# Catechetical Corner

## Q&A

### Vicar General and Chancellor

#### Question:

I have seen the title of Vicar General and Chancellor used in our Catholic newspaper. Who are they and what do they do?

#### Answer:

A bishop is in charge of a diocese and appoints people to help with its administration. Two of those positions are the Vicar General and the Chancellor. Both play a role in the life of a diocese, despite the many jokes priests may tell at their expense! A chancellor is the archivist of a diocese, charged with task of keeping the records of the diocese. Often a bishop may add other responsibilities and the chancellor may end up being like the executive director of the diocesan office. The chancellor does not need to be a priest.

The vicar general is a priest, appointed by the bishop and acts in the name of the bishop in administering the diocese. He has an advanced degree in canon law or theology. He also has executive authority within the diocese. This means that he is involved in the day-to-day pastoral and temporal administration of the diocese. Canon law does not allow a bishop to appoint a relative to the position, nor the priest in charge of the sacrament of penance. In both cases, the purpose of the law is to avoid conflicts of interest.

## St. Rupert of Salzburg | March 28



St. Rupert of Salzburg is also known as the "Apostle of Bavaria and Austria." Although mostly legend, it is believed that he was born sometime around 660 in Gaul, which is now part of France. It is possible that he is a descendant of the Merovingian royal line. Not much is known about the saint's early life.

We do know that Rupert was first appointed as Bishop of Worms in present-day Germany and despite many good works there, the pagan population eventually beat him and forced him from the city. Rupert retired to Rome for a time until Duke Theodo of Bavaria asked him to come to help establish the Church more firmly in Bavaria. Rupert agreed and brought with him a group of priests. Rupert traveled the region, effecting conversions, miracles, healing.

Eventually Rupert chose to settle at Juvavum an old Roman city mostly in ruins. He renamed the city Salzburg or "Salt Castle," and established there a

great cathedral and monastery under the Rule of St. Benedict. His niece became abbess of the Benedictine convent he founded nearby. Rupert was the first bishop of Salzburg, serving also as abbot of the monastery.

St. Rupert is usually portrayed carrying a vessel of salt, as he helped establish the salt mining industry for which he named the city. It is said that Rupert died on Easter Sunday though sources disagree on the year, which could have been around 710 or possibly as late as 718.

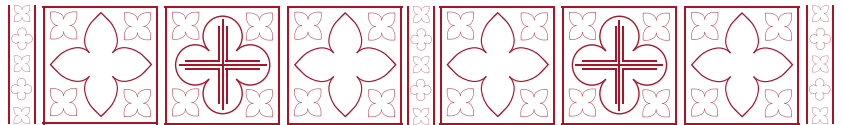

## The Kreidler Family Educational Gift

## Stoking the Lenten Fire

I think we all can acknowledge that there's a certain fatigue that comes over us all as we near the end of the Lenten season. Next week is Laetare Sunday, and I find that as soon as those pink vestments start coming out of storage, our collective motivation begins to wane.

I get that. Maybe you're fatigued – I am, too. Maybe you're doing well in your resolutions and devotions but you're in danger of coasting. Or maybe, like many of us this year or in past years, you don't feel that you have even really begun your Lenten journey.

Either way, chances are that the fire that was in your belly on Ash Wednesday is burning a bit low. All fires eventually do, once they consume whatever fuels them. So here we would do well to remember what fuels our Lenten fire.

Sometimes we make resolutions that have the appearance of being spiritual, but also have an earthly motive. We give up chocolate hoping to lose weight. We stop gossiping so our friends may like us more. There is nothing wrong with these sacrifices – just with their motivations.

As Moses removes his sandals to approach the burning bush, he sees that the fire burns brightly, strongly – but does not consume. It is propelled by something inexhaustible, something which is not of this world.

Is your Lenten fire fueled by God? Are you daily surrendering yourself to the same voice that boomed from the bush in Genesis – the voice that commanded the Israelites to do what seemed like the impossible?.

# Journeying Together:

## THEOLOGICAL FOUNDATIONS OF BEACONS *of* LIGHT

### DISCERNMENT AND CO-RESPONSIBILITY

The road that lies ahead for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati will not be an easy one. It will require discernment at an individual and communal level. In *The Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis invites every particular Church to enter into a resolute process of discernment, purification and reform so that the missionary impulse of the Church might be more focused, generous and fruitful,<sup>19</sup> adding that the important thing is “to not walk alone, but to rely on each other as brothers and sisters, and especially under the leadership of the bishops, in a wise and realistic pastoral discernment.”<sup>20</sup> Three phrases that can help in understanding the concept of discernment are: to recognize; to interpret; and to choose.

To recognize.

Individuals and communities must be able to confront situations and difficulties in life and they need to be able to recognize and name these difficulties. At the same time, they also must possess a sense of self-awareness. Many today are well-educated in the sciences and have a refined background but are illiterate when it comes to affectivity. Hence, there is a grave need to form people and communities in recognizing the interior movements of the spirit and to have an honest assessment of one’s own identity. There must be a recognition of those movements of the spirit which bring joy and which last, and those that do not.

To interpret.

Individuals and communities must not only recognize challenges, but also interpret experiences in the light of faith. As individuals and communities attempt to understand the meaning of that which they are experiencing and how to evaluate experiences, the hierar-

chy of truths of the Catholic faith can assist in the discernment process. While clergy have a special responsibility to develop the ability to discern what is of God and what is not, even in “gray areas” of pastoral ministry,<sup>21</sup> cultivating discernment in all the faithful is essential.

Pope Francis commented: “Each Christian and every community must discern the path that the Lord points out, but all of us are asked to obey His call to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the ‘peripheries’ in need of the light of the Gospel.”<sup>22</sup>

The process of discernment and deliberation is critical. People and parishes will need to weigh the pros and cons, using both faith and reason, when making proposals or decisions. Laity across the spectrum are called to fulfill the responsibilities of their baptism, to work for the sanctification of the world and

to take part in the evangelizing mission of the Church, offering insights from their professional, personal and spiritual experiences.

Religious men and women are uniquely positioned to illuminate the transcendent and eschatological dimensions of some of the issues that will arise. As co-workers of the bishop, priests, especially pastors, possess the experience of shepherding and accompanying the flock; thus, they can offer their theological, spiritual and pastoral insights, standing as Christ in their midst.

To choose.

Discernment demands being able to choose. Mindful of their duty to listen to the flock, pastors must have the “smell of the sheep.” Ultimately the bishop, the pastor of the flock entrusted to his care, or the Pope in the case of the universal Church, has a personal and specific responsibility to witness to the truth and preserve the unity and integrity of the faith and the flock. After careful discernment, flowing from the unanimity of the consent emanating from the deliberations in the Beacons of Light process, the Archbishop will have to make decisions, but his choices will come only after input from the people and clergy of the archdiocese and after prayerful discernment.

For example, in the Beacons of Light process, the grouping of parishes into Families of Parishes demands gathering insights and data from lay men and women, pastors, pastoral councils and staff, and working together to look at possible groupings. Input was sought from the deans, presbyteral council, and heads of archdiocesan departments. Priests and school principals were invited to offer their insights. Finally, after a three-week period of public comment, the Archbishop will approve the finalized groupings. Later in the process, each Family of Parishes will create a pastoral plan that is in alignment with the overall purpose of Beacons of Light and propose its acceptance by the Archbishop.

This consent is never an assertion of power but remains a service to the truth and to the Church in the name of the Lord Jesus. Ultimately, discernment is of a communitarian nature and an expression of the co-responsibility that believers have; it demands that its members have an ecclesial conscience leading to communion.<sup>23</sup> The keyword is “co-responsibility.”

In 2009, Pope Benedict XVI said:

“It is necessary to improve pastoral structures in such a way that the co-responsibility of all the members of the People of God in their entirety is gradually promoted, with respect for vocations and for the respective roles of the consecrated and of lay people. This demands a change in mindset, particularly concerning lay people. They must no longer be viewed as ‘collaborators’ of the clergy but truly be recognized as ‘co-responsible’ for the Church’s being and action, thereby fostering the consolidation of a mature and committed laity.”<sup>24</sup>

Difficult decisions and choices must be made. Everyone can expect to experience some pain in the process, but, if the process is a shared one, then, in the end, it is hoped that our local Church will be in a better position to carry out the mission of evangelization and our parishes will truly be Beacons of Light.
