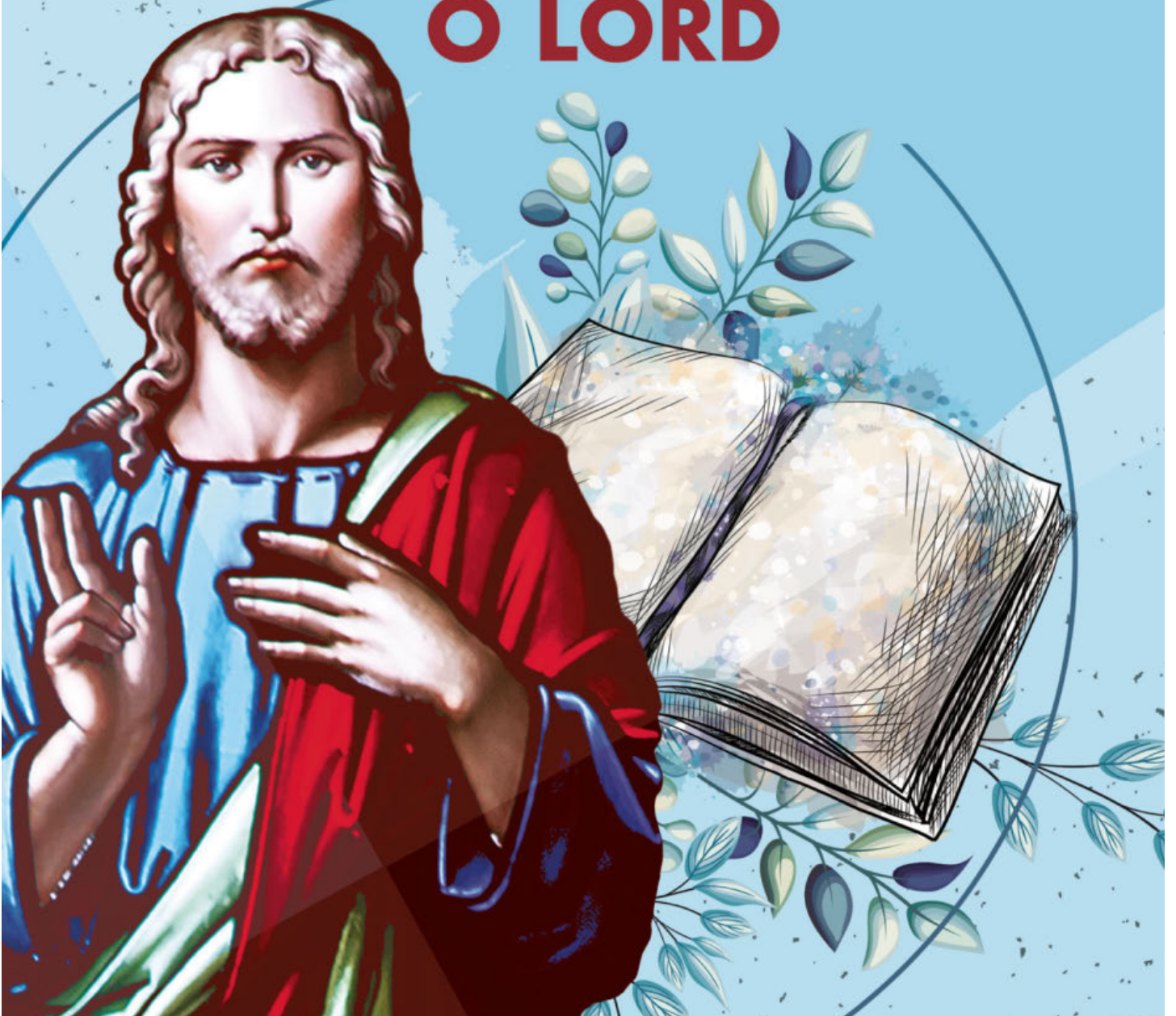

Priest Vestments

Question:

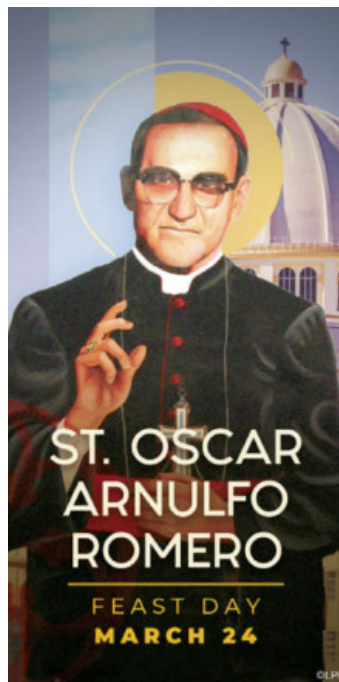
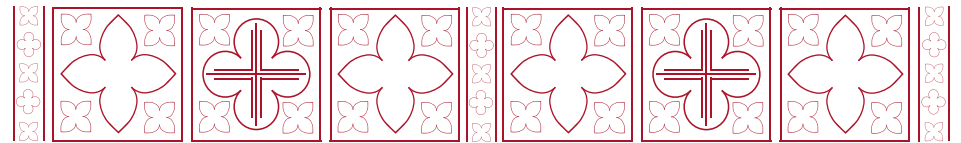
Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?

Answer:

Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Priests will joke that they cover a thousand flaws. But our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions, and for special guests. We wear certain clothes for golf, for outdoor activities, and years ago, we even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the same, and each one has a meaning. The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons. First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. Secondly, vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ..

St. Oscar Romero | March 24

When St. Oscar Romero was appointed Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977, his country was in chaos. Many people in El Salvador were living in poverty, while a smaller elite group controlled all political and economic power. In 1980, El Salvador broke out in a 12-year civil war that left over 75,000 people dead. St. Oscar Romero set up pastoral programs to assist the victims of oppression. He also became an outspoken advocate for human rights, appealing to the Salvadoran military to stop killing their own citizens.

On March 24, 1980, St. Oscar Romero was murdered while celebrating Mass in El Salvador. A car pulled up outside, and a gunman fired a single shot straight into St. Oscar Romero's heart.

Calling him a "a martyr for the faith" nearly 40 years later, Pope Francis canonized him in 2018. For the occasion, Pope Francis chose to wear the same blood-stained belt that Romero was wearing at the altar when he died.

From the Pastor's Desk

Beloved in Christ,

If there were a St. Margaret of York Week anytime in the year, this would be the one. Here's why:

Tomorrow, Monday, March 21st, commemorates the dedication of our current church building in 2004. Because it is the anniversary of the dedication, the day is regarded as a solemnity, which is the highest level of a feast. We will pray the Gloria at Mass, even though we are in the season of Lent. This normally only happens on the Solemnities of St. Joseph and the Annunciation. In our heightened level of celebration, we will also recite the Creed at Mass, which is only done on Sundays and Solemnities. As one of God's little coincidences, we will offer an extra Mass at 9:00 AM in conjunction with a series: "Lenten Retreats for Parish Leaders." All are welcome. We will also offer Mass at 6:00 PM as usual.

This Friday, March 25th is the feast of St. Margaret of York. However, since her feast shares a date with the Annunciation, her feast is observed on October 25th with the 40 English Martyrs. Catholicsaints.info/saint-margaret-clitherow/ reminds us of both dates.

The Solemnity of the Annunciation, which we will celebrate this Friday warrants some reflection.

- First, since it is a solemnity, it is proper to eat meat and take a break from our Lenten penances, even though it falls on a Friday, if we so choose.
- What are we celebrating? The Mystery of the Incarnation: God who created the universe out of nothing took on our human flesh and broke into time and space. Nine months before Christmas, it is the time when the Angel Gabriel visited Mary announcing the joyful news of the Emmanuel, God-with-us, and Mary gave her fiat, her yes to her holy vocation. The Annunciation is the real beginning of the life of Jesus, it is the beginning of His High Priesthood, as he begins to offer Himself for the salvation of humanity.
- Annunciation and Christmas are the two days of the year when we genuflect during the Creed at Mass when we mention "He was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary."
- So, why is a bigger deal not made of the Annunciation as at Christmas? It might be because the solemnity almost always falls during Lent, a time when we dial down our celebrations. It might also be because we are an Easter-focused people, and this causes the Annunciation to be transferred to other dates every few years. If March 25th falls during Holy Week or Easter Week, Annunciation is transferred to the Monday after the Octave of Easter, which could cause

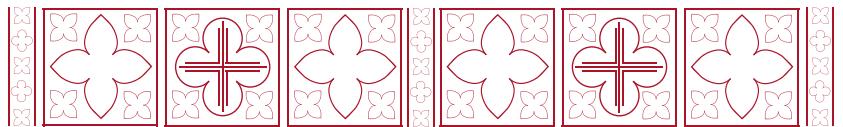

Journeying Together:

THEOLOGICAL FOUNDATIONS OF BEACONS *of* LIGHT

ECCLESIOLOGICAL FOUNDATIONS

In speaking of the Church as a family that journeys together, we can speak of synodality *in the Church* and *of the Church*. Synodality in the Church refers to the divine life in which members of the Church share in the synodality of the Trinity; this sharing happens in a variety of ways, most prominently through the liturgy and sacraments, in which the whole People of God journey toward the heavenly Jerusalem with members of the Church exercising their diverse charisms and ministries. Ecclesial synodality takes on flesh in institutions (synods, councils, parish finance councils, etc.) when those structures are animated by the Risen Lord and attentive to what the Spirit says.

These institutions will be extremely important in Beacons of Light as Families of Parishes develop pastoral plans. Difficult decisions will need to be made about how to work together and about finances, schools and facilities. The focus cannot be on clinging to the past or holding on to power; rather the focus must be on the mission of evangelization and discovering what the Risen Lord and the Spirit have prepared.

Synodality *in the Church* is related to the idea of *koinonia*, which refers to the new relationship that disciples have with God and one another. The communion of the Church is revealed as an initiative of the Trinity rather than a result of the will of people who associate for reasons of convenience, common interests or business.

Koinonia is an unconditional gift from God who desires that all share in the life of His Son and share solidarity with one another; it is also a spiritual work involving sharing in the suffering and consolation of others (cf. Rom 12:13; 2 Cor 1:5-7; Phil 3:10; 4:14) and performing concrete works of charity (cf. Rom 15:26; 2 Cor 8:4; 9:13; Gal 2:9; Phil 1:5; Phil 6). *Koinonia* refers to a spiritual union and to a visibly operating concordance of hearts and minds (cf. Acts 2:42), beginning with baptism, through which one is incorporated into the life of Christ *and* the Church, forming a *societas*.¹⁵

Journeying together as a family is one of the most visible and meaningful forms of ecclesial communion, involving many modes of participation in the Church. If communion is a sharing in the faith and mission of the Church, this journeying is the sign and fulfillment of communion through which communion appears in all its complex dimensions: divine and human; invisible and visible; animated by the Spirit and organized by humans.¹⁶

Additionally, we can also speak of the synodality *of the Church*, which refers to the Church as a “sacrament or sign and instrument both of a very close-knit union with God and of the unity of the whole human race” and which “desires now to unfold more fully to the faithful of the Church and to the whole world its own inner nature and universal mission.”¹⁷ It describes the journey of the Church with all of humanity in history.

This way of being is properly understood not as an expression of power, but as a *representatio ecclesiae*, whose authority comes from Christ for the service of humanity.¹⁸ What type of face do we as a Church want to show? Can we be a Samaritan Church? Precisely because the Archdiocese of Cincinnati offers so many services through schools, hospitals, Catholic Charities and the like to so many non-Catholics, we must be conscious of our responsibility toward those whom we serve in the wider community. A focus on *service*, rather than *power*, can help us discern the way forward in promoting the common good and bringing the joy of the Gospel to those around us.

it to seem less important than it really is. And in some places, Annunciation was recognized as a Marian feast, thus putting emphasis on Mary's role since Jesus is not yet visible. I have no idea why it is not a holy day of obligation, as in my humble opinion, it merits greater celebration.

Since we are on the topic of the beginning of life, this Friday, March 25th is SMOY day at 40 Days for Life. Just like we know Jesus's life in the womb began at the Annunciation, not Christmas, we also know that a human life does not begin at birth but at fertilization. 40 Days for Life is an excellent opportunity for us to pray for the voiceless in the womb where their lives are at risk, and for the healing of those who did not choose the gift of life in the past. Free parking is available at Holy Name parish, 2422 Auburn Avenue in Cincinnati. Walking and turning left out of Holy Name, encounter the 40 Days for Life prayer vigil two blocks down in front of Planned Parenthood's abortion facility. I plan to keep vigil from 2 - 3 PM. Information about signing up is in this bulletin, or feel free to just come and pray. Moreover, since school is out, bring the children as an added witness to the hope and goodness of human life.

I literally heard my vocation to the priesthood on Sacred Heart Radio. If you are a fan, as I am, perhaps consider a gift to them this week during their Lenten Pledge Drive. They come in best around here at 910 AM on the radio and sacred-heartradio.com on devices.
